



While it was not necessarily the easiest job for some Commanderies to Open and receive the Grand Commander and Staff, I am confident that all Commanderies received benefit from the experience. Not all Commanderies began the year with the ability to open and conduct business. With this in mind the Board of Inspection under the very able direction of SK James C. Herndon. VEDGC was able (by coaxing, armtwisting and challenges) to conduct a two-tiered Inspection Program this year. I might add it is the first time in 35 years all Commanderies have stood for inspection. I will leave the results to our Board of Inspection and their Official report. I must say, I am much more appreciative for the efforts and hard work of the Commanderies. This is your Grand Commandery and if it is to survive you are the ones who must lay aside the adversity and build together for the common good of all Templars in Idaho. I know some Commanderies are still lacking in experience and leadership. However I am confident that in the coming years all will possess the ability and PRIDE required to overcome the APATHY that has held us hack. Sir Knights, I am committed to helping you succeed m any way I can.

GENERAL ORDERS

- General Order #I Christmas Observance: Commanderies were directed to hold a Traditional Christmas Observance and Report to the RE Grand Recorder and RE Grand Commander of their success or failure. I received notification from two of eight Commanderies. I know that at least one other held a Christmas Observance, as I took part in the observance.
- General Order #2 Easter Observance; Called for the Observance of Easter by Constituent Commanderies, with a report of the same to the Grand Commander and Grand Recorder by April 30.
- General Order #3 Monthly and Annual Reporting: Directed Eminent Commanders and Recorders to prepare and transmit monthly reports to the REGC and Grand Recorder.
- General Order #4 Summer Uniforms: Authorized the Grand Jurisdiction of Idaho to enjoy the use of the summer Uniform as Prescribed by Grand Encampment during the period of Memorial Day to Labor Day.

BYLAW CHANGES APPROVED

I received no requests for approval nor did I grant any changes to Bylaws of Constituent Commanderies.

DISPENSATIONS

I took the following action on Dispensations:

- No. 1 Approved; Coeurd'Alene Commandery No. 5to hold a special Conclave October 18, 2000 at Rathdrum, Idaho for hosting the official visit of the Right Eminent Grand Commander.
- No. 2 Denied; Gate City Commandery No. 4, November 18, 2000, request for Special Dispensation to Elect and Install Officers at a Conclave to be held December 4,2000 at Pocatello, Idaho. Dispensation under Idaho Code of Laws, ARTICLE XXVIII, Section 293, is not necessary provided Election and Installation take place prior to January 15 (2001). PROVIDED ARTICLE XXIV. Section 251 (QUORUM) is met.

Issued Lawful Warrant No. 2000-01; October 3, 2000, This Lawful Warrant was issued to SK James C. Herndon, Salmon Commandery No. 9; SK Quentin R. Vaughn. Lewiston Commandery No. 2, and SK Thomas E. Hipple, Moscow Commandery No. 3 to meet and open a Commandery. The purpose was a combined Inspection of Lewiston Commandery No. 2 and Moscow Commandery No. 3. Declaring they constitute three Knights Templar hailing from three separate Commanderies and are acting under a Lawful Warrant.

Issued Lawful Warrant No. 2000--02, March 23, 2001. This Lawful Warrant was issued to SK Arthur L. Busacker, Gate City Commandery No. 4. SK James C. Herndon, Salmon Commandery No. 9 and SK Dale C. Stoller, Twin Falls Commandery No. 10, to meet and open a Commandery, March 24, 2001. Declaring they constitute three Knights Templar hailing from three separate Commanderies and are acting under a Lawful Warrant. The purpose was the conferral of the Orders of the Temple. The Orders were conferred upon Companions Gary Labruyere: Robert Mohney: Donald Taylor and Price Worrell, all members of Idaho Falls Chapter No. 10 Royal Arch Masons, and Jeremiah Council No. 9 Cryptic Masons. The Warrant for Special Dispensation meets the requirements set forth in the Constitution and Statutes of the Grand Encampment and of the Idaho Code of Laws 1990 Edition.

AWARDS

It was my distinct pleasure to recommend award of the Knights Templar Cross of Honor to Sir Knight Howard A. Smith of Idaho Commandery No. 1. This medal and accompanying plaque will be presented at the Annual Grand York Rite Sessions Banquet tomorrow night if he is present.

I feel this is a very prestigious medal and I know there are more Sir Knights who are very deserving of this honor. I salute the Sir Knights who have attained this distinction.

June 13, 2000, I was pleased to accompany PDC, SK Ernest I. Teter, to Idaho Falls. We presented the 2000 Award to the Hospital, Ophthalmologists, and Anesthesiologists at the monthly Chamber of Commerce Luncheon. PGC, SK M. William Echo, E Gr Recorder/Treasurer, and his Lady Linda joined us. SK Teter started this tradition in 1991 when he was REGC. I am very pleased to carry on this tradition.

April 9, 2001, it was again my pleasure to assist SK Teter in the presentation of the 2001 Award plaques to Ms. Sandra Brouce, President of St Al-

phonsus Regional Medical Center, Dr. Sandra Thompson, Director of Anesthesiology. My Lady Patricia who acted as our "Official Photographer" accompanied SK Teter and I. SK Teter presented Dr. Francois Trotta, Doctor of Ophthalmology, with his plaque on April 12. These awards were presented prior to our Grand Session, since we were aware !he representatives were unable to attend the Grand York Rite Banquet. This is a very inexpensive way for us to say "Thank-You" to our service providers. The caregivers in Idaho Falls and Boise were very gracious and thanked the Knights Templars for providing this service to the patients.

THE STATE OF THE ORDER

I wish I could stand before you and tell you there are no problems in this Grand Jurisdiction; however, I would be lying. Rather than problems, there are some enormous opportunities which present themselves. Sir Knights, the largest task we have is to convince ourselves we have the opportunity to make a difference. We face an uphill battle to overcome the APATHY that has replaced our PRIDE. Until we (collectively) gain back our PRIDE, the membership will continue to decline. It is not too late!! The train hasn't totally passed us by. By what means do I measure these opportunities? I have observed a genuine effort and interest by the Grand Lodge of Idaho AF & AM in promoting harmony and strengthening membership. We need to work together for the benefit of all. The past is history, let us be observant of our mistakes and set goals to achieve our opportunities. It is incumbent upon every Knight Templar to afford good men and true the avenue to improve their lot in Life. Lest we forget our obligations we need to start taking them more seriously. "Charity", it is said, "begins at home". This is very true for our Order. It is through the proper education and discipline that we are enabled to arrive at our Holy Altar. We need to take this education to heart and spread our fame both far and wide. Remember Sir Knights, "EVERY CHRISTIAN MASON SHOULD BE A KKNIGHT TEMPLAR." If you don't believe this premise, then why are you here? There are those in this Grand Jurisdiction who possess the skills and abilities to lead and lo teach others how to lead. Support them, and they will support you. Remember time, patience, and perseverance will accomplish all things. Think about it. The opportunities confronting Templary in Idaho are basically the same as those affecting any Church or fraternal order. They are television, affluence, life style, age, but most of all TIME. Studies show a wage earner (especially in dual income families) has approximately eight hours per month to devote to discretionary endeavors. If we are going to be successful in attracting bright energetic members, we have to change somewhat with the times and market a product that attracts the attention of our Target audience. Simply put we need to provide a quality product worthy of the expenditure of time and effort. When in doubt ask Jesus; then do what Jesus would do!

KNIGHTS TEMPLAR EVE FOUNDATION

Sir Knights, I consider the Knights Templar Eye Foundation the "Flagship"" of our fraternity. Each year the Knights Templar Bye Foundation

conducts a voluntary campaign to raise funds for the year. While this Grand Jurisdiction is not the top contributor, neither are we the least. On a per capita basis, my last weekly update shows Idaho in 36th place. While we are behind our sister jurisdictions of Colorado, Oregon and Washington, we are ahead of Montana and Wyoming. We certainly can do better! Sir Knights, please be generous in your gifts, donations and bequests.

I must tell you at times this year I have really wondered if our "Flagship" had lost its rudder. Please don't take this wrong, but what I am about to say I consider very serious business. Also don't kid yourself Masonry is a business whether that is the popular perception or not. Templary and particularly when we are dealing with the most precious sense our Lord has allowed us, Sight., is a very serious business. We promote the good health of people who are basically indigent. We are the "Port of last Hope" so to speak. By this promotion, we ask highly skilled and very expensively trained caregivers to perform a service for charity. We are then supposed to do our part by providing a pittance to compensate our caregivers, which most professionals would find as an insult. Idaho unlike some of the larger Grand Jurisdictions, Illinois, Indiana, Texas, etc. has no luxury when it comes to dealing with caregivers. We only have one retina specialist, and few ophthalmologists who are willing to accept the insult for payment. During the last year, our "Flagship" has consistently been late in making these payments. At one point they were seven months behind in paying our caregivers and the hospital. This does little else except to add injury to the insult that exists. Repeated attempts failed to bring about any meaningful change in the handling of business matters. Evidently I am inept at communicating, since the Foundation hasn't even been courteous enough to answer my cover letters. Initially, I thought maybe someone in the Grand Encampment Office had an axe to grind with our Grand Jurisdiction; however, after conversing with my counterparts, I am firmly convinced we have an enormous opportunity since the western states seem to be experiencing the exact same problem. It appears nepotism is rampant in Chicago and the time has come for the Grand Encampment to either seriously revamp the current organization or face the music. I don't believe in idle gossip. When a Sir Knight tells me the MWGM of Masons in his State is seriously considering withdrawing support of the Grand Encampment, it's time we all better take very seriously the business at hand. If I wasn't aware of the fine work being done by our Sir Knights who struggle to rid unfortunate humans of their plight, 1 would be inclined to press our MWGM for consideration of an edict. However. I know we are making a difference in the lives of those we seek to help. So I continue to support the program for the sake of the patients, not the Offices of the Knights Templar Eye Foundation.

HOLY LAND PILGRIMAGE

I'm sure most of the Sir Knights are aware of the old adage "War is Hell". It really is a truthful saying. Your Holy Land Pilgrimage Committee met and selected a minister to sponsor in a trip to the Holy Land. Our first selection was recommended by Gate City Commandery No. 4 in Pocatello.

The Reverend Nancy Nagy was informed by her church archdiocese that they were forbidding any of the clergy from traveling to the Holy Land. Based upon Rev. Nagy's decision to obey the direction of the Archdiocese, an alternate minister was selected. He was from Idaho Falls and lasted two days before a friend in the State Department convinced him the Middle East is currently not a place to visit. Therefore, the Grand Jurisdiction of Idaho will be credited with the purchase of plane fare from Newark, NJ, to the Holy Land and return. If conditions change perhaps we could send two ministers next year. Sir Knights, this is the opportunity for us as Christian Masons to really stand out. During these times when organized religion makes every effort to disenfranchise those who might otherwise seek admission, we need to do our very best in promoting this very worthwhile cause. Remember, your contributions tax deductible. Plan for the future and remember the Holy Land Pilgrimage Fund in your gifts, donations, and bequests.

RECOMMENDATIONS

I recommend all Constituent Commanderies in this Grand Jurisdiction of Idaho adopt the Templar Cap and Mantle as the uniform of their Commandery. This affords all Sir Knights the opportunity to look alike at a reasonable price. Perhaps they could even consider the cost as a portion of their fee structure, insuring new Sir Knights would perhaps make them immediately feel they are a part of the Order, and provide them with the proper uniform.

I recommend the Grand Jurisdiction of Idaho seriously consider acquiring the services of a professional money manager. I recognize this will take legislative changes by all three bodies to accomplish. Sir Knights, the Grand Commandery of Idaho is a business and you are the stakeholders. We need to manage it as such. We have some members who understand the value of finances and how the financial markets operate. At the Northwest Regional Workshop last October (2000), an outstanding financial program was presented. Sir Knight Bruce Pruitt, (PGC, California) also spoke of a program the Grand Jurisdiction of California invests in. He is willing to provide the information. I seriously recommend the Grand York Rite Bodies of Idaho avail themselves of this information and if it be the will of the delegates, pass the proper legislation allowing us the opportunity to insure our financial well being long into the future.

I recommend a serious Long Range Planning effort be undertaken by this Grand Jurisdiction. Planning is integral in perpetuating continued growth and ending the decline in our numbers. If you don't know where you are going, you certainly are going to get there, wherever there is.

I recommend my successor consider the appointment of a Tactics and Training Cadre. We need to develop and train the Grand Officers as well as providing training to Constituent Commanderies. This will afford the Grand Commander the luxury of grooming the "Best of the Best". Grand Officers will enter this office fully aware of the job at hand, knowing how to proceed instead of learning it the hard way. We need to change: we can ill afford the "Good enough for me" syndrome.

To my knowledge it has been over 25 years since the financial stipend for the heads of the three York Rite Bodies was increased. With lhe increases in inflation and costs of doing the business at hand, I recommend the delegates seriously consider doubling the allowance. This adjustment if allowed still won't provide a cost free situation to your chosen leaders, but will lessen the economic impacts of holding office.

I recommend the allowance for attending the Triennial Session once every three years also be doubled. With increased price of fuel, airline tickets alone are more than the amount allowed.

I recommend the delegates authorize the same distinction to the Very Eminent Deputy Grand Commander, which the Deputy Grand Master of this Most Worshipful Grand Lodge enjoys. Since our jurisdictional line is a progressive line, it is fitting the Very Eminent Deputy Grand Commander is considered the Grand Commander-Elect to properly plan for his year. This will afford the opportunity to plan appointments and committees far enough in advance and also plan a visitation calendar which can be coordinated through the Masonic Family Alliance and be available on the Website for all to see and have ready access to. The goal here is the elimination (as much as possible) of conflicting Masonic events. Some might say they don't own a computer. The reality is that for occupying this office you cannot afford not to own a computer.

I strongly recommend the Grand Encampment hire the services of a professional public relations firm to develop videos and other training media for use by the Constituent Jurisdictions. I have heard a dozen excuses why this hasn't happened; however, Grand Encampment also needs to change with the times. Modern society is no longer satisfied with poor quality. This will afford the opportunity for polished professional programs. They should also consider the use of historical videos for lecture and training purposes. It is far easier to learn the correct method when seeing it done properly. The Sir Knights learn much quicker when taught the proper way. The proverbial picture being worth a thousand words.

CONCLUSIONS

This past year has gone by much too quickly; however, time stands still for no man or season. As I reflect on this past year, I see we had success in areas of Masonic Family Relations, inspections and putting the Grand York Rite Bodies on the Internet at our idahomasons.org Website. We had little success in curbing the decline in non-death membership. We failed those Sir Knights, for this I am truly regretful. No major catastrophes have occurred in our Grand Commandery. I have endeavored to provide this Grand Commandery with adequate leadership during my term of office. If I have offended anyone, I apologize that was never my intent I sincerely hope my actions have been satisfactory.



REPORT OF THE MOST ILLLUSTRIOUS GRAND MASTER OF CRYPTIC MASONS OF IDAHO

This has been a wonderful year for me as it should have been. Not being retired and being a schoolteacher, I did not have the right times off to visit other state jurisdictions. It would have been a great opportunity to expand my experiences as a leader and, on a personal level, to expand my circle of friends and Companions. The official visits in this great state were wonderful. Each of the Councils was very accommodating and I was graciously received. Thank you so much for the honors and hospitality extended to all the Grand Council Officers. It was an honor to represent the Grand Council at several functions including being the Master of Ceremonies for a Job's Daughter Installation (Bethel #3)., Visiting a full dress 3rd Degree at the Meridian Lodge by the WI Korah Players, and representing the York Rite Bodies at the opening of the Grand Court of Amaranth and Installation of Officers.

To the Grand Council Officers that made the effort to attend my official visits, thanks so very much, especially Companion Dave Grindle, who only missed the visit to Idaho Falls because I had gone early the day before to visit my parents in Pocatello. He is a fine example of what we should expect from our officers.

This was a very special year in that all the Grand Officers of the York Rite Bodies were from Boise and close friends. It made for a great fraternal experience. Jim Curtis and Wayne Ellis were so supportive, adjusting their schedules to fit my needs and attending many of my official visits. Thank you so much my Brothers.

During the Official visits to the Councils, I have tried to bring into focus "our purpose" and how we can realize the goals within our group. This will help communicate the "what and where" activities on given dates and help in scheduling events.

I have some suggestions for the Companions to consider for the future.

- III. The North West Regional conference is an opportunity for all Companions to learn a tremendous amount of information about the York Rite structure and the impressive progress of our philanthropies. This is a wonderful opportunity for future officers to receive needed training. I was very proud to return and help with a presentation next year and would appreciate any input from the companions. This will be a joint meeting of all three bodies.

IV. At the individual level:

- a. Let's talk Freemasonry at every opportunity. We have a lot to brag about and be proud of the many needs we fill.
- b. Contemplate "the great value received from the degree work", asking ourselves "What did I bring home with me from this activity of Degree?"

- Show enthusiasm through good work in meeting and degree work. We must labor in the quarries.
- V. I think there is a need to address the Shrine/Mason development that has been instituted by the Shrine of North America. Through the newly formed All Masonic Family Alliance of Idaho, the goal is to have business as usual. At the national level, I think that their shortcut will be good for the Shrine in general and give us a reservoir of new candidates that will be receptive to our degrees. We will have to work harder, but that is really an opportunity. I doubt that the building and rebuilding of the Great Temple was done by any thing but hard work.
- VI. Let us look at every new situation as a opportunity to bring more light to good men everywhere.

At this time, Companion Mathew A. Glenn, M.I. Grand Master of the Grand Council of Western Canada, addressed the Companions.

EMERGENCY RESOLUTION

The Grand Recorder remarked that some questions had surfaced concerning the number of ballots that a member of the Grand Council might receive at the Grand Council session. For example, 1 as PMIGM, 1 as a Grand Officer, 3 as proxies for the dais officers, etc. He stated that there were no restrictions in our Code of Laws regarding this, and perhaps should be. A Discussion was held concerning the number of ballots that any one Companion should be allowed to receive at the Grand Council Sessions. After several opinions were presented, Companion Burrell Lirgg, PMIGM, moved to consider an emergency resolution to limit the number ballots. This motion was seconded and received an unanimous vote to consider such a resolution. Companion Burrell then moved to amend the Code of Laws to restrict the number of ballots to four that any Companion, who is a member of the Grand Council, may have at any Grand Council session. He proposed that a proper resolution be drawn up and presented at the next Grand Council annual session for ratification, but the number be limited to four in any case, and until an appropriate resolution can be presented and passed. This motion was seconded and passed unanimously. The Grand Recorder volunteered to write such a resolution and present it to the Jurisprudence and Resolution Committees.

Companion Dean Millard moved to secure appropriate aprons for the newly appointed Ish Sodi positions. This motion was seconded. After some discussion, a motion was made and seconded to amend the previous motion to also provide proper jewels for the Ish Sodi. These motions were then voted on and carried successfully. The Grand Recorder will work up a design and have the jewels and aprons made.

The Most Illustrious Grand Master declared the ballot box open.

Companion Gerald A. Ford, R.I. Grand Recorder of the Grand Council of Colorado, was invited to address the Companions, after whish the M.I. Grand Master called the Grand Council from labor to refreshment at 10:30 a.m., and back to labor again at 10:58.


INSTALLATION OF GRAND COUNCIL OFFICERS





Brother, Companion, and Sir Knight Reuel David Maule was born October 6, 1896, at Magnolia, Iowa. Moved to Payette, Idaho, in 1901. Graduated Payette High School 1915. Reuel lived every boy's dream by joining the A1G. Barnes circus as a trombone and tuba player. He joined the Navy in 1917 and served in Europe as an ambulance driver transporting wounded Marines. Reuel was busy with the trades and lumber.

.I bring these things to your attention because here is one of us whose life spanned three centuries and only give dates of his Masonic service.

Brother Reuel was initiated an Entered Apprentice June 21, 1921. Passed to the degree of Fellowcraft October 20, 1921. Raised to the degree of Master Mason December 21, 1021. Exalted as a Royal Arch Mason January 23, 1924. Greeted a Cryptic Mason and Knighted a Sir Knight on April 3, 1024.

A member of El Korah Shrine since April 23, 2914 where he played trombone for 65 years. He was initiated into Lorraine Chapter #20, OES, June 2, 1931.

A true and Faithful Brother among us for 79 years, serving as Master of Washoe Lodge in 1933 and as secretary from 1972 thru 1983. He served as presiding Officer of the York Rite Bodies of Payette and was Secretary, Recorder for 28 years. The smell of R.D.'s good cigar always greeted me on my visits to the York Rite of Payette.

Reuel served as Worthy Patron of Lorraine Chapter six times.

He served the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Idaho as its Grand Historian and was honored by the Grand Chapter by being elected Grand Historian Emeritus.

Companion Maule was elected, installed, and served the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons as Most Illustrious Grand Master for the year 1989-1990.

Most Illustrious Companion Reuel laid down his tools of life on January 11, 2001.

Although small in stature, he was a giant among his peers, and his equal will be hard to find. He truly represented those cardinal virtues: Temperance, Fortitude, Prudence, and Justice.

We again offer our sympathy and condolences to his family and friends and offer this prayer in his memory.

Royal Arch Masons

Date from the year the second temple was commenced by Zerubbabel, Anno Inventionis (A.I.), "in the year of discovery."

Order of the High Priesthood

Date from the year of blessing of Abram by the High Priest Melchizedek, Anno Benefacio (A.B.), "in the year of the blessing."

Cryptic Masons

Date from the year in which the Temple of Solomon was completed, Anno Depositionis (A.Dep.), "in the year of deposit."

Knights Templar

Commence their era with the organization of their Order, Anno Ordinia (A.O.), "in the year of the Order."

Scottish Rite

Same as Ancient Craft, except the Jewish Chronology is used, Anno Mundi (A.M.), "in the year of the world."
