





John P. Lemmon

Right Eminent Grand Commander 2001-2002

John Paul Lemmon was born to R. J. & Ida Lemmon on December 4, 1917, in Shoshone, Idaho. He attended school in Richfield, Idaho, graduating in 1935. He joined the U.S. Navy in 1939 and served in the Submarine Navy in both the Atlantic and Pacific and was discharged in 1948.

John joined the Richfield Masonic Lodge #70 in 1939, and was raised as a Master Mason in April 1939. He served as Master in 1970. He joined Royal Arch in South Berwick, Maine, in 1946, demitted, and affiliated with King Solomon Chapter #16 in Gooding. He served as High Priest in 1971. He became a member of Twin Falls Council #7 and served as Illustrious Master in 1982. He became a Knight Templar in Twin Falls Commandery #10 and served as Commander in 1982. He was installed a Knight in the Knights of the York Cross of Honour and served as Prior in 1993. Other orders include Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priest, a past Preceptor, and Red Cross of Constantine, a past Sovereign.

RESOLUTION TO ESTABLISH FUNDING FOR THE IDAHO MA-SONIC FAMILY ALLIANCE AS IT PERTAINS TO THE GRAND COUNCIL OF CRYPTIC MASONS OF THE STATE OF IDAHO

WHEREAS Brother Gregory E. Johnson, Past Most Worshipful Grand Master of the Grand Lodge AF & AM of Idaho, established the Idaho Masonic Family Alliance (IMFA) in 1999 and established a basis for support of a Web Site, and

WHEREAS initial start-up funds in the amount of Forty Dollars and Fifty

Cents (\$ 40.50) were paid by the Grand Council of CM of Idaho, and

WHEREAS the IMFA Web Site has been established and is now up and running, and one that all Masons can be rightly proud of, and

WHEREAS the annual maintenance fee has been set at One Hundred (\$ 100.00) dollars for the York Rite Bodies of Idaho,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that beginning this year, 2002, the Grand Council of CM of Idaho budget annually a prorated fee of Twenty-Seven dollars (\$ 27.00) to help support the Idaho Masonic Family Alliance Web Site.

RESOLUTION C-02-02

RESOLUTION TO AMEND THE ACCOUNTING PROCEDURES OF THE GRAND COUNCIL OF CRYPTIC MASONS OF THE STATE OF IDAHO

WHEREAS the financial details of the Grand Council need to be updated from time to time to reflect the changes that have been and need to be made, and

WHEREAS other changes have been identified as needed to properly record the finances of the Grand Council,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the financial ledger of the Grand Council be altered in the following manner, to wit:

- 1. The Insurance Fund be deleted, since it has not been used for the past seven years at least, and the funds therein transferred to the General Fund.
- 2. The funds required for the operation of the Annual Grand Council Sessions be serviced from a new Fund entitled Grand Assembly Fund which shall receive a part of the Per Capita Tax of the Grand Council, as determined by the Finance Committee.
- 3. A new Fund be added entitled Communications Fund, which shall be used for expenses such as telephone calls, internet service expenses and Web Site maintenance, and which shall receive a part of the Per Capita Tax of the Grand Council as determined by the Finance Committee.

Submitted by M. William Echo Jeremiah Council No. 9, CM Passed Companion Bill Echo moved to consider a resolution to limit the number of ballots to four. This motion was seconded and passed unanimously.




At 3:00 p.m., the Ladies and Guests of the Companions joined for the

Most Excellent Grand High Priest, 2002-03

Harry L. Huffer was born to James Roy and Nancy Elizabeth Huffer on August 23, 1922 at Locust Grove, Iowa. Harry was the third son of four sons. The family moved from Hamburg, Iowa, to Caldwell, Idaho, in May of 1937. Harry attended school in Hamburg through his freshman year. He graduated from Caldwell High School in 1940.

Harry enlisted in the Army National Guard in May 1940 and was called to active duty in the Us Army in 1941. He served in several capacities, the last being as Master Sergeant, Chief of Supply for a field artillery group, serving in the Continental United States and the Pacific Theater until November 9, 1945. After WWII, he attended the College of Idaho in Caldwell and Tri-State College in Angola, Indiana. After college, Harry was employed by the State of Idaho Military Department in a combined Civil Service and military status, with duty stations in Caldwell and Boise. He retired from Civil Service in 1980 and from the military in August of 1982 with 41 years of service.

Harry married Artenia M. Blakley in 1951, and after a long illness, she passed away in October 1995. Son, Mac Lee Huffer, drowned in a boating accident in August of 1974. There were no other children.

Harry began his Masonic career in Mt Moriah Lodge #39, being "raised" to the sublime degree of Master Mason on November 7, 1957. He was exalted to the Royal Arch Degree in Caldwell Chapter #19, RAM, in 1982 becoming High Priest in 1987. He served as District Deputy Grand High Priest for three years after which he was appointed into the Grand Line and was elected Most Excellent Grand High Priest, April 26, 2002. Harry is also serving as Secretary of Caldwell Chapter #19.

Harry was greeted a Royal and Select Master in King Solomon Council #4 in 1988 and has served the past five years as Illustrious Master. He was Knighted as a Knight Templar in Idaho Commandery #1 in 1989 and served as Eminent Commander in 1995. He also served as Eminent Grand Prelate for two years. He is a life member of Mount Moriah Lodge #39, Caldwell Chapter #19, King Solomon Council #4, Idaho Commandery #1, and El Korah Shrine. He also is a Patron Sponsor of the Knights Templar Eye Foundation and a Life Sponsor of the Shrine Children's Hospital. Also, a life member and Past Patron of Hermosa Chapter #32, Order of the Eastern Star.

Membership in other appendant bodies include: St. Michael Conclave RCC, Past Sovereign; Redemption Tabernacle #XL HRAKTP; Tri-Valley York Rite College #178; Caldwell Shrine Club; Egg & Shell Club; and Scottish Rite Bodies Valley of Boise. Awards received include Holy Order of the High Priesthood 1988, Thrice Illustrious Master Order of the Silver Trowel 1989, Cryptic Mason of the Year 2001, Knight Templar Cross of Honor 1999, and Knight Commander of the Temple 2000.



BY-LAW CHANGES REVIEWED

I received no requests for approval, nor did I grant any changes, to the by -laws of constituent commanderies.

WARRANT ISSUED

Lawful Warrant No. 2001-01. SK John P. Lemmon, VEDC, Twin Falls Commandery No. 10; SK Quentin R. Vaughn, EC, Lewiston Commandery #2; and SK Thomas E. Hipple, EC, Moscow Commandery #3, appointed and authorized to form and open a Commandery at Lewiston, Idaho, on May 23, 2001, for the purpose of a combined visitation by the Grand Commander to Lewiston Commandery No. 2 and Moscow Commandery No. 3.

DISPENSATIONS

- No. 1. Coeur d'Alene Commandery No. 5 was granted a dispensation for elections on January 5 or January 12, 2002, at Spirit Lake, Idaho, because of inclement weather and a fallen tree that damaged the Masonic Building where the Commandery normally meets. See Article XXV, Sec. 263. The Commandery was directed to comply with the quorum requirements of Article XXIV, Sec. 251. An alternative meeting place at Rathdrum was authorized. The request for a dispensation for installation of officers was denied because it was not necessary. See Article XXVIII, Sec. 293, Constitution, Laws, and Regulations of the Grand Commandery, K.T. of Idaho.
- No. 2. Idaho Commandery No. 1 was granted a dispensation to hold an open installation of officers on Thursday, December 20, 2001, and thereafter attend an open installation of the officers of Boise Assembly No. 137, Social Order of the Beauceant. The installations were held at the Masonic Temple, Boise, Idaho. See Regulation PL. Public Appearance.
- No. 3. Lewiston Commandery No. 2 and Moscow Commandery No. 3 were granted a dispensation to hold a joint conclave at Lewiston, Idaho, on May 23, 2001, for the purpose of the Grand Commander's visitation, provided the quorum requirement of Article XXIV, Sec. 251, was met. This dispensation was issued in conjunction with Warrant No. 2001-01.
- No. 4. Salmon Commandery NO. 9 was granted a dispensation to attend on December 18, 2001, an open meeting of Hugh Duncan Chapter No. 2, Order of the Eastern Star, at the Masonic Temple, Salmon, Idaho, and present Salmon Commandery's Christmas Observance at that time and place. See Regulation PL. Public Appearance.
- No. 5. Salmon Commandery No. 9 was granted a dispensation to hold a special conclave on Thursday, February 21, 2002, for the purpose of inspection by SK Theodore A. Fricke, EGG.

GENERAL ORDERS

- General Order No. 1. The constituent Commanderies were ordered to report in writing to the Grand Prelate of the death of a Sir Knight belonging to its respective commandery.
- General Order No. 2. All Grand Commandery Officers, Constituent Commanders, and Recorders were directed to attend the Northwest Regional Workshop October 18-20 at Boise, Idaho.
- General Order No. 3. Constituent Commanderies were ordered to hold a traditional Christmas Observance.
- General Order No. 4. Constituent Commanderies were ordered to hold a traditional Easter Observance.
- General Order No. 5. Pursuant to the powers and authority conferred upon the Grand Commander by law including but no limited to By-Laws, Article XII, Sec. 112, a cash and back account audit and review was ordered to be performed by an independent accountant. The purpose of the review was for the protection of the individuals supervising the accounts, who had indicated that they would retire in the year 2002.

THE KNIGHTS TEMPLAR EYE FOUNDATION

The Knights Templar Eye Foundation remains our number one philanthropy. People in our local communities recognize Knights Templar for the work we do to improve the vision of needy children and adults alike.

SK Ernest I. Teter, KCT, has ably directed the 34th Annual Voluntary Campaign for the Knights Templar Eye Foundation in Idaho. Through his leadership several of the constituent commanderies are now 100% Life Sponsored. Idaho Commandery No. 1 is also contributing to make our other commanderies Life Sponsored.

Idaho still receives much more assistance than we give in contributions to the Foundation. In per capita giving, we rank in the lower third of the commanderies in the nation. We are improving and offering new ideas to raise money. For instance, SK Teter observed that the President of the United States had asked all school children to send him \$1.00 for the children of Afghanistan. The children did and gave over one million dollars. So SK Teter asked that we Templars show our support for the Eye Foundation by

each sending the Grand Commander \$5.00 bill. I have received \$145.00. I also made a \$100.00 contribution as a gift to my Grand Officers.

We need to do better and we can in our support for the Eye Foundation.

HOLY LAND PILGRIMAGE

The military conflicts, and terrorism – more like a war – raging in Israel and Palestine prevented us for the second year in a row from sending a minister to the Holy Land. Last year we selected a clergy person from Pocatello only to have the State Department talk her out of going. This year our Most Eminent Grand Master, concerned about the safety and welfare of the participants, cancelled the Holy Land Tour. The Holy Land Pilgrimage remains, however, one of our top priorities. When you observe the reverent glow emanating from the face of a priest, pastor, or minister who has returned from a pilgrimage to Jesus' homeland, you will understand why the Holy Land Pilgrimage program is so important. This year we have the resources to send two ministers.

Remember that your contributions are tax deductible. We must continue to do our very best to promote this worthy cause.

THE STATE OF THE ORDER

The State of the Order for Idaho Knights Templary can be summed up in one word: Improving. We are out of "intensive care" but we are not off the critical list yet. We are slowly but steadily improving. We must continue to think and act positively.

When you elected me last year as Grand Commander, I set forth three principal goals: proficient ritual, increased membership, and active philanthropies.

Our ritual work has improved and we are doing more of it. For the second straight year all constituent commanderies had a quorum at the Grand Commander's visitation and also when SK Ted Fricke, EGG, came for inspection. The inspection results will be presented in EGG Fricke's report. Degrees were conferred in all areas of our jurisdiction. We now have candidates, but are challenged to find available dates to perform the work. All constituent commanderies except one have at least one Sir Knight. All commanderies have candidates progressing in the York Rite Degrees.

We again lost the membership race. Our numbers fell from the low 700s to 686. Deaths are the principal cause; but on a positive note we also eliminated from our roles names that have been carried for years although no longer active or dues paying. We need to continue the Grand Encampment's membership program, five per cent/plus one. We must use in our daily routine such programs as SK Dave Triplett's PowerPoint presentation on York

Rite. We should share more aggressively Knights Templary with Blue Lodge members and Shriners. In addition, we need to timely share the ritual with our new candidates. Remember, all Christian Masons should be Knights Templar.

Knights Templars are called to serve and benefit mankind. Our Eye Foundation, Educational Foundation, and Holy Land Pilgrimage programs are all ways that we can be "ever ready to defend the weak, the innocent, the helpless, and the oppressed...". Please be generous of your time and assets. Each one of us needs to work as hard as SK Kent Gist, PGC, does on the Educational Foundation. He has done an excellent job in monitoring our loan funds.

One of the best methods I have found to assist in our recovery and growth in Idaho Templary – and a program I recommend to continue – is the long-range planning process proposed by the Grand Encampment. The long-range plan allows us to focus on what we want to achieve. An annual budget is a material part of a long or short range plan. Also, in order to maintain continuity, the person elected as Deputy Grand Commander should automatically become Grand Commander. This procedure allows for efficient planning. The By-Law Committee, under the direction of Chairman James L. Curtis, PGC, has revamped and updated our laws. The committee's work along with other recommendations will be presented in the form of resolutions for consideration by the Grand Commandery.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

SK Gist appointed me in the Grand Commandery Line and got me started on a wonderful journey, for which I will also be grateful. My wife, Tommye, gave me her help and support and kept me focused (and kept me awake while I was driving). I thank her for her love and support.

SK M. William (Bill) Echo, PGC, ECR/T, has given us a great legacy and a challenge. Now that he is retiring we must start a new era with a new Grand Recorder/Treasurer, and build upon the base that he has left us. He has been an invaluable advisor and help to those of us who have come up the Grand Commandery Line. Bill, to you we give our heartfelt appreciation and thanks.

To my Officers, including SK Dan Beck who has authored and edited most of our Knights Templar Supplement magazine, I truly thank you for your support allowing me to have this wonderful year.

CONCLUSION

Templary is one of the finest and most worthwhile fraternal organizations in the world. You bestowed upon me a great privilege and honor when you elected me, Grand Commander. Because of your efforts, I leave this

office knowing that we will soon be removed from the critical list. We have all of the ingredients necessary to represent Christ our Savior in the world and benefit mankind.

Knights Templar are builders of a better world. We build by patterning our life and service after the Blessed Emmanuel whom we are called to serve. We are builders described in Will Alen Dromgoole's poem "The Bridge Builder".

An old man going a long highway Came at evening, cold an gray, To a chasm vast and wide and steep, With waters rolling cold and deep.

The old man crossed in the twilight dim-The sullen stream had no fears for him; But he turned when safe on the other side, And built a bridge to span the tide.





He was Raised in Portneuf Lodge No. 18, June 1st, 1938, and served as its Worshipful Master for the year 1954. He was elected Most Worshipful Grand Master of Masons in Idaho in September 1964, serving for one year, during which he instituted a Lodge of Research for the State of Idaho.

John was exalted to the Degree of the Royal Arch in Pocatello Chapter on November 11, 1939, served as Excellent Grand High Priest for the year 1952 and was elected Most Excellent Grand High Priest of the Grand Chapter of Idaho May 24th, 1962.
