

#### DIVINE SERVICES

Divine Services this year began at 6 p.m. at the Boise Masonic Temple with the procession of the 44 Sir Knights in uniform. Sir Knight and Companion Peter Furno officiated during the service. MC Leonard then called on Illustrious Sir Garrett to say a few words. Noble Dale welcomed the Grand York Rite to facilities of El Korah Temple.




Companion Fricke retained the podium, introduced his Grand Officers,



## Harry L. Huffer

Most Excellent Grand High Priest, 2002-03

Harry L. Huffer was born to James Roy and Nancy Elizabeth Huffer on August 23, 1922 at Locust Grove, Iowa. Harry was the third son of four sons. The family moved from Hamburg, Iowa, to Caldwell, Idaho, in May of 1937. Harry attended school in Hamburg through his freshman year. He graduated from Caldwell High School in 1940.

Harry enlisted in the Army National Guard in May 1940 and was called to active duty in the Us Army in 1941. He served in several capacities, the last being as Master Sergeant, Chief of Supply for a field artillery group, serving in the Continental United States and the Pacific Theater until November 9, 1945. After WWII, he attended the College of Idaho in Caldwell and Tri-State College in Angola, Indiana. After college, Harry was employed by the State of Idaho Military Department in a combined Civil Service and military status, with duty stations in Caldwell and Boise. He retired from Civil Service in 1980 and from the military in August of 1982 with 41 years of service.

Harry married Artenia M. Blakley in 1951, and after a long illness, she passed away in October 1995. Son, Mac Lee Huffer, drowned in a boating accident in August of 1974. There were no other children.

Harry began his Masonic career in Mt Moriah Lodge #39, being "raised" to the sublime degree of Master Mason on November 7, 1957. He was exalted to the Royal Arch Degree in Caldwell Chapter #19, RAM, in 1982 becoming High Priest in 1987. He served as District Deputy Grand High Priest for three years after which he was appointed into the Grand Line and was elected Most Excellent Grand High Priest, April 26, 2002. Harry is also serving as Secretary of Caldwell Chapter #19.

Harry was greeted a Royal and Select Master in King Solomon Council #4 in 1988 and has served the past five years as Illustrious Master. He was Knighted as a Knight Templar in Idaho Commandery #1 in 1989 and served as Eminent Commander in 1995. He also served as Eminent Grand Prelate for two years. He is a life member of Mount Moriah Lodge #39, Caldwell Chapter #19, King Solomon Council #4, Idaho Commandery #1, and El Korah Shrine. He also is a Patron Sponsor of the Knights Templar Eye Foundation and a Life Sponsor of the Shrine Children's Hospital. Also, a life member and Past Patron of Hermosa Chapter #32, Order of the Eastern Star.

Membership in other appendant bodies include: St. Michael Conclave RCC, Past Sovereign; Redemption Tabernacle #XL HRAKTP; Tri-Valley York Rite College #178; Caldwell Shrine Club; Egg & Shell Club; and Scottish Rite Bodies Valley of Boise. Awards received include Holy Order of the High Priesthood 1988, Thrice Illustrious Master Order of the Silver Trowel 1989, Cryptic Mason of the Year 2001, Knight Templar Cross of Honor 1999, and Knight Commander of the Temple 2000.

#### **VISITATIONS**

On My visitations to the 14 Royal Arch Chapters in Idaho, I learned that most all the Chapters were having much difficulty in having enough members present to open. Two Chapters were unable to open for my official visitation.

It was then determined that a change must be made in the existing bylaws to permit the Chapters of Idaho to open with the six-man opening whenever necessary. Several adjoining states have had the six-man opening for over four years. We need to update.

Several Chapters requested dispensation to allow joint openings and dispensations were granted. Also, a few Chapters having Council and Commandery had joint meetings with the bodies having joint official visitations. The joint meetings were greatly appreciated by the Chapters and in some cases the Council and Commandery.

- 8. Cyrus Chapter No. 2, Nampa, ID, to hold a regularly scheduled convocation out of time on other than the regular scheduled date. Meeting date to be December 11, 2002.
- 9. Cyrus Chapter No. 2, Nampa, ID, to conduct a regularly scheduled convocation out of time on other than regular scheduled date. Meeting date to be October 30, 2002.
- 10. Cyrus Chapter No. 2, Nampa, ID, revocation of Dispensation No. 8, dated December 3, 2002. Chapter was authorized to conduct a regular scheduled convocation out of time on December 13, 2002.
- 11. Cyrus Chapter No. 2, Nampa, ID, to hold installation of officers out of time on other than an authorized meeting date of December 13, 2002. The installation of officers was to be held on December 15, 2002.

#### CHAPTER SUSPENSION

Because of a continuing failure to provide timely annual reports for a period of at least four years, Buhl Chapter No 2l, Buhl, ID, was suspended until April 24, 2003 Grand Sessions in Boise, ID. On my official visitation May 2l, 2002, the Chapter failed to have a quorum. At a gathering of the members present, the High Priest and the Secretary were advised of the delinquent annual report and the urgency of submitting the required report, which had a due date of Feb 15, 2002. The report was not forthcoming as requested and the Chapter Charter was suspended. In retrospect, I believe probation would have been more appropriate. Suspension is to be lifted effective April 24, 2003, in order for the Chapter Officers to attend the Annual Convocation in Boise, ID April 24, 2003.

#### STATE OF THE ORDER

Attendance at all the Chapters visited in the State was with a quorum with the exception of two Chapters who lacked two members to open in

form. The lack of participation by the membership is a statewide problem. The increasing age factor and infirmities of the membership has precluded the active participation in many of the Chapters. Some Chapters now require attendance from other Chapters in order to have a quorum.

Some Chapters have pot luck dinners prior to meetings and also a short entertainment for those present. During meetings, the proficiency of the officers in their stations is a means of indicating their desire to excel in their work, which is greatly appreciated by the membership and the visiting members.

Active participants in the Blue Lodges, where contact can be made with potential members, is almost a must at this time. There are many good members in Blue Lodges who would be a great asset to the work in the Chapters.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

The Chairman of the Resolutions Committee, this year, has worked very long and diligently to bring before this 2003 session a resolution to amend the by-laws in order that a six-man opening may be authorized when the nine man quorum criteria cannot be met for Chapter opening. The conditions that now exist in the majority of the Chapters preclude opening with the required nine-man opening, unless members of other Chapters are in attendance. I, therefore, recommend the by-laws be amended to permit a six-man opening when a quorum of nine is not available. It is also recommended that a printed manual be presented at the next Grand Session for implementation of this resolution.

I am most appreciative of the support of the Grand Officers and other officers who have supported me and guided me in my journey in the Royal Arch. Without their continued support and guidance I would not be where I am today. Their unhesitating support of the Royal Arch activities is most gratifying. The work of the Credentials Committee was greatly appreciated and was performed in a very efficient manner. Introductions and guidance given by the Distinguished Guests Committee was greatly appreciated and was performed in a very professional manner. To Companions Arthur L Busacker, John R. #### REPORT OF THE GRAND HISTORIAN

To the Most Excellent Grand High, Officers, and Companions Priest of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Chapter of Idaho:

The subject of this report was compiled by A. F. Anderson, Mountain Home Chapter #24, Grand High Priest, Royal Arch Masons of Idaho, 1936-1937.

#### THE TRIANGLE

While the triangle is seldom directly called to the Mason's attention, there is no symbol more important in its significance, more various in it's application or more generally diffused throughout the whole system of Freemasonry, than the Triangle.

There are but few symbols in Masonry which are so frequently placed before the Craftsman, for him to recognize and contemplate, if he but will. An examination of it, therefore, cannot fail to be interesting to the Masonic student.

The triangle appears in Masonry in two forms: the Right-angled triangle, of an angle of 90 degrees, and the Equilateral Triangle, whose three sides and angles are equal, being angles of 60 degrees.

Both of these triangles were used as symbols by the Egyptians and both present the significant number three, yet their symbolic suggestions are in many respects so different that they may not, improperly, be considered as distinct symbols.

#### The Right-Angled Triangle

Any Mason can profitably occupy himself in discovering the references to this symbol, such as the 47<sup>th</sup> problem of Euclid, the Square of the Square and Compass. The station of the three principal officers together with the altar forms two right-angled triangles and other forms. The Right-Angled Triangle is to the Mason, as it was to the Ancient Egyptian, the symbol of Universal Nature.

This symbol was received by Pythagoras from the Egyptians during his long sojourn in that country and with it he also learned the peculiar property it possessed, that the sum of the squares of the two shorter sides is equal to the square of the longest side or hypotenuse.

The Egyptians making use of these properties for the purpose of symbolism, considered one leg (or side) as symbolizing Osiris, the male, the other leg symbolizing Isis, the female, and the hypotenuse as symbolizing Horus, the Son, a product of Osiris and Isis.

This figure has been adopted in the Third Degree of Masonry and will be recognized as the 47<sup>th</sup> problem of Euclid. This presents to the Mason, for his earnest consideration, God's great handiwork—Universal Nature.

#### The Equilateral Triangle

The Equilateral Triangle appears to have been adopted by nearly all the nations of antiquity as a symbol of the Deity. For the Triangle is the primary figure from which all others are built up and the Equilateral Triangle, being wholly symmetrical, is the one perfect Triangle and thus clearly becomes the symbol for that Perfect Being in which all things find their beginning.

The Equilateral Triangle viewed in the light of the doctrines of those who gave it currency as a divine symbol, represents the Great First Cause, the Creator and container of all things, as one and indivisible, manifesting himself in an infinity of forms and attributes in this visible universe.

Among the Egyptians, the darkness through which the candidate for initiation was made to pass was symbolized by the trowel, an important Masonic implement which in their system of hieroglyphics has the form of a triangle. The Equilateral Triangle, they considered as the most perfect of figures, and a representative of the great principal on animated existence, each of its sides referring to one of the three departments of creation, the animal, vegetable and mineral.

The Equilateral Triangle is to be found scattered throughout the Masonic system. It forms in the Royal Arch, the figure within which the Jewels of the Officers are suspended. It is in the ineffable degrees, the sacred Delta every where presenting itself as the symbol of the Great Architect of the Universe.

In Ancient Craft Masonry, it is constantly exhibited as the element of important ceremonies and may be considered as one of the most constant forms of Masonic Symbolism.

While this symbol is perhaps more emphatically presented to the Royal Arch Mason than the Master Mason, it is, nevertheless, a possession of the Master Mason and one that, however obtrusive the references to it may be, is by no means absent from the Master's Lodge. It is presented by the Compass of the Compass and Square as, when that symbol is opened to the extent of 60 degrees (as it should be) a third and connecting side connects the ends of the compass is supplied, we have presented an Equilateral Triangle.

The Equilateral Triangle is so completely appropriated to the purpose of a symbol for Deity and perfection that to treat of its various other and decidedly minor symbolic significance, would but obscure its pre-eminent Symbolic meaning.

In conclusion, then, the Triangle in the two forms here discussed, teaches the Mason that far more lies in Masonic Symbolism and in Masonic instruction, than appears upon the surface; causes him to contemplate Universal Nature; points out the probable source of an important symbolic legend; draws his attention to what is probably, the world's oldest symbol and fixes his attention upon Deity and Perfection.

- B. ALTERNATE. FIVE MEMBERS QUALIFIED TO VOTE, TO-GETHER WITH ONE OR MORE COMPANIONS IN GOOD STANDING IN OTHER CHAPTERS IN IDAHO, SHALL CONSTITUTE A QUORUM FOR OPENING A CHAPTER, CONDUCTING ALL CHAPTER BUSINESS (EXCEPT SURRENDERING A CHARTER), AND CONFERRING DEGREES, PROVIDED ONE OF THE QUORUM IS AUTHORIZED TO PRESIDE.


#### INSTALLATION OF GRAND CHAPTER OFFICERS







Theodore A. Fricke was born to Albert W. Fricke and Georgetta Miller Fricke on February 15, 1942 in Rupert, Idaho. His parents were Idaho natives. Albert was born in Mackay and raised in Rupert. Georgetta was raised in Nampa. Albert had one sister, Anne. He grew up in Pocatello, in a very active Masonic Family. His father was Worshipful Master of Mt. Kinport Lodge and a District Deputy Grand Master. His parents were also active in Eastern Star, serving as Worthy Matron and Patron. Ted was Master Councilor of Pocatello Chapter, now Kirchner Chapter, Order of DeMolay in 1960.

Ted graduated from Pocatello High School in 1960, attended Idaho State University graduating from the School of Pharmacy in 1965. He then attended dental school in Kansas City and graduated in 1969. He had wanted to be a dentist after spending so much time around his uncle, Dr. Lawson Miller, a dentist in Jerome. His uncle was also a Mason and a member of El Korah Shrine and inspired Ted to become a dentist because of his independent lifestyle and the fact that he worked 9 TO 3 with an hour for lunch, and he had a lot of toys and spending money. It wasn't until later in his life that Ted found out the reason his uncle had all this was that he was a bachelor.

After graduation from dental school, Ted served in the US Air Force from 1969 to 1972. Following his military duty, Ted joined the practice of Dr. Bart Westberg, also a Mason, in Weiser, Idaho. He moved to Boise in 1974 and has practiced dentistry there since.

Ted has been married to Marci Mosman from Nez Perce, Idaho, since 1974. They have one daughter, Diana, who graduated from Idaho State University, May 10, 1997, with a degree in dietetics. Diana is also a graduate of Western Culinary Institute in Portland. She is a research chef with J.R. Simplot Co.

Ted was raised a Master Mason in 1964 by his Father. He is a member of Mt. Kinport Lodge No. 95 and Boise Lodge No. 2. He became a member of Scottish Rite in 1985 and York Rite in 1986. He joined El Korah in 1985. He is very active in the degrees of the Scottish Rite and York Rite, as well as in the El Korah Players, having played the villain for several years in many melodramas, despite his total inability to act.

Some Councils that cannot open are joining with nearby Councils to open and do Degree Work; I applaud them and hope the continued cooperation will benefit both Councils. Although we have a fairly aged membership we are getting new, younger Companions that are becoming very active.

### RECOMMENDATIONS

Companions, sometimes it just takes a couple of new members to kick start our Councils and get the older members more interested in the Work. I would like to see all Councils do their Degrees at stated meetings. I feel it gets everyone involved in the Work and promotes renewed interest in Cryptic Masonry. Try to get younger people involved in Freemasonry, my experience as a Past Master Councilor of DeMolay led me straight to Masonry.

John had a lot of friends in the Masonic Community and he will be sorely missed.

Declining membership continues to be the primary concern of virtually all Masonic bodies with the resulting impact on attendance, finance, and the quality of our ritual work. To a certain extent this is beyond the control of our York Rite Bodies, as the reservoir of potential candidates is also declining and aging rapidly. Our York Rite Bodies are often not able to adequately perform their ritual without assistance from other bodies or, in some instances, not even able to open for business. Poor ritual work leads to further apathy and decline in attendance.

We are beginning, however, to see a renewed interest in the Symbolic Lodges in some areas. Other fraternal organizations such as the Boy Scouts, DeMolay, and college fraternities have been able to substantially recover from their low points of a few years ago. These organizations may well be the precursors of renewed interest in the Masonic fraternity; however, if we do not take positive action soon, there may be no viable organization to build on.

It is possible in smaller organizations to develop a camaraderie that allows the organization to perform well beyond its resources. If we are to survive in the 21<sup>st</sup> century, it will be necessary to draw upon all of our resources. We must take pride in our ritual work; develop more cooperation between our chapters, councils, and commanderies; become active in and support our Symbolic Lodges; and extend cooperation to all of the rest of the Masonic family.



To: All the officers, Companions and Sir Knights of the Grand Chapter, Council, and Commandery:

Each year at our Grand York Rite Sessions in Idaho, we pause a moment to reflect on those of our Orders who have laid down their working tools of the Fraternity. Their comfortable and familiar presence seems an overwhelming loss; reflection, however, assures us they have passed through the hidden veil and are traveling upon that level of time from which no traveler returns, but where they are will ultimately arrive at that Holy of Holies which we can only imagine, and thus we cherish their memory forever.

We are saddened to report the loss of one of the Grand Line Officers this year. Sir Knight John Paul Lemmon, the Right Eminent Grand Commander, was called to Eternal Rest on 7 July 2002 and was laid to rest in Richfield, Idaho.

## JOHN PAUL LEMMON

Brother, Companion, and Sir Knight John Paul Lemmon was born December 3, 1917, in Shoshone, Idaho. The family moved to Richfield where John graduated form high school. John Joined the Navy in 1941 and served in the submarine service. John served his community in many and various ways from Board Chairman of the Methodist Church to the City Council, and was a member of the Richfield High School Hall of Fame.

John was a member of Richfield Lodge No. 70, AF&AM, and served as its Master many times. He was also a Past High Priest of King Solomon Chapter No. 16, Past Illustrious Master of Twin Falls Council No. 7, and Past Commander of Twin Falls Commandery No. 10. John was awarded the Knights Templar Cross of Honor for outstanding service to Templary. He was a Past Very Eminent Preceptor of Redemption Tabernacle No. XL, Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests.

John served the Grand Lodge as the District Deputy Grand Master for the 5<sup>th</sup> Masonic District. He was a member of the Order of the High Priesthood, Order of Thrice Illustrious Masters, Past Worthy Patron of Chapter No. 72 Order of the Eastern Star, Member of Garnet Court No. 5, Gooding, Order of the Amaranth, Past Governor of Tri-Valley York Right College No. 178, Past Puissant Sovereign of St Charles Conclave Order of the Red Cross of Constantine, Past Prior of Idaho Priory No. 13 Knights of the York Cross of Honour, and a member of El Korah Shrine.

John served the Grand Council as the Most Illustrious Grand Master in 2001-2002, was elected and installed as the Right Eminent Grand Commander in 2002, and died while in office.

#### DAVID HENRY VOLKMAN

Brother, Companion, and Sir Knight David Henry Volkman was born 19 January 1928 in Everett, Washington. He resided there except for a tour of duty with the Army Signal Corps. On June 26, 1948, he married Betty Jean Gulle.

David began his Masonic career being raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason in Alpha Lodge No. 212 at Everett, Washington, on April 14, 1956, progressing through the chairs to become Senior Warden in 1963 and from March to August of that year presided in the absence of the Worshipful Master.

In 1961, he was exalted to the Sublime Degree of Royal Arch Mason in Everett Chapter No. 24, Everett, Washington.

In 1966, he was elected Senior Warden of Robert Newell Lodge No. 96 at Lewiston, Idaho. He served as its Master in 1967, the year of the Centennial of the Grand Lodge of Idaho. He was appointed District Deputy Grand Master of the 9<sup>th</sup> Masonic District, serving in this office for two years. David also served the Grand Lodge of Idaho as its Orator.

After transferring to Lewiston Chapter No. 4 in Lewiston, he served as High Priest in 1973. He received the Degrees of Royal and Select Master at Lewiston and served as Illustrious Master in 1976. He was Dubbed and Created a Knight Templar in Lewiston Commandery No. 2 and served as Commander in 1974. He was made a member of the Order of the High Priesthood, 23 May 1973, received the Grade of Thrice Illustrious Master, 27 April 1976, and was Created a Knight of the York Cross of Honour in Idaho Priory No. 13 in 1977. He was elected a Knight Companion of the Red Cross of Constantine, March 2, 1974, in St Patrick Conclave.

Other Masonic Bodies and Orders with which he was affiliated are: 32<sup>nd</sup> Degree Scottish Rite Mason, created in the Valley of Everett, Washington, Master of Kadosh in 1974 and Knighted in the Royal Order of Scotland in 1978; Past Worthy Patron of Laurel Chapter, Order of the Eastern Star 1970-71; Royal Patron of the Order of the Amaranth in Everett in 1960; Noble in Nile Temple in Seattle, Washington, in June 1957; Noble of Calam Temple in Lewiston and Potentate in 1981; Member of Lewiston Court No. 6, Royal Order of Jesters at Coeur d'Alene, Idaho. He was elected to receive the DeMolay Honorary Legion of Honor April 8, 1981, and served as Grand Royal Patron of the Grand Court of Idaho, Order of the Amaranth.

David was Coroneted Honorary Inspector General 33<sup>rd</sup> Degree of the

Scottish Rite, December 1987. He formed and was a Charter Member of Clearwater York Rite College No. 135, and he served as its Governor. He was appointed Deputy Grand Governor in 1988 and later served as Grand Governor.

David served these Grand Bodies as the Most Excellent Grand High Priest of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons in 1983, Right Eminent Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery in 1988, and Most Illustrious Grand Master of the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons in 1990.

He served the General Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons International as the Regional Deputy General Grand High Priest from 1987 to 1990, and the General Grand Council of Cryptic Masons International as the General Grand Captain of the Guard from 1996 to 1999.

David was a Past Preceptor of Redemption Tabernacle No. XL, Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests and a Knight Commander of the Temple, and was awarded the Columbian Medal by the General Grand Council of Cryptic Masons International.

He served as Grand Master General of Convent General, Knights of the York Cross of Honour. His last call to duty was Intendant General of the Idaho Division of the Red Cross of Constantine and Appendant Orders, for the United States, Mexico, and the Philippines and was in office at the time of his death. He was truly a giant among men who lived by the Masonic Teaching of "WHO CAN BEST WORK AND BEST AGREE". These are Big Shoes to be filled. David was called to be with his maker on 22 November 2002.

#### CHARLES GUSTAV KUNZE

Brother, Companion, and Sir Knight Charles Gustav Kunze was born 21 May 1912 in Buhl, Idaho. Charles married Mildred Balderstan on December 24, 1931. Charles worked for the Union Pacific Railroad for 30 years.

Charles was raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason in Mt. Kinport Lodge No. 95 of Pocatello on May 2, 1962, and served as Worshipful Master in 1968. He was exalted to the Holy Royal Arch on November 10, 1962, and served as the High Priest of Pocatello Chapter No. 6, Royal Arch Masons.

He received the Degrees of Royal and Select Master at Pocatello on February 12, 1963, and served as Illustrious Master of Bannock Council No. 2 in 1974. Charles served the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons of Idaho as the Most Illustrious Grand Master in 1982-1983.

Charles was dubbed and created a Knight Templar in Gate City Commandery No. 4 and served as the Commander in 1972. He served the Grand Commandery of Idaho as Grand Commander in 1985. He was honored by

the Grand Encampment Knights Templar as a Knight Commander of the Temple.

He was a Life Member of the Order of the High Priesthood and the Order of Thrice Illustrious Masters. He was a member of St Michael Conclave, Red Cross of Constantine, until affiliation with St Charles Conclave of Pocatello.

He was a Life Member of Priory No. 13, Knights of the York Cross of Honour, and a Noble of El Korah Shrine and member of the Southeast Idaho Shrine Club.

Charles went to be with his Lord on December 3, 2002.
