

Theodore A. Fricke was born to Albert W. Fricke and Georgetta Miller Fricke on February 15, 1942 in Rupert, Idaho. His parents were Idaho natives. Albert was born in Mackay and raised in Rupert. Georgetta was raised in Nampa. Albert had one sister, Anne. He grew up in Pocatello, in a very active Masonic Family. His father was Worshipful Master of Mt. Kinport Lodge and a District Deputy Grand Master. His parents were also active in Eastern Star, serving as Worthy Matron and Patron. Ted was Master Councilor of Pocatello Chapter, now Kirchner Chapter, Order of DeMolay in 1960.

Ted graduated from Pocatello High School in 1960, attended Idaho State University graduating from the School of Pharmacy in 1965. He then attended dental school in Kansas City and graduated in 1969. He had wanted to be a dentist after spending so much time around his uncle, Dr. Lawson Miller, a dentist in Jerome. His uncle was also a Mason and a member of El Korah Shrine and inspired Ted to become a dentist because of his independent lifestyle and the fact that he worked 9 TO 3 with an hour for lunch, and he had a lot of toys and spending money. It wasn't until later in his life that Ted found out the reason his uncle had all this was that he was a bachelor.

After graduation from dental school, Ted served in the US Air Force from 1969 to 1972. Following his military duty, Ted joined the practice of Dr. Bart Westberg, also a Mason, in Weiser, Idaho. He moved to Boise in 1974 and has practiced dentistry there since.

Ted has been married to Marci Mosman from Nez Perce, Idaho, since 1974. They have one daughter, Diana, who graduated from Idaho State University, May 10, 1997, with a degree in dietetics. Diana is also a graduate of Western Culinary Institute in Portland. She is a research chef with J.R. Simplot Co.

Ted was raised a Master Mason in 1964 by his Father. He is a member of Mt. Kinport Lodge No. 95 and Boise Lodge No. 2. He became a member of Scottish Rite in 1985 and York Rite in 1986. He joined El Korah in 1985. He is very active in the degrees of the Scottish Rite and York Rite, as well as in the El Korah Players, having played the villain for several years in many melodramas, despite his total inability to act.

Ted has served as High Priest of Boise Chapter No. 3, Royal Arch Masons; Illustrious Master of Idaho Council No. 1, Cryptic Masons; Eminent Commander of Idaho Commandery No. 1, Knights Templar; Worthy Patron of Boise Chapter No. 65, Order of Eastern Star; and Potentate of El Korah Temple, A.A.O.N.M.S. He is the Junior Past Grand Illustrious Master of the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons of Idaho. He is also a member of St Michael Conclave, Red Cross of Constantine; Tabernacle XL, Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests; Clearwater College #135, York Rite College; and the DeMolay Legion of Honor.

STATE OF THE ORDER

Sir Knights, having the pleasure of observing the eight Commanderies in Idaho for nearly two years from the Grand Commander's perspective, I can tell you that the Grand Commandery of Idaho is still not in the best of shape. However, I feel while some Commanderies have stayed about the same, some have definitely improved. Commanderies that a year ago could not do the ten-man opening are doing so sometimes with a little help from their friends. The Order of the Temple has been done and new Sir Knights created in four Commanderies. All Commanderies held Easter and Christmas Observances. I appreciate the efforts of the Constituent Commanders for their efforts in holding these Orders and Observances. As you all are aware, the average age of our membership is getting older. It is imperative that we attract younger members, and I applaud the Commanderies that have done so, especially those that have gotten the new Sir Knights active in their respective Commanderies as officers. Sir Knights, the State of our Order will improve if we can be enthusiastic about it and try to instill that enthusiasm in our members.

This year I had the pleasure of having joint visitations with the Most Excellent Grand High Priest, Pete Cargill, and the Most Illustrious Grand Master, Merle Hill. Because of this, I can assure the State of York Rite Unity is very well in Idaho. I feel that the joint visitations helped the various Chapters, Councils, and Commanderies as well as cementing the friendships of the three Grand Officers for the rest of our lives.

The 2003 version of the Tactics Manual is also a great help to improving the State of the Order, and we can all thank Deputy Grand Commander Dean Millard for his efforts on this important work.

HOLY LAND PILGRIMAGE

I regret to report that we were not able to send a minister to the Holy Land because of the unrest in the Middle East. This is an important function for the Grand Commandery, and I sincerely hope we will be able to do this in the future.

RECOMMENDATIONS

I want to encourage all the Sir Knights to be active in their Blue Lodges. *Every Christian mason should be a Knight Templar*. Of the thousands of Masons in Idaho, we have less than 700 Knights Templar. By going to our Blue Lodges and talking about York Rite, we can help correct this discrepancy.

The Order of the Temple is one of the finest Degrees in Freemasonry and is most impressive when done from memory. It is much more impressive to the new Sir Knights, and I know they appreciate the effort entailed to learn the work.

I would like to see the Orders done on a regular meeting night. Several Commanderies are already doing this, and I would like to encourage it as much as possible. I realize there are times when a Festival is appropriate, but doing one Order at a time makes it more impressive for the candidate, and it gets the members more involved and focused on one Order.

I recommend that all Sir Knights look at the Idaho Masonic Family Alliance web site, created by our Grand Recorder/Treasurer Dave Grindle. It is found at www.idahomasons.org. This website has a lot of useful information and is a great tool for all Idaho Masons.

I would like to see as many Sir Knights as possible attend the Northwest York Rite Conference in Boise, Oct. 15 and 16 at El Korah. This conference provides important information for your Commandery and is attended by most of the Grand Encampment Officers.

Past Grand Commander Harry Hackett appointed me to the Commandery line. I'd like to thank him, and I am sure he hears me. Harry was a great guy and is missed by his many friends. I have worked on getting a database established that will allow me to find anyone who has been a member of the York Rite Bodies of Idaho since their inception. Also, it will improve the ability to track the membership and notify the various Constituent Commanderies of the status of individual members. This database will improve the capabilities of the Grand Recorder/Treasurer in preparing 50 Year Certificates, Life Membership Dues Cards, Annual Commandery Dues Cards, etc. I was able to publish the 2003 Proceedings in a timely manner although a little late according to the guidelines. There are several Resolutions which will make the production and publishing of the proceedings more economical. I continue to attempt to keep the Office of the Grand Recorder/Treasurer up-to-date with software upgrades as necessary to stay current on new capabilities of the software. The Knights Templar Education Foundation generates a rather dismal report this year. I had turned one account over to an attorney for collection, and he was successful in collecting the full amount.

Another account was due to start payment, and I finally got a payment. After four months had passed, I finally got a check issued by the borrower's wife written on the Episcopal Church in Idaho Falls. I thought that rather strange but credited his account and deposited the check. That was in August. I have written three letters with no response and finally sent a copy of the last letter to his co-signer, his father-in-law. The next day, I got a letter from the Episcopal Church notifying me that our borrower's wife was indicted for embezzling at least \$6,500.00 from the church, \$1,000.00 of which was the check she sent to us. Further action is pending on this account.

Another account is giving cause for concern. I am unable to get a response from the borrower, and his co-signer has also received a copy of the last letter. The next move will be to send a demand letter to the co-signers, which is not a pleasant move to have to make.

One loan was all that was made during the last year, in the amount of \$5,000.00. We could make a few loans if there were qualified applicants. Recent experience is that collections are becoming difficult.

I have administered this fund for the past 16 years. It is in the process of being returned to the Grand Recorder, which is the designated place for it. I got it the year I was Grand Recorder and, due to Bob Heffner's health and the burden placed on Bill Echo, just kept at it.

I apologize for turning it over to the Grand Recorder with some inherent problems and will do my best to help get them resolved.

Idaho #1 had 1 affiliation and 1 reinstatement; while Twin Falls #10 had 3 reinstatements for a total gain of 17 for Idaho.

We then lost 10 to demits, 5 Suspensions, and 24 passed through the veil to the Celestial Lodge above.

We closed 2003 with 603 members for a state wide loss of 22.

Lewiston Commandery #2 was awarded the Grand Commandery Membership Trophy because they had the greatest gain.

Section 72.

The Annual Conclave of this Grand Commandery shall be held on the first Friday afternoon, Saturday morning, or Saturday afternoon following the third Sunday in the month of April and the hour of meeting shall be not later than 9:00 A.M. for morning sessions or 1:30 P.M. for afternoon sessions. If conditions arise making it impossible or impracticable to hold the Annual Conclave at the appointed time and place, the Right Eminent Grand Commander may reconvene the Grand Commandery, provided a quorum is present as defined by Section 37 of the Constitution and Statutes of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar of the U.S.A. (1987) and Article IV, Section 31, of the Code of Laws of the Grand Commandery of Idaho. He may then order the elective Grand Commandery Officers and the Committees on Finance and Jurisprudence to convene at a time and place designated by him. Provided he and one other dais officer, the Grand Recorder/ Treasurer, and two members of each of the aforementioned committees are present, they may transact the usual business of the Annual Conclave excepting the election of officers. NOTE: See Article III, Section 21, and Article XIII, Section 133.

 - 1. A one time honorarium will be made to this Chapter in the form of a \$50.00 donation to the KTEF through the prospective member's Commandery and \$20.00 to the Chapter for costs. (This is a total fee of \$70.00 after the initial 90 days.)
 - 2. This honorarium shall be reduced to \$30.00 for the period preceding and 90 days following the inception of the Chapter which will be retained by the Chapter for funding purposes. (This is a total fee of \$30.00 prior to inception and for 90 days immediately following inception.)
 - 3. That a non-voting associate membership be available at \$20.00 to Past Eminent Commanders of other jurisdictions.





Merle S. Hill was born in Torrington, WY, on February 28, 1933. The family moved to the Twin Falls area in 1935. Three years in the Navy put him in California and Japan, with 25 months served in Yokosuka, Japan, in ship repair, later being discharged in San Francisco in December 1953.

He started college in 1954 in Los Angeles, later working in Security with the Los Angeles City Schools for nine years while attending college. He attended Woodbury College, graduating with a Bachelors Degree in Business Administration, Magna Cum Laude. He earned a second Bachelors Degree in Business Education and started teaching at Belmont High School in 1964, starting as a business teacher and later serving as a full-time counselor, Assistant Head Counselor, Career Advisor (listed in Who's Who in American Education), student council advisor, and athletic director. He continued college, earning a Masters of Arts Degree in secondary teaching and a second Masters of Arts Degree in school administration. He has life credentials in California in secondary teaching, school counseling, and school administration. He retired in 1985 after working 22 ½ years at Belmont, a total of 31 ½ years.

He married Beverly in California in 1956 and they have three sons.



Two Chapters were unable to attain a quorum to open for my official visit, due to illness or other circumstances; however, we had excellent discussion and input as we informally met.

Several dispensations were granted to allow joint meetings that were very productive and, I believe, appreciated by the Companions and Sir Knights as well as the Right Eminent Grand Commander, the Most Illustrious Grand Master and myself. This has allowed easier access to a quorum for the bodies, better travel arrangements for the Grand Officers, and the opportunity for the constituent membership to see the Grand Officers in the same place at the same time. It fortifies the York Rite as an entity made up of three bodies working together.

I was unable to attend the several Grand York Rite Sessions in most of our neighboring states, due to either work conflicts or duties in other Masonic bodies. Luckily, our Grand Officers listed below most capably assisted me to represent the Royal Arch Masons of Idaho. I wish to thank the Officers, Chapters, Grand Officers and Grand Chapters in the neighboring jurisdictions for the courtesies shown our Grand Chapter Officers and myself in all our visitations.

BYLAW CHANGES

Cyrus Chapter #2 requested several bylaw changes on May 1, 2003 to:

- (1). Change the Election of Officers from fourth Wednesday in December to fourth Wednesday in November.
- (2). Allow Chapter to change meeting dates to avoid conflicts without Dispensation.
- (3). Eliminate requirement for Certified Public Accountant to annually audit books.

I gave my final approval to change #1 & #3 above, on October 12, 2003. Change #2 was not allowed as the Stated Convocations must be held on specific dates.

Keystone Chapter #29 redid there by-laws and they were approved on April 19, 2004.

DISPENSATIONS

- April 29, 2003, Granted Dispensation to Lewiston Chapter #4 RAM to hold a Called Convocation at Moscow, Idaho on April 30, 2003 for the purpose of the official visit of the MEGHP.
- June 23, 2003, Granted Dispensation to Keystone Chapter #29 RAM to hold Called Convocation on August 23, 2003 for the official visit of the MEGHP.
- 3. September 7, 2003, Granted Dispensation for Cyrus Chapter #2 RAM to hold its Stated Convocation on September 22, 2003 in Caldwell, Idaho for the purpose of the official visit of the MEGHP. This Dispensation was withdrawn and replaced with Dispensation #4 when it was found that the request was for a Called Convocation and not a Stated Convocation.
- September 22, 2003, Granted Dispensation for a Called Convocation of Cyrus Chapter #2 RAM on September 22, 2003 as a Joint meeting with Caldwell Chapter #19 for the official visit of the MEGHP.
- October 12, 2003, Granted Dispensation to Cyrus Chapter #2 RAM to hold their Stated Convocation on October 15, 2003 instead of October 22, 2003 as the latter date conflicted with the 8th Masonic District Fall Communication.
- 6. December 13, 2003, Granted Dispensation to Cyrus Chapter #2 RAM to cancel the December Stated Convocation that fell on Christmas Eve. A request was also made for a Dispensation to hold the installation on December 14, 2003 after the installation of Ashlar Lodge #29 A. F. & A.M. I found that this was a proper date and that no Dispensation was required.
- January 25, 2004, Granted Dispensation to Moscow Chapter #7 RAM to hold its January Stated Convocation on January 28, 2004 in Lewiston as a joint meeting with Lewiston Chapter #4 RAM, as Moscow could not gather a quorum on its Stated Convocation date due to a snow storm.

STATE OF THE ORDER

All companions who attend their Chapter functions are well aware of the scarcity of member participation. Regrettably, those who do not attend may be unaware of the actual state of the Rite. The York Rite urgently needs active members. Many of those who, at one time, were active are no longer able to attend for age or health reasons. Many others live beyond a reasonable distance to attend, and sadly, others are disinterested. Statistically, studies have shown that organizations such as ours have about ten percent of their membership who are active. The combined membership of the Royal Arch Chapters in Idaho is approximately 700. This leaves us less than 100 active members to man fourteen Chapters. The active Companions have risen to the occasion by joining other Chapters and attending still others to provide the necessary manpower. At best, this is a temporary fix, as age and infirmity overtake us. What to do? I know we are all tired of running just to cover the bases and try to stay in place. We must go into our Symbolic Lodges and present the York Rite as a continuation of the first three degrees, which are York Rite degrees and encourage those who are not York Rite members to join. (I realize that many of the active members of our Symbolic Lodges are active York Rite members, but some are not.) Secondly, we must find those good men, whom we all know that would make good Masons, and get a "friend to friend" letter in their hands. If each of us found one good man who would petition a lodge within the next year, the following year we could expect at least a partial reversal of our downward membership spiral. New blood in our York Rite is vital to our remaining a viable organization. Third, there is a short program, performed in costume, about the York Rite (which is being modified to include the Symbolic Lodges by Most Illustrious

Grand Master, Merle Hill) that can be presented to any group inside or outside the Masonic Family. Properly presented, the program should pique the interest of any non-York Rite Mason and hopefully encourage them to petition for the degrees. Lastly, once we receive a petition, if we cannot put on York Rite Degrees in a reasonable time and with some manner of proficiency, we should reach out to other York Rite Bodies, including the York Rite College for the manpower and skill to get it done. There are many just waiting to be asked to take a part in putting on the degrees and orders. Ask them.

RECOMMENDATIONS

The Board of Custodians of the Work has in hand and is working on changes to facilitate the Six Man Opening and to remove conflicts in the Ritual. I urge you to support their work.

There is a Resolution to streamline and shorten by one day the Grand York Rite Sessions. In the interests of spiraling costs and the time constraints of many active members I recommend its support.

The following cannot begin to acknowledge those who have helped and guided me along the path from an entered apprentice mason to the station of Grand High Priest. I owe a special debt of gratitude to Quentin Vaughn, PGHP, for appointing me to the line and for his valuable counsel along the way. I also wish to thank PGHPs Richard Crossler, David Volkman, William Echo, Kent Gist, Ernest Teter. Charles Huskey, James Curtis and Harry Huffer for their assistance and good advice to me. The Grand Officers have all been available to support our Grand Chapter and my office without hesitation, particularly David A. Grindle, our Grand Secretary/ Treasurer upon whom I have depended greatly. He gave good advice and tried to keep me on track and on time, sometimes to no avail. I wish to thank the Lewiston and Moscow York Rite Bodies for their untiring support and labor on this Grand Session. They have covered the bases and filled in, in every conceivable way. The Ladies of the Social Order of the Beauceant have been wonderful in their untiring work. Companions Rex Benson, Arthur Busacker, David A. Grindle and John Zeller represented the Idaho Grand Chapter at other jurisdictions and for other Grand Bodies that I could not attend. I truly appreciate their assistance. To all the Companions in our 14 Idaho Chapters, thank you for electing me to this high office, and allowing me to represent you throughout this and neighboring jurisdictions this past year. I am honored. To all those who have helped me who are not named here, thank you. I wish to thank my family for their support and covering for me in my business when I was away to Masonic functions. Finally, I want to thank Alene, my ex-wife, business partner and best friend for almost 60 years, who has encouraged and supported me in all my Masonic endeavors. Without her, I would not be here, as she was, is, and always will be my motivator.

REPORT OF THE GRAND HISTORIAN

To the Most Excellent Grand High Priest, Officers and Companions of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Idaho:

WHAT DOES FREE MEAN?

By A.F. Anderson

Did you know that Masonic scholars cannot agree on the time of origin or source and meaning of the term "Free" in the titles "Free and Accepted Mason" and "Freemasonry"? In the United Kingdom, the term Freemason is the norm whereas in many U. S. jurisdictions, the normal term is just Mason.

Different Masonic historians and authors have claimed widely differing dates of origin for the term. J. G. Findel says he found the term "Freemason" as early as 1212; George Steinmetz said **1350**; Robert F Gould said 1376; others have suggested the first use to be **1459**, or as recent as **1526**, all of which may seem ancient to our modem world, but these claims span more than 300 years. Many printed works using the term

from the seventeenth century are still available and it was common by 1717 when the Grand Lodge of England was formed.

The source meaning is likewise a matter of conjecture among Masonic historians. Other craft guilds used the term "free" as well, complicating the interpretation of its use among operative masons. Many Masons believe the term was unique to masons but G. W. Speth, in an article in *Ars Quatuor Coronatorum*, reported finding Free Carmen, Free Fisherman, Free Dredgers, Free Watermen, Free Vintners, Free Butchers, Free Carpenters and others. Wallace McLeod reports that craft guilds in London in 1319 were "closed shops" and *all men* of the craft were compelled to belong to the guild. They could not obtain the freedom of the city and therefore they were later to organize with no record found prior to 1356.

One of the theories of the origin of the term Free Mason is the "liberal arts" theory. The term "liberal' stems from the Latin liberalis meaning "of a freeman". Those who practiced the arts were governed by rules of their art or craft but free to follow their own inspirations and skill. Architecture was considered a fine art. Another theory of the origin of use of the term is the "freestone" theory. The term freestone said to have described a stone durable enough to stand in walls for centuries but with so little grain as to be craved and hewn without danger of chipping. Others suggested that freemasons worked in stones already freestanding as freed from the quarries by the hewers in the quarries. One reference of 1350 refers to a "master mason of free stones". Wallace McLeod reports that a quarrel between the "master hewers" and the "mason layers or setters" broke out in London in 1356 and they appeared before the City fathers to settle the dispute. They drew up a code of agreement that year.

A third idea is the "free of constraints" theory. During the Middle Ages, people were not free to travel and were bound to the land in a given locale. Master masons, however, were said to be "free" to travel from area-to-area in pursuit of their profession. The Oxford English Dictionary supports this idea.

Yet another idea is known as the "free of the craft" theory. Apprentices were not free of the craft because they could not earn wages nor accept work of their own. When they became Masters, they were then free to do both. A modification of this idea is that there were local guilds of masons who built the simple local buildings and were not free to travel. Other superior craftsmen were builders of cathedrals who were free to work anywhere their services were needed. Albert Mackey's encyclopedia supports this latter source of the term. Mackey also continents that a Mason must be free born and not in captivity. He notes that the Grand Lodge of England extends this to say that Masons must be free in all their thoughts and actions. George Steinmetz points out that both the origin theory of bondsmen being ineligible to join the Operatives Guilds and also the theory that an applicant comes of his own free will and accord have support in the rituals of different Grand Jurisdictions.

Another idea suggests that here were travel tolls and other taxes from which masons were "free". Mackey reports that the old lectures formerly used in England said, "The Masons who were selected to build the Temple of Solomon were declared Free and were exempted, together with their descendants, from imposts, duties, and taxes." Most authorities would say this was strictly allegorical rather than historical. A modification of this concept is that free masons were free to enter and depart the gates of the city at will without need for a pass. Supporters of this idea point to the present practice of awarding an outstanding person key to the city signifying

"freedom of the city".

Full analysis of the various theories presented could fill a book of its own. We can only conclude, as R. F Gould did, that we do not know for sure either the time or reason for the origin of the term. However, we may take with pride in the respect *the* term has implied from time immemorial and redouble our efforts to ensure that we retain the right to all of our freedoms.

ARTICLE IX Convocations

Section 1. Convocations of this Grand Chapter are Annual, Called, or Emergency.

Section 2. The Annual Convocation of this Grand Chapter shall be held on the first Friday afternoon, Saturday morning, or Saturday afternoon following the third Sunday in the month of April and the hour of meeting shall be not later than 9:00 A.M. for morning sessions or 1:30 P.M. for afternoon sessions. If conditions arise making it impossible or impracticable to hold the Annual Convocation at the appointed time and place, the Grand High Priest may declare an emergency to exist. The Grand High Priest may then order the elective Grand Chapter Officers and the committees on Finance and Jurisprudence to convene at a time and place designated by him. Although notice to others shall not be required, all Constituent Chapter members are welcome to attend Emergency Convocations, Providing the Grand High Priest, the Grand Secretary/Treasurer, and one other Grand Chapter Dais officer, and at least two members of each of the aforementioned committees are present, and a quorum is present, they may transact the usual business of the Annual Convocation except for the election of officers. NOTE: See ARTICLE III, Section 1, and ARTICLE XIII, Section 7a.

- g. At each Annual convocation make a report of the financial condition of the Grand Chapter, of the failure on the part of Constituent Chapters to make returns and pay dues and assessments as required, and such other matters as may require attention of the Grand Chapter.
- h. Prepare a financial statement of receipts and disbursements for the immediate past year, a statement of anticipated revenue for the coming year, and a proposed budget of expenses for the coming year. Said financial statement is to be in the hands of the Chairman of the Finance Committee at least ten days before the Annual Convocation.
- Furnish each Constituent Chapter with blank returns and instructions for preparing them.
- Furnish each Chapter under Dispensation with blank forms and instructions for making their returns and petitioning for Charter.
- Receive for his services such expenses as the Grand Chapter may direct.
- Furnish Constituent Chapters with Grand Chapter printed forms. No charge shall be made for printed forms.
- m. Have custody of the Seal, Jewels and Paraphernalia of the Grand Chapter.
- n. Arrange for electronic media and limited printed distribution of the Proceedings of the Grand Chapter by October 1st following the Grand Convocation.
- o. Be an ex-officio member of the Committee on Unfinished Business, prepaid Life Membership Committee, and assist the Committees in their duties
- p. Within sixty days after the close of the Annual Convocation arrange for the printing and forwarding to each Constituent Chapter, Elected Grand Chapter Officer, and each District Deputy Grand High Priest sufficient numbers of printed correction sheets to the Code of Laws and gummed stickers to correct the Ritual or Book of Essentials when changes have been made by the Grand Chapter or the Board of

Custodians.

Section 5. Each District Deputy Grand High Priest shall endeavor to visit each Constituent Chapter within his District at least once each Capitulator year to insure uniformity of work and adherence to the Ritual, Book of Essentials, and regulations of this Grand Chapter. He shall make such reports and recommendations to the Grand High Priest and at the Annual Convocation as are requested and necessary.

Section **6.** Grand Representatives Duties:

- a. It is the duty of Grand Representatives to other Jurisdictions near Idaho to attend the Idaho Annual Convocation, to welcome, to vouch for, and introduce their counterparts from other Jurisdictions and to see to their comfort while in attendance at the Grand Chapter Convocation. If a majority is favorable, the Chapter concurs. The Secretary shall carefully record an explicit account of all proceedings relating to the proposed amendment, and as soon as possible thereafter transmit a certified copy thereof to the Most Excellent Grand High Priest, signed by the High Priest and attested by himself under seal of the Chapter. When two thirds of all Chartered Chapters have concurred in the proposed amendment as referred to them, the Most Excellent Grand High Priest shall immediately promulgate the same as part of this Constitution.

As amended:

Section 1. This Constitution may be amended at any Stated Convocation of this Grand Chapter by a two-thirds vote of the members present if the Constituent Chapters have been apprised in writing of the proposed amendment sixty days before the Stated Convocation.



To The Right Eminent Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Idaho;

To All the officers, Companions and Sir Knights of the Grand Chapter, Council, and Commandery:

CHAIRMAN: Those Companions and Sir Knights participating in the Tribute will now assemble with the Honor Guard.

Each year at our York Rite Grand Sessions in Idaho, we pause a moment to reflect on those of our Orders who have laid down their working tools of the Fraternity. Their comfortable and familiar presence seems an overwhelming loss; reflection, however, assures us they have passed through the hidden veil and are traveling upon that level of time, from which no traveler returns, but where they are will ultimately arrive at that Holy of Holies, which we can only imagine and thus we cherish their memory forever.

We are most happy that our Blessed Savior has left the Lines of the Grand Bodies intact.

We are mourning the loss of three distinguished Past Grand Officers who were called to Eternal Rest.

YONEO SHIGIHARA

Brother, Companion, and Sir Knight Yoneo Shigihara was born in Rexburg, Idaho, and graduated from Madison High School in 1945. Following his graduation, Yoneo enlisted in the Army. He received special training as an interpreter and served with the 1179th Engineer Corps, 8th Army in Japan. Yoneo was discharged in 1946, and he and his wife, Hisako Uyeki, settled in Blackfoot. After a crop failure, they drew on the Minidoka Project.

Hisako was killed in an automobile accident in 1983. Yoneo and Susie Abo Onishi were wed in 1984.

Yoneo petitioned Rupert Lodge in 1966. He served as Master for two terms and as Master of the Idaho Lodge of Research 1965. Yoneo was a Past High Priest of Rupert Chapter No. 22, Past Illustrious Master of Twin Falls Council No. 7, and Past Commander of Twin Falls Commandery No. 10.

Yoneo was a member of the Order of the Amaranth, the Order of the Eastern Star, Tri -Valley York Rite College No. 178, Red Cross of Constantine, a Past Prior of Idaho Priory No. 13 Knight s of the York Cross of Honour, and Past Preceptor of Redemption Tabernacle XL, Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests.

Yoneo served the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons of Idaho as its Grand Illustrious Master in 1997 earning his 1st Quadrant of the York Grand Cross of Honour.

Yoneo was called by his maker on 20 October 2003.

MARVIN EVERETT SCHEIN

Brother, Companion, and Sir Knight Marvin Everett Schein was born February 1,

1928 in Batesville, Indiana to Everett and Emma Marie Heibeck Schein.

He was initiated an Entered Apprentice March 3, 1949, passed to Fellowcraft May, 1949, and raised a Mater Mason June 4, 1949. On February 25, 1978, Marvin was exalted to the Holy Royal Arch and served as the Excellent High Priest of Pocatello Chapter No. 6, 1984-85.

He joined the Cryptic Rite in Bannock Council No. 2, Royal and Select Masters on March 14, 1978 serving as Illustrious Master 1985-1986. He was dubbed and created a Knight of the Temple on November 6, 1978, and served as Commander of Gate City Commandery No. 4 in 1982.

Sir Knight Schein was appointed to the Grand Commandery line in 1982 and served as the Grand Commander in 1989.

He was a member of the Order of the High Priesthood, Thrice Illustrious Masters, and recipient of the Knight of the York Cross of Honour in Idaho Priory No. 13 and held the 1st Quadrant of the Grand Cross of Honour. Marvin was also a member of the Ancient Arabic Order Noble of the Mystic Shrine El Korah Temple and the Red Cross of Constantine. He was a member of Central Christian Church, Pocatello, Idaho, and served on the General Church Executive Board.

Brother, Companion, and Sir Knight Marvin E Schein was called by his Maker on November 5, 2003, in Pocatello, Idaho. An Honor Guard of Templars of Gate City Commandery No. 4 paid tribute.

QUENTIN R. VAUGHN

Brother, Companion, and Sir Knight Quentin R. Vaughn was born on August 18, 1923, to William C. and Ada Martin Vaughn at Rose Lake, Idaho. The family moved to Lewiston in 1928, and Quentin graduated from Clarkston High School in 1941.

Quentin joined the Army Air Corps in 1941 and served until December 1945; and again joined the Air Force during the Korean War. On December 30, 1945, Quentin married Verna Madson. Quentin continued his education attending Washington State University, where he earned a Masters Degree in Economics. He bought his insurance office, Vaughn Insurance Agency, in 1966 and worked there until his retirement in 1990.

Quentin petitioned Robert Newell Lodge No. 96 in Lewiston in 1967. He was initiated an Entered Apprentice Mason on November 24, 1967; passed to the degree of Fellowcraft Mason on January 26, 1968; and raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason on Aril 27, 1968. Robert Newell Lodge No. 96 merged with Nez Perce Lodge No. 10 in 1975. Quentin served as Master of his lodge; Associate Guardian of Bethel No. 53, International Order of Job's Daughters; and Dad of Rainbow Girls of Lewiston. Quentin was active in the Order of Eastern Star, serving as Worthy Patron of Laurel Chapter No. 13 seven (7) times, and as Worthy Grand Patron of Idaho in 1985-1986.

Quentin joined the York Rite Bodies of Lewiston. He was Exalted to the Holy Royal Arch; Greeted into the Cryptic Rite; and was dubbed and created a Knight of the Temple in Lewiston Commandery No. 2 all on May 5, 1979. He served as High Priest of Lewiston Chapter No. 4 in 1985-1986; Illustrious Master of Moscow Council No. 6 in 1987-1988; and Eminent Commander of Lewiston Commandery No. 2 in

1992-1993. He was a member of Idaho Priory No. 13, Knights of the York Cross of Honour serving as Eminent Prior in 1995. Quentin was Coroneted Honorary Inspector General 33rd Degree, Valley of Lewiston, Ancient Accepted Scottish Rite. He was also a member of the Ancient Arabic Order Nobles of the Mystic Shrine, Calam Shrine and served as a Greeter.

Quentin served the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Idaho as its Grand High Priest in 1997-1998 earning his 1st Quadrant of the York Grand Cross of Honour.

He was called to be with his maker on March 26, 2004

REPORT OF THE JOINT COMMITTEE ON AUDIT

To the Most Excellent Grand High Priest; Officers and Companions of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons in Idaho; the Most Illustrious Grand Master,

Officers and Companions of the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons in Idaho; and the Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers and Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar in Idaho:

We have reviewed the Ledgers, Balance Sheets, Savings Account Balances, Checking Accounts, Receipts and Disbursements for the 2003-2004 Grand York Rite Year as presented by the Grand Secretary-Recorder/Treasurer and beg to report the following:

- All of the books, ledgers and statements were found to be in complete order and the financial picture presented can be verified.
- We recommend the Grand York Rite Bodies enact Legislation changing the name of the Audit Committee to the Joint Committee on Financial Review. Audit has a legal connotation and we do not perform an audit nor is anyone connected with the committee qualified to perform an audit. An audit by a fully qualified Accounting Firm would be cost prohibitive to perform.
- We, therefore, recommend a thorough Financial Review be conducted every other year or every three years by an independent financial consultant.

We have also reviewed the balance sheets and accompanying records for the York Rite Investment Accounts, The York Rite Endowment Fund and the York Rite Objectives Account. After a minor adjustment in the York Rite Objectives Account for a late return of Interest, the Accounts appear to be regular and the balances can be verified.

We wish to commend the Grand Secretary/Recorder/Treasurer for his efforts. We also wish to acknowledge our Most Distinguished Companion and Sir Knight Kent W. Gist for his untiring effort toward making these organizations solvent and in securing the best rate of return currently available under our legislation.

Well done good and faithful servants!

REPORT OF THE JOINT COMMITTEE ON FINANCE

To the Most Excellent Grand High Priest; Officers and Companions of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons in Idaho;

To the Most Illustrious Grand Master, Officers and Companions of the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons in Idaho; and

To the Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers and Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar in Idaho:

We your Joint Committee on Finance wish to report the Finances of these Grand York Rite Bodies are in moderate health but could be better.

This Joint Committee has met when necessary from tie to time throughout the past Grand York Rite Year and these meetings have continued into this year. Accompanying this report are the budgets for the Grand York Rite year.

These budgets require supplementation from the General Fund balance. These funds are available and can continue the supplementation of expenses for approximately eight (8) years before depleting them. It becomes a mater of recognition of the problems to come a "Pay me now or Pay me later proposition!" We have recognized a need and our duty not to totally deplete the surplus of funds. In order to partially resolve the mater in consideration, the following recommendations are made.

For the 2004-2005 Grand York Rite Year we propose the Per Capita Tax per member be set as follows: Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons \$9.00, Grand Councils of Cryptic Masons \$9.00; Grand Commandery of Knights Templar \$13.00. This is an increase of \$1.00 per member for the Grand Chapter and \$1.50 for Grand Commandery; however the Grand Council remains the same per member.

The Committee has also reviewed the Books for the York Rite Prepaid Life Investment Fund and the York Rite Objectives Account and finds them to be orderly.

In addition to the budgets we propose the following actions be entertained by the Grand Bodies to promote fiscal health and harmony.

- Prepare a financial plan for a three to five (3-5) year period.
- Place an upper limit on the total value of each bodies checking account
- Change the By Laws and Regulations of the Grand Bodies to allow for expanding investment into Government Recognized not just Government Insured Securities.
- We recommend the Savings Accounts and Certificates of Deposit be required to have two signatures for withdrawal of funds. (Head of Body, Grand Secretary -Recorder/Treasurer and Head of Finance Committee on Signatures on Signature Cards).
- In order to protect the Grand Secretary-Recorder/Treasurer and the Grand York Rite Bodies, the position should be a bonded position. This may require liability insurance with a Bond Rider. The Grand Bodies would be responsible for the cost of the bond.
- We recommend the Grand Bodies form a task force to review the York Rite Endowment Fund and the York Rite Objectives Account and report back to these Grand Bodies recommendations for Operational Directives and Guidelines to provide direction to the Finance Committee.
- We recommend this guideline: Limit to no more than 90% of the available York Rite Objectives Account interest as prorated for use by the respective bodies in any year. This way we continue to build on the Principal in the York Rite Endowment Fund insuring its growth into the future.

Commence their era with the creation of the world, calling it Anno Lucia (A.L.) "in the year of light."

Royal Arch Masons

Date from the year the second temple was commenced by Zerubbabel, Anno Inventionis (A.I.), "in the year of discovery."

Order of the High Priesthood

Date from the year of blessing of Abram by the High Priest Melchizedek, Anno Benefacio (A.B.), "in the year of the blessing."

Cryptic Masons

Date from the year in which the Temple of Solomon was completed, Anno Depositionis (A.Dep.), "in the year of deposit."

Knights Templar

Commence their era with the organization of their Order, Anno Ordinia (A.O.), "in the year of the Order."

Scottish Rite

Same as Ancient Craft, except the Jewish Chronology is used, Anno Mundi (A.M.), "in the year of the world."

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RULES FOR MASONIC DATES

Ancient Craft Masons
Add 4000 years to common erathus 2000 and 4000 = 6000
Royal Arch Masons
Add 530 years to common erathus 2000 and 530 = 2530
Order of the High Priesthood
Add 1913 years to common erathus 2000 and 1913 = 3913
Cryptic Masons
Add 1000 years to the common erathus 2000 and 1000 = 3000
Knights Templar
From the Christian era take 1118thus 1118 from 2000 = 972
Scottish Rite
Add 3760 years to common erathus 2000 and $3760 = 5750$

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
