

The first order of business was approval of the minutes of the preceding Grand York Rite Sessions. Minutes were approved as printed in the Proceedings.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON FINANCIAL REVIEW

To the M.E. Grand High Priest, M.I. Grand Master, and R.E. Grand Commander of the Grand York Rite Bodies of Idaho:

We, the undersigned, your committee on financial review report to the combined YORK RITE BODIES, we have conducted a Financial Review of the consolidated balance sheets, statements, receipts, and documents of the separate bodies. The Balance sheets, statements, receipts and documents for the Grand York Rite year ending December 31, 2004 were reviewed for accuracy and regularity. This committee wishes to report the ledgers, balance sheets and documents appear to be regular and in order. The prepaid life membership fund and York Rite Objectives account balance sheets were also examined and found to be in order. Some Chapters, Council's and Commandery's continue to be late in filing the monthly reports. That not only results in the Grand Secretary/Recorder being late in providing information to this and other committees, but also results in this committee being late in submitting its annual report. Companions and Sir Knights we encourage all the constituent Secretary/Recorders to be timely in filing the monthly reports.

We wish to commend the Grand Secretary/Recorder/Treasurer for a job well done in accurately maintaining the Grand York Rite ledgers, balance sheets and documents.

PRELIMINARY REPORT OF THE JOINT COMMITTEE ON FINANCE

To Most Excellent Grand High Priest; Officers and Companions of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons in Idaho; Most Illustrious Grand Master, Officers and Companions of the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons in Idaho; Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers and Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar in Idaho:

We your Joint Committee on Finance wish to report the Finances of these Grand York Rite Bodies are in moderate health but could be better.

This Joint Committee has met when necessary from time to time throughout the past Grand York Rite Year and these meetings have continued into this year. Accompanying this Preliminary Report are proposed budgets for consideration by the delegates. Based upon the action of the delegates your Committee will have recommendations to be made at the Grand York Rite Sessions.

These proposed budgets require supplementation from the General Fund balance. These funds are available and we can continue to supplement the expenses for approximately eight (8) years before depleting them. It becomes a matter of "Pay me now, or Pay me later!" We recognize the need and also not to totally deplete the surplus. In order to partially take this matter into consideration, the following recommendations are made.

For the 2005-2006 Grand York Rite Year we propose the Per Capita Tax per member be set as follows: Grand Chapter \$9.00; Grand Council \$9.00; Grand Commandery \$13.00. This proposal is the same per member for all three bodies as last year. There are other sources of funding available and additional recommendations will be made at the Grand Sessions.

The Delegates will be considering a small volume of Legislation. If the Grand York Rite uses the same formula the Grand Lodge of Idaho AF & AM uses for determining the final cost of printing changes to the respective Code of Laws, it costs approximately \$100.00 per page/ Resolution. This Committee finds perfectly acceptable alternative means of completing this requirement exist.

Each year at our York Rite Grand Sessions in Idaho, we pause a moment to reflect on those of our Order who have laid down their working tools of the Fraternity. Their comfortable and familiar presence seems an overwhelm-

ing loss. Reflection, however, assures us they have passed through a hidden veil and are traveling upon that level of time from which no traveler returns, but where we can only imagine and thus we cherish their memory forever.

We are most happy that our Blessed Savior has left the lines of the Grand Bodies intact.

We mourn the loss of three distinguished Past Grand Officers who were called to Eternal Rest.

JAMES A DOWNS

Brother, Companion, and Sir Knight James A. Downs was born in American Falls, Idaho to Tom and Vella Downs. In early 1941 James was accepted for naval flight training and served the United States Navy in many duties and at several stations.

He began his Masonic years at Cassia Lodge No. 14 at Albion, Idaho, serving as Worshipful Master for two years. James joined the Honolulu Consistory of Scottish Rite Masons in 1948. In 1980 He joined the York Rite Bodies, Royal Arch Chapter No. 22 in Rupert, and served as the Excellent High Priest. James also belonged to Twin Falls No. 7 Cryptic Masons of Idaho and Twin Falls Commandery No. 10.

James served this Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons as its Most Excellent Grand High Priest, presiding in 1997.

CHESTER WILLIAM CURTIS

Brother, Companion, and Sir Knight Chester William Curtis was born September 25, 1912 on the family homestead near Clearwater, Idaho to Edward and Lena Loretta Curtis.

He married his high school sweetheart Thelma V. (Grove) Curtis on May 22, 1935. He was employed as a Highway Engineer with the United States Forest Service, retiring in 1973.

Chester was Raised a Master Mason on February 26, 1946 in Mount Idaho Lodge No. 9 AF & AM, Grangeville, Idaho, serving as Worshipful Master in 1953-1954 and was a Life Member. He was also a Life Member of Rathdrum Lodge No. 41, Rathdrum.

He was exalted to the Holy Royal Arch in Lewiston Chapter No. 4, in 1956, transferring to St. Maries Chapter No. 18 in 1966, and serving as Excellent High Priest in 1968. He later transferred to Yreka Chapter No. 20 at Kellogg. He was appointed to the Grand Chapter line in 1985 and served as Most Excellent Grand High Priest in 1993. He became a Charter member of Keystone Chapter No. 29 in 1993. He was a member of Emerald Council No. 8

Cryptic Masons and served as Illustrious Master in 1985.

Chester was dubbed and created a Knight Templar in 1964 in St. Omer Commandery No. 9, Missoula, Montana, affiliating with Coeur d' Alene Commandery No. 5 in March 1967, and served as Eminent Commander in 1980 and 1981. He was awarded the Knight Commander of the Temple award by the Grand Encampment Knights Templar, USA. He was a member and Past Prior of Idaho Priory No. 13, Knights of the York Cross of Honour, and a member of Redemption Tabernacle No. XL, Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests. Chester was a Past Sovereign of St. Patrick Conclave, Red Cross of Constantine.

He was instrumental in the formation of Grangeville Chapter Order of De-Molay and served as Chapter Dad for several years, receiving the award of Honorary Legion of Honour. He was also a member of Calam Temple, Ancient Arabic Order Nobles of the Mystic Shrine and a member of Coeur d'Alene Valley of the Scottish Rite, serving as Wise Master, Chapter of Rose Croix in 1974.

Chester was a Life member of Mountain Queen Chapter No. 11 Order of Eastern Star, Grangeville, Idaho, serving as its Worthy Patron in 1953. He was also a Life member of Clover Chapter No. 33, Rathdrum, serving as Worthy Patron numerous times. He served the Grand Chapter Order of Eastern Star as Worthy Grand Patron in 1982-1983.

Chester was called by his Father March 3, 2005.

GIFFORD RAMSFORD SHAFFER

Brother, Companion, and Sir Knight Gifford Ramsford Shaffer was born in Middleton, Idaho, on December 8, 1917.

He was Raised a Master Mason in Washoe Lodge No. 28 in Payette, Idaho, April 4, 1948 and served the Lodge as its Worshipful Master in 1954. He was the 1st Life Member in Washoe Lodge No. 28.

He was Exalted a member of the Holy Royal Arch in Payette Chapter No. 8 and served the Chapter as its Excellent High Priest. He was advanced to the degrees of Royal and Select Master and served as Illustrious Master of King Solomon Council No. 4.

He was dubbed and created a Knight Templar in Weiser Commandery No. 7, serving as Eminent Commander in 1967. He was a member and Past Prior of Idaho Priory No. 13, Knights of the York Cross of Honour and a Past Preceptor and Charter Member of Redemption Tabernacle No. XL, Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests.

He served the Grand Council of Idaho as the Most Illustrious Grand Master in 1961.

Gifford served the Grand Lodge AF & AM of Idaho as District Deputy Grand Master from 1956 to 1958 and as the Most Worshipful Grand Master in 1968. He also served as the Grand Lodge Secretary for a many years.

He was called by his Lord on March 7, 2005.





The Grand Council of Idaho and I, as Grand Illustrious Master, were represented at the Grand Sessions of Montana by David Grindle, Grand Recorder, Colorado by Arthur Busacker, Grand Captain of the Guard, and British Columbia by Anthony Such, Grand Chaplain. The Grand York Rite Bodies of Idaho continue to be financially sound.

All visitations were well attended, especially those that were held concurrently with the Grand Chapter or Grand Commandery. It was particularly heartening to find a solid group of dedicated Companions at work at each Council.

RECOMMENDATIONS

The most successful events, with the best participation and attendance, are those that involve more than one Council or more than one of our Grand Bodies. The Mini-fest at Hayden has been well attended. All three Grand Bodies have been there for their Official Visitations. Degree work has been a joint effort of several different lodges. Joint Visitations of more than one Grand Body seem to work out well. Special events such as the Table Council at Payette are also well attended. This year it was also the occasion for my Official Visitation and that of the Most Excellent Grand High Priest. I recommend that the practice of joint visitations, special events, and cooperative events between two or more Councils be encouraged.

To the Most Illustrious Grand Master, Officers, and Companions of the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons of Idaho:

Declining membership continues to be a challenge for the York Rite. We feel it is vital for every York Rite Mason to concentrate on solutions to this problem -- the most obvious of which is to increase our membership.

There are many initiatives in Idaho Masonry to help increase membership. They focus on recruitment, retention, and reinstatement of members. We must become involved in each of these three areas, not only in the York Rite but also in our Blue Lodges. We will have a better chance of increasing membership if membership is a topic of discussion at every meeting and if our members act rather than simply discuss the problem.

York Rite Masons must be active and visible in their local Blue Lodges. They must support and help their Blue Lodges' efforts to increase membership. They must market the fraternal and philanthropic benefits of York Rite Masonry and make those benefits known to any Mason who is not already a York Rite member.

York Rite Masons must work hard to keep current members active and involved in our organization. Besides a membership committee, each chapter, council, and commandery must have a mentoring program to educate and involve our members. To the Most Illustrious Grand Master, Officers, and Companions of the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons of Idaho:

We, your Committee on Jurisprudence, have examined the Report of the Most Illustrious Grand Master. We commend him for his dedication to the York Rite bodies of Idaho. Dispensation #1 to Emerald Council to change their "regular" August Assembly date and place is not approved. If it was a called Assembly, a dispensation is not necessary. If it was a stated Assembly, the date and place are established by the bylaws and the IGM cannot change them with a dispensation. This is the third consecutive year that Emerald Council #8 has requested a dispensation to move their August Assembly. Perhaps someone should look at their By-Laws.

We have carefully considered Resolutions C05-01 thru C05-03 and we

find as follows. C05-01 and C05-03 are in proper form and their adoption, as written, would not conflict with the Code of Laws and Regulations of the Grand Council. Resolution C05-02 has a minor mistake in the line that starts with THEREFORE. The words "Article II, Section 1" <u>could</u> be changed to read "Article IV, Section 2" by a "motion to amend" from the floor before its consideration. It would then not conflict with the Code of Laws and Regulations of the Grand Council. In brief, this resolution could be read, amended, and then considered.

ADDITIONAL REPORT OF THE JURISPRUDENCE COMMITTEE

To the Most Illustrious Grand Master, Officers, and Companions of the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons of Idaho:

The Jurisprudence Committee recommends legislation be prepared and presented at the 2006 Grand York Rite Sessions, to allow the three bodies to initiate and pass joint legislation. Each body is Sovereign; and each needs to enact its own enabling legislation establishing joint resolutions.

Article VII, Section 1(A) allows the Constitution to be amended by 2/3 of the members present; provided the Constituent Councils have been notified of proposed By Laws (changes) 60 days in advance.

The Resolution considered and passed by all three Grand York Rite bodies at the 2004 Grand Sessions intended for two day rotations for the sessions of the Grand York Rite Bodies. The legislation did not authorize presenting modification or voting upon changes to the By Laws, Constitution or Regulations of this Grand Body.

Therefore, your Jurisprudence Committee recommends the Grand Bodies Jurisprudence Committees prepare legislation to enable the enactment of Joint Legislative Authority at the 2006 Grand York Rite Session.

THEREFORE; Be it Resolved, Article IX, shall be amended as follows:

As it reads:

- Section 1. All Past Illustrious Masters of this jurisdiction, while they are members of any Constituent Council within this jurisdiction, and the Dais Officers (or their proxies) of every Constituent Council under the jurisdiction of this Grand Council are entitled to one vote each.
- Section 2. A companion holding a proxy may vote the proxy in addition to his own vote.
- Section 3. A companion holding a proxy of one or more of the officers of his Council must be a member of that Council or the proxy is invalid.
- Section 4. A regular officer of a council takes precedence over the proxy of a higher officer.



RECOMMENDATIONS

I recommend we support the Masonic Leadership Training Sessions. This would be something new for us. And even though these sessions are geared toward the Masonic Lodge, the lessons learned from them can easily be adapted to the Royal Arch and York Rite.

I recommend we develop our own version of the "Friend to Friend" program. This would be another way for us in the Royal Arch and York Rite to make contact with our Brothers in the Symbolic Lodge.

I recommend language be included in the Grand Chapter Code of Laws to deal with the issue of mergers of Constituent Chapters. This would help guide the Chapters involved through the process of merging.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF CUSTODIANS

To the Most Excellent Grand High Priest, Officers and members of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Idaho:

We, the board of custodians, in line with the directions of the Grand Chapter of 2004, have reviewed the ritual and how it conforms to the Code of Laws, Article XIX, Section 6, Paragraph b.

We see the need for an optional opening to conform to the six (6) man quorum allowed in the above code. We have therefore written an opening patterned after a sample we had from another jurisdiction, but using language from the "red" book that is the accepted form in Idaho. Since in the above code, the standard nine (9) man quorum is still provided for and is the preferred form, we see no reason to rewrite the entire ritual at this time.

We see the primary purpose of the six (6) man quorum as allowing the smaller Chapters who have trouble mustering out nine (9) Companions a chance to open and conduct essential business and not so much to confer the degrees.

It would be extremely difficult to confer the degrees with only six Companions and much of the meaning of the degrees would be lost. Also we can usually muster sufficient help from near by Chapters to confer the degrees.

We therefore respectfully move the adoption of this report and the attached six (6) man opening.

REPORT OF THE GRAND HISTORIAN

To the Grand High Priest, Officers, and Companions of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Idaho:

THE SYMBOLISM OF NUMBERS

In the high and far-off times, dignified men in turbans and robes, took a figure such as 7 or 9 and regarded it as mystic and tried to understand the meanings it might have in relation to life. Today men in tweeds are still pondering on the same subject.

They maintain that through centuries, through widely separate civilizations, a symbolism of numbers has persisted. They also talk learnedly of number vibrations, harmonies, the signs of the zodiac, of living up to the plane of a number, and of the science of numbers.

This is a field for the well read, but some of the simpler facts are interesting, whether you regard a number as meaningless in itself, as a sigh to conjure with, or as a clue to the understanding of the Universe. According to one of the students of numbers, there is practically always an ancient precedent for our current allusions to numbers.

When 23 skidoo was popular slang only a few years ago, how many Americans realized that they were harking back to old Egypt and the mysteries of the priests? Yet, the origin of the expression, it is claimed, can be found there. It seems that the Egyptian priesthood used a package of 78 cards, known as tarots, for divination. These tarots were more the forerunners of our modern playing cards. Some of their symbolism can still be found on playing cards. But the tarots were more than our deck of cards. They were like a book of occult philosophy, with each card a page of symbols and principles.

The public of Egypt was interested in the lore of the tarots no less than the priests. But, said the priests, if the laity can study all our source of

knowledge, they may divine events as well as we. So to protect their secrets 22 of the highest cards were withheld from the sight of the public. The 56 less important cards, beginning with the 23rd card of the deck, were available for ones use. From this situation in Egypt, 23 came to suggest something outside of the sacred mystery, hence not of any importance.

Egypt may or may not be originally responsible for the idea of thirteen being unlucky, but on the 13th tarot of the pack was the picture of a skeleton with the number 13 below it. This was the number of death, regeneration, and change. Later, 13 was associated with the tragic story of the last supper, where Christ and his 12 disciples sat down together.

One writer, who believes that individuals vibrate to numbers, states that 13 is not unlucky if you can live up to its high plane, but that it is difficult to vibrate to 13. This may lift a weight from some of the superstitiously inclined who regard 13 as inevitably fatal.

Number 4 always has been taken to suggest the material, while 3 is the number of divinity, according to number lore. Some of the best examples of this symbolism are found in the book of Revelations in the Bible. All through this book numbers are used in code fashion. "4 corners of the earth" take in everything in the material world. The 4 living creatures around the throne represent the entire world of living things. 3 suggests the Trinity and when 3 and 4 are multiplied you have 12. Speaking of the number 12, one writer states here you arrive at the idea of a creation into which God has entered. You have something that has been secular, but has become spiritual. Thus you have 12 tribes of a chosen Israel, the 12 apostles, the 12 stars around the head of the eternal woman, the 12 furlongs every way, and 12 by 12 cubits high, while the number redeemed is 12 by 12,000 led by twice 12 elders.

The idea of spiritual things being connected with the number 3 has been applied to fairy stories. Study of the Arabian Nights and the old fairy will reveal a great deal if intended symbolism. There are always 3 sons in the fairy tale. The youngest son is always the smartest. He outwits the other two and they never understand how. These 3 sons can be replaced symbolically by the body, mind and spirit. The youngest son represents the spiritual which is the last side of the man to develop. The hour of midnight is always the critical time in the stories and this idea is held because midnight ends the cycle of day and night. After that, come the changes brought by a new day. These are only two of the examples of number symbolism which is found in fairy tales.

In everyday life, too, the symbolism of numbers bobs up to intrigue the student. What could be more familiar to us in modern business affairs than the decimal system? One writer studying the Revelations, finds evidence that even centuries ago ten was a peculiarly secular digit. The Tribes that broke away from Jerusalem were 10. A beast with 10 horns is dependent on

secular force. And an army of 200,000 is again an unconsecrated army quite different from the redeemed army reckoned by 12. The raising of tens into millions indicated how immense was the army.

Material minded folk would say that different numbers were used symbolically in certain ways at first by choice, and that they came to stand for definite ideas. The occultist says, there us a law of numbers, the secret of which is in themselves. It is a deep and mysterious subject.

These random glimpses only show vaguely how modern experience is built up on an enormous network of allusions and ideas out of the dim past. Whether the symbolism of numbers is outworn or whether it is more vital than ever, it persists to perplex and fascinate the descendants of the magi.

REPORT OF THE JURISPRUDENCE COMMITTEE

To the Most Excellent Grand High Priest, Officers, and Members of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Idaho:

We, your Committee on Jurisprudence, have examined the report of the Most Excellent Grand High Priest. We commend him on his attention to detail and his desire to provide leadership training for the Companions of this Grand Chapter. We concur with his approval of all By-Law changes.

We approve of his granting of Dispensations #1 through #6.

We carefully considered all Resolutions presented for consideration at this Grand Convocation and are in proper form unless proponent's desire to rewrite them or withdraw them. Their adoption would not conflict with the Code of Laws and Regulations of this Grand Chapter.

The following are this Committee's comments on the Resolutions:

Resolution R05-01 Requires approval by 2/3 of the Chartered Chapters

This Resolution will do away with the sovereignty of the constituent Chapters and will replace it with whoever can produce the greater number of voting members at the Annual Grand Session. While regulations and bylaws of the Grand Chapter can and are easily changed at Grand Session, the Constitution of the Grand Chapter should not be changed on the whim of a few individuals but should be changed only when the full consequences of the action is considered. While this resolution is in form, it should not be adopted by the members of this Grand Chapter due to its potentially far reaching results. The Constitution should not be changed to make things easier, but only to make things better for all the members of the Grand Chapter, including the constituent chapters.

Resolution R05-02 **Requires majority of delegates present to pass** This resolution should be adopted to free the Grand Chapter to elect the best candidates to the top three offices. Times have changed and with the shrinking numbers to draw from, the best candidates may, on occasion, be from the same constituent Chapter. It is, therefore, the best choice to elect those Companions to these offices. This resolution should be adopted as it has a direct benefit to the Grand Chapter of Idaho.

Resolution R05-03 **Requires majority of delegates present to pass** This resolution cleans up a poor past practice when changes were occurring to the constituent Chapters on a monthly basis. With the decrease in numbers of members, many Chapters do not have changes in their rosters for months at a time. This resolution should be adopted as it has a direct benefit to the constituent Chapters and the Grand Chapter of Idaho.

Resolution R05-04 Requires approval by 2/3 of the Chartered Chapters

This resolution would increase the membership inequity between the larger Chapters and the smaller Chapters, by reducing the overall number of potential votes available to the smaller Chapters. Smaller Chapters often have to recycle their officers and many times do not have the number of Past Presiding Officers available to attend Grand Chapter. The Proxy system is one way to provide smaller Chapters with adequate representation to Grand Chapter. In addition, the claim by this resolution that the purpose of the proxy vote is to stimulate attendance is false. If a Chapter Dias officer attends Grand Chapter, he already has his vote and does not need a proxy. It is for those Chapters whose Dias Officers cannot attend Grand Chapter to allow an equalization of representation between the larger Chapters and the Smaller Chapters. It is recommended that this resolution be defeated as it does not benefit the Grand Chapter of Idaho

Resolution R05-05 **Requires majority of delegates present to pass** This is a companion resolution to Resolution R05-04. This resolution reduces the representation to the smaller Chapters and concentrates the

power in the larger Chapters. This resolution should be defeated as it does not benefit the Grand Chapter of Idaho. In addition this resolution falsely portrays the purpose of the proxy vote. Its sole purpose is to provide equalization for representation between the larger Chapters and the smaller Chapters. It has nothing to do with attendance of members at Grand Chapter as is claimed.

To the Most Excellent Grand High Priest, Officers, and Members of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Idaho:

We, your Resolutions Committee, present the following Resolutions for your consideration:

R05-01

RESOLUTION TO AMEND THE CONSTITUTION OF THE GRAND CHAPTER OF ROYAL ARCH MASONS OF IDAHO

(Requires approval by 2/3 of the Chartered Chapters)

ARTICLE VII, AMENDMENTS

SECTION 1.

WHEREAS, the method of amending the Constitutions of the three Grand York Rite Bodies are not consistent, and

WHEREAS, the current method for amending the Constitution of the Grand Chapter makes it nearly impossible to change the constitution because many Constituent Chapters have extreme difficulty of obtaining a quorum to hold a meeting;

THEREFORE, Be it resolved, Article VII, Section 1, shall be amended as follows:

As it reads:

Section 1. This Constitution may be amended only in the following manner: The proposed amendment shall be presented in writing at an Annual Convocation of the Grand Chapter and read aloud.

It shall be printed in the Proceedings and referred to all chartered Chapters in this Jurisdiction by the Grand Secretary/ Treasurer. When referred, it shall be read aloud in each Chapter by the High Priest at three Stated Convocations. Following the third reading, the High Priest shall put the question clearly: "Shall the amendment as read pass"? A "Yea" and "Nay" vote shall then be taken. If a majority is favorable, the Chapter concurs. The Secretary shall carefully record an explicit account of all proceedings relating to the proposed amendment, and as soon as possible thereafter transmit a certified copy thereof to the Most Excellent Grand High Priest, signed by the High Priest and attested by himself under seal of the Chapter. When two thirds of all Chartered Chapters have concurred in the proposed amendment as referred to them, the Most Excellent Grand High Priest shall immediately promulgate the same as part of this Constitution.

As amended:

This Constitution may be amended only in the following manner: The proposed amendment shall be presented in writing to the Grand Secretary one-hundred-twenty days prior to the Annual Convocation of the Grand Chapter and signed by three Companions of separate Constituent Chapters. The Constituent Chapters shall be apprised in writing of the proposed amendment sixty days before the Annual Convocation. At the Annual Convocation of this Grand Chapter, the proposed amendment may be adopted by a two-thirds "Yea" vote of the Constituent Chartered Chapters present (One Chapter-One Vote).

RESOLUTION TO AMEND ARTICLE XI, Section 7

Election, Appointment and Installation of Grand Chapter Officers (Requires majority of delegates present to pass)

WHEREAS: the methods of selecting and electing Grand Chapter Officers are not consistent, and

WHEREAS, the current restriction in *Section 7* requiring the Grand High Priest, Grand King and Grand Scribe be elected from different Constituent Chapters, never contemplated Grand Chapter Appointed Officers would drop out by death or other reasons, and

WHEREAS, disruption of Grand Chapter Officers' lines is contrary to harmonious continuum within the ranks when this occurs, and

WHEREAS, the location and the Chapter of membership has nothing to do with the ability of sound leadership, ability to govern and ability to conduct the business of this Grand Chapter; and

WHEREAS, non-membership in the same Chapter should not be a restricting factor in electing willing and able Grand Chapter Officers who were appointed and quickly advanced because of members dropping out of sequence,

THEREFORE, Be it Resolved, Article XI, Section 7, shall be amended as follows:

As it reads:

Section 7. No companion shall be elected to any office in the Grand Chapter who has not been elected to the office of *High Priest*, and installed and presided over a Constituent Chapter of this Jurisdiction. The *Grand High Priest*, *Grand King and Grand Scribe shall be* elected from different Constituent Chapters. NOTE: See ARTICLE II, Section 2.

As Amended:

Section 7. No companion shall be elected to any office in the Grand Chapter who has not been elected to the office of *High Priest*, and installed and presided over a Constituent Chapter of this Jurisdiction. No more than Two (2) of the following: The *Grand High Priest*, *Grand King and Grand Scribe* may be elected from the same Constituent Chapter. NOTE: See ARTICLE II, Section 2.

WHEREAS the Section subtitle is confusing and the Form contains only Membership Information, and

WHEREAS most chapters do not experience changes in membership on a monthly basis making most Chapter "Monthly Returns" redundant and therefore a waste of time, and

WHEREAS the same level of information currently can be achieved when membership changes are reported as they occur; and

WHEREAS there is no need to assess Constituent Chapter to encourage them to submit membership information;

THEREFORE, be it resolved that ARTICLE XXIV, SECTION 2 be changed as follows:

As it reads:

Section 2. The Secretary shall:

- a. Receive all moneys paid into the Chapter and pay the same over to the Treasurer or deposit the monies in the Chapter General Account and insure that the Treasurer receives the deposit slip.
- b. Keep a record of all things proper to be written, and prepare all reports and returns required by this Code of Laws.
- c. Answer communications from any recognized Masonic bodies concerning the standing of a member of the Chapter.
- d. As soon as possible, following the death of a member of the Chapter, advise the Grand Chaplain as to:
 - (1). Name of the Deceased Companion.
 - (2). Date and place of death.
- (3). A resume of the deceased Companion's Capitular history.
 - (4). Name and mailing address of next of kin.

- e. (1) Monthly Returns Whether any Convocations are held or not, a monthly return of the Chapter membership statistics for the previous month shall be filed in the office of the Grand Secretary on forms furnished by him. The monthly report shall contain the information required on the form, and shall be filed electronically or postmarked before the 10th day of the following month.
 - (2) Monthly Returns not filed electronically or postmarked by the 10th day of the mouth are delinquent. Notice of delinquency shall be required, and an assessment of \$1.00 per day shall be paid for each day said report remains delinquent and shall be remitted to the Grand Secretary.

As Amended:

Section 2. The Secretary shall:

- a. Receive all moneys paid into the Chapter and pay the same over to the Treasurer or deposit the monies in the Chapter General Account and insure that the Treasurer receives the deposit slip.
- Keep a record of all things proper to be written, and prepare all reports and returns required by this Code of Laws.

James G. Cox was born February 21, 1943 in Muncie, Indiana, the second of 5 children of J. Glenn Cox and Elinor L. (McGlynn) Cox. - 3. **C. of H.:** By three times three, under a living arch and over a triangle.
- 4. **H. P.:** Why in that manner?
- 5. **C. of H.:** Because in that manner only can the principal secret of this degree be communicated.
- 6. **H. P.:** What makes you a Royal Arch Mason?
- 7. **C. of H.:** My Obligation.
- 8. **H. P.:** Where were you made a Royal Arch Mason?
- 9. **C. of H.:** In a legally constituted Chapter of Royal Arch Masons, assembled in a place representing the Tabernacle erected by our ancient brethren near the ruins of King Solomon's Temple.
- 10. **H. P.:** How many constitute a Chapter of Royal Arch Masons?
- 11. **C. of H.:** Six or more.
- 12. **H. P.:** When composed of nine, who are they?
- C. of H.: The High Priest, King, Scribe, Captain of the Host, Principal Sojourner, Royal Arch Captain, and the three Masters of the Veils.
- 14. **H. P.:** Companion Captain of the Host, you will assemble the Companions around the Altar to assist me in opening ______ Chapter, No. _____, Royal Arch Masons.
- 15. **C. of H.:** *** Companions, you will assemble around the Altar to assist the High Priest in opening _____ Chapter, No. ____, Royal Arch Masons.

(The Companions assemble in a circle around the Altar with the Captain of the Host on the right and the Principal Sojourner on the left leaving a space for the High Priest in the center)

16. **C. of H.:** Excellent High Priest, your orders have been executed.

(The High Priest descends and fill the space in the East.)

1. H. P.: Companions, you will join hands. Supreme High Priest of

Heaven and Earth, we humbly beseech thy blessing upon the purposes of our present assembly. Grant us wisdom to contrive, strength to support and the beauty of harmony to so administer the affairs of this Chapter that all our doings may be acceptable in thy site. Amen.

2. **Response:** So mote it be.

(The High Priest may lead in the usual prayer as above, or the Lords Prayer may be used with all joining in. Do not balance at end of prayer.)

(The P. S. displays the Great Lights as in the Master Mason Degree. The R. A. C. goes to the door, gives ***_***_*, answered by the Sentinel, R. A. C. opens the door, informs the Sentinel, closes the door and returns to his station.)

8. **H. P.:** Companions, join with me in the Pledge to our Flag. (*Done.*)

- 1. **H. P.:** * Companion Royal Arch Captain, you will see that the outer courts of the Tabernacle are duly guarded, and inform the Sentinel that I am about to close _____ Chapter, No. ____, Royal Arch Masons, and direct him to guard accordingly.
 - (R. A. C. goes to the door, gives ***_***_*, answered by Sentinel, opens the door and informs him, closes the door and returns to his station.)
- 2. **R. A. C.:** (Salutes) Excellent High Priest, the outer courts of the Tabernacle are duly guarded.
- 3. **H. P.:** *** (Recites)



STATE OF THE ORDER

My fraters, the next two sections of this report have caused me a great deal of trouble trying to figure out how to say what must be said and yet not make it sound as though I don't care. Nothing could be further from the truth and I hope that my friends know that I have no intention of ignoring the responsibility that I have in this process.

The State of the Order in Idaho is one of continuing decline and, I am sorry to say, I was not able to make any changes that would lead to its

improvement. We have one Commandery that should no longer hold a Charter and four others that survive only with the help of other Commanderies. However, we also have one Commandery that has brought itself out of a state of virtual collapse to one of being healthy again and the other two Commanderies are healthy, active and continue to perform their full function. Please refer to my recommendations below.

Sir Knights, the fact that Coeur d'Alene Commandery #5 was able to bring itself out of virtual non-existence to one of being active again shows us all that there is nothing wrong with Templary, but with the way most of us approach our work and the way we view what we are doing and how we are doing it. I salute the officers and members of Coeur d'Alene Commandery #5 for a fine job and strongly urge them to continue the fine work. They have been an example for the other Commanderies of this State and have shown us all that we can make Templary strong again if we just work at it. They are also a shining light to the five struggling Commanderies, most of which operate in larger populations than North Idaho, and show them that there is a way that they can recover if only they are willing to work hard and stick to their guns.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1) That Salmon Commandery #9 should be placed on probationary status and if they are unable to form a quorum within a reasonable period their Charter be arrested. This is not to say that I believe that Salmon cannot be made a viable Commandery again, to the contrary, Coeur d'Alene has shown that it CAN be done.
- 2) That Gate City Commandery #4 and Idaho Falls Commandery #6 both be placed on a "watch" status. If these Commanderies are unable to form a quorum without having to use members from adjacent Commanderies, that they be placed on probationary status and cautioned that the next step may be one of more serious action. Once again, this is not intended to be a punitive action, but one of informing these Commanderies that they need to get to work within their respective Commanderies and also get themselves active within their Blue Lodges to recruit new York Rite members from the Blue Lodge and to help promote membership drives within the Blue Lodges.
- 3) That Lewiston Commandery #2 and Moscow Commandery #3 be cautioned that they must get themselves active in finding new members so that they may each begin to build their respective Commanderies to the level that they are not dependent on each other. I commend these Commanderies for finding innovative solutions to what can be a tough problem, but remind them that the solution they have found is only temporary at best.
- 4) That Twin Falls Commandery #10 and Idaho Commandery #1 be commended for keeping their Commanderies active and trained to a point where they can continue to perform their work in full form and from

memory. I will remind them as well that this does not continue on without the full support of all Sir Knights within their Commanderies and that they must continue to work hard at maintaining this proficiency. It doesn't happen by accident, only by hard work.
