

PRELIMINARY REPORT OF THE JOINT COMMITTEE ON FINANCE

To The Most Excellent Grand High Priest and Companions of the Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons Of Idaho; The Most Illustrious Grand Master and Companions of the Grand Council Cryptic Masons of Idaho; and the Right Eminent Grand Commander and Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Idaho:

We your Joint Committee on Finance beg to report the costs of operating your Grand York Rite Bodies like other businesses is continuing to escalate due to inflation and the increased cost of goods associated with the ability to offer a sustained service at a level you have grown accustom too.

We herewith submit our recommendation and proposal for each Grand York Rite Body, respectively. We recommend a Preliminary Budget for the Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons of Idaho of \$7,290 or \$9.50 Per Capita per member; for the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons of Idaho we recommend a Preliminary Budget of \$6,275 or \$9.50 Per Capita per member; and for the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Idaho we recommend a Preliminary Budget of \$11, 495 or \$16.00 Per Capita per member.

The proposed increases in Grand Chapter and Grand Council would allow these Grand Bodies to continue to provide the high level of service the Grand Bodies have grown to enjoy, as well as to keep pace with inflation; while the increase in Grand Commandery is designed to position this Grand Body to survive the proposed Grand Encampment Per Capita increase to \$10.00 per member.

We thank you for the continued opportunity to serve the Grand York Rite Bodies of Idaho.

REPORT OF THE GRAND HISTORIAN

To the Most Excellent Grand High Priest, Officers and Companions of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Idaho: The subject of this report was written by Brother and Companion A. F. Anderson, Mountain Home Chapter #24, RAM, Grand High Priest, 1936-1937

THE LOST WORD

The mythical history of Freemasonry informs us that there once existed a WORD of surpassing value, and claiming a profound veneration; that this word was known to but few; that it was at length lost; and that a temporary substitute for it was adopted. But as the very philosophy of Masonry teaches us that there can be no death with out resurrection – no decay without a subsequent restoration—on the same principal it follows that the loss of the Word must suppose its eventual recovery.

Much has been written about the "Masons Word" as employed in old days, when brethren were sometimes made Masons by having that secret term entrusted to them; research has failed to show what this word was through scholars believe it to have been that sovereign name which stands at the center of the Holy Royal Arch. Some who hold to this last named theory would have us believe that this transfer of the word from the Blue Lodge to the Royal Arch degree was so disastrous to the symbolic structure of the Blue Lodge, to up the damage, a substitute word was devised to take its place until the candidate passed on to the higher grade. But there is little or no evidence to prove that the great word of the Royal Arch is the same as the Masonic word of the old lodges, that theory must be left suspended in the middle air of conjecture.

I cannot believe that the Blue Lodge system was ever rifled of its chiefest treasure to grace the forehead of a higher grade, nor can I see why we should think that the 3rd degree, just as it is, has lost the key to its mystery.

The search for a lost word is not the search for a mere vocable of a few letters which one might write down on a piece of paper, it is the seeking for a truth, a secret of life, and that secret truth is so clearly set forth in the Hiram Abiff drama that one is led to wonder why anybody should suppose that it had ever been lost. The lost word does not refer so it seems to me, to any term once in possession of the 3rd degree and accidentally lost, but rather it denotes the ancient Tetragrammaton, or four lettered name, for which search has been made these two and a half millenniums.

According to a very old tradition the legend of the Tetragrammaton goes back to ancient Israel as far as the time of the exile. Like all people of that day, the Jews saw in a person's name not a mere handy cognomen whereby a man might be addressed, but a kind of sign standing for personality of the one who bore it. Jacob was Jacob because he actually had been a supplanter, as that name means; and he later became Israel because he was a prince of God. Jacob's name was a revelation of his character. So, was it with all

names. Therefore, was it that the ancients held proper names it a reverence difficult for us to understand.

Bearing this in mind, we can understand why the Jews throw about the name of Deity the wrappings of secrecy and sanctity. At first, after the dread secret had been imparted to Moses, the people pronounced the name in whispers or not at all. They were bidden never to use it except on the most solemn occasions as witness the 3rd Commandment which reads, when literally translated "Thou shalt not utter the name of thy God idly". As time went on the priests forbad them to do more than hint at it, one of the priestly commands in Leviticus reading, "He that pronounces the name of the Lord distinctly, shall be put to death" At least, only the High Priest was permitted to utter the name at all, and then on some great occasion, such as the Day of Atonement.

At the same time, it must be remembered, the Jews were using no vowels in their writing; for some strange reason only the consonants were ever written or printed; therefore only the four consonants, JHVH, were even seen.

When the Jews were taken in to exile, all trace of the true pronunciation was lost, either because the High Priest was killed before he could impart it, or died in Babylon before a successor entitled to the secret could be found. Consequently, the Exile was no sooner ended than priests and scribes began their search for the lost name.

The four consonants only did they have; what the vowels were nobody could learn, nor has anybody since discovered.

This Tetragrammaton became a storm center of theology and around it a great mass of symbolism gradually accumulated. So deeply did it sink into the imagination of Israel that the later Jewish theosophists who built up the speculative system which we call the KABBALA made it the very core of their teaching; and through the Kabbala, the literature of which was so popular even so late as reformation times, the legend of the Lost name made its way into the thought and literature of medieval Europe.

But that form of the legend did not always remain the same; now it is a despoiled sanctuary; now a sacramental mystery; now the abandonment of a great military and religious order; now the age-long frustration of the greatest building plan which was ever conceived; now the lost word of Kabbalism; now the vacancy of the most holy of all sanctuaries!! Whatever the disguise, the quest was always the same, a search for something strangely precious which man believes had been lost out of the world but might be found again.

This wonderful symbolic idea still retains its power to cast a spell over us, as witness its use by modern writers. Eugene Sue incorporated it in his haunted tale, "The Wandering Jew". Tennyson wove it into his Arthur epic, where it was assumed the form of the search for the Lost Grail, the cup used

by the Lord at his last Supper. Henry Van Dyke has embodied it in his book of stories, "The Blue Flower," and Maurice Maeterlinck has woven about it a strangely beautiful dream, "The Blue Bird". Shall we not add to this list the drama of the Third degree? Surely, "that which was lost" can refer to nothing else, as the evidence, both internal and external, does so abundantly seem to show. If that indeed be the case how it does light up with prophetic meaning the whole mystery of the Third degree. For it shows that the candidate is on no hunt for a mystic term to be used like a magic spell, still less is it some mysterious individual that he seeks.

That for which he really searches, is to discover the Divine in himself and in the world.

Going out to find God, we need not wonder when he finds no one word, or one thing, to reward his labors; nor need we be disappointed if he is put off with a substitute, for though his search is not fruitless, it is not altogether successful, as is fitting when we recall that the complete unveiling of God can not come to any one man in any one lifetime.

That hope must ever remain an ideal to us humans in the shadows of our earth life – a flying ideal, eluding us while it beckons us, leading us over the hills of Time into the tireless searching's of Eternity.



K06-01

RESOLUTION TO AMEND THE BY-LAWS OF THE GRAND COMMANDERY OF KNIGHTS TEMPLAR OF IDAHO

ARTICLE XIII, Section 133a.

Whereas: The Grand Commandery of Idaho shall have exclusive control and government of this jurisdiction; and shall have the power and authority to enact such laws and regulations as may be necessary for the government of Templar Masonry; and to change and amend the same when occasion may require; and

Whereas: This Code of Laws of the Grand Commandery of Idaho was Amended by proper action taken at the 101st Annual Conclave; and

Whereas: The Sir Knights at the 101st Annual Conclave voted and determined it to be prudentially expedient to hold <u>Joint Grand York Rite</u> Sessions, with a combined opening by all three Grand York Rite Bodies; and

Whereas: The Sir Knights intent was to hold a combined <u>Joint York Rite</u> <u>Business Session of the Combined Grand York Rite Bodies, specifically for the Conduct of a Public Grand Opening and Reception of Distinguished Guests; and also Conduct of Business of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar in Joint Session with the Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons and the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons of Idaho; and</u>

Whereas: It being further recognized it is expedient to conduct a Joint Grand York Rite Opening Session with Joint Reception of Distinguished Guest, followed by a Joint Grand York Rite Business Session for Reception of Reports of Joint Committees and other Joint Business in common. Recognizing each Grand York Rite body will each in turn be in full charge of Joint successive Sessions according to the normally recommended schedule of the Time and Place Committee (a Joint Committee); and

Whereas: It is necessary to formalize the intent of the Sir Knights as adopted in the 101st Annual Conclave;

Now Therefore: In order to ensure the general good of Chivalric Masonry; <u>Article XIII, Section 133a</u>, <u>Shall be Amended as follows:</u>

a. To promote peace and harmony, interest and attention, the Grand York Rite Bodies of Idaho shall adhere to the following rotation of meeting schedule, which will repeat every three

years, until changed by joint action of the Grand Bodies.

In 2007, a joint business session of the Grand York Rite Bodies will be held on Friday morning with the Grand Commandery in charge, the Grand Commandery will meet on Friday afternoon, the Grand Council will meet on Saturday morning, and the Grand Chapter will meet on Saturday afternoon.

In 2008, a joint business session of the Grand York Rite Bodies will be held on Friday morning with the Grand Council in charge, the Grand Council will meet on Friday afternoon, the Grand Chapter will meet on Saturday morning, and the Grand Commandery will meet on Saturday afternoon.

STATE OF THE ORDER

Since last year, very little has changed. Declining membership and participation continue to be major problems. There are, however, some positive signs of improvement. The rate of decline in membership has slowed; our gains offset the non-death losses. Degrees are being conferred in Blue Lodges throughout the state. Turnarounds are occurring in other organizations such as the Boy Scouts and college fraternities. This interest among young men may be a precursor of interest among men of all ages in Masonry. Companions, it is our responsibility to make use of these opportunities to turn around our York Rite Bodies. Good ritual work is paramount to attracting individuals who want to participate in what we have to offer. The Grand Council of Idaho continues to be financially sound.

Most visitations were well attended, especially those that were held concurrently with the Grand Chapter and/or the Grand Commandery. It was particularly heartening to find a solid group of dedicated Companions at work at each Council.

RECOMMENDATIONS

I recommend that

- 1. Joint Visitations of the three Grand York Rite Bodies continue.

 These are beneficial to the heads of the three bodies as well as to the Constituent Bodies involved.
- All Companions utilize the Brother-To-Brother Pamphlet developed by the Membership Committees to inform our Blue Lodge Brethren about the principles and ideals of the York Rite. Also, it is to inform them that we can complete the story.

- 3. We should strive to get some educational program included in the stated meetings. This would make the meetings more interesting and enjoyable for all of the brethren. If we don't do this and get our younger/new members involved in the meetings, they will decide it is a waste of time and stop coming and participating.
- 4. The Grand Council should pursue creating a Council in the Challis area to serve the Salmon River Valley. Other attempts to resurrect the York Rite Bodies in the Salmon River Valley, but they have been to no avail. What would it hurt to place a Council Under Dispensation in Challis and try and organize it so that there are all three York Rite Bodies in the area. I would also recommend that they arrange to be dark during the year when travel is the hardest.
- All leaders of the Constituent Councils attend any Masonic Leadership Training Conference available. This is valuable training and can provide information that would help invigorate the Councils.
- The Constituent Councils use the York Rite College and sister Councils to assist in putting on the degrees. It is difficult for many Councils to accomplish the two required degrees on their own.
- 7. We start planning now for a Super Excellent Master Degree within the next two years. If we don't do one soon, the Companions that remember the last one will be gone. This takes a large cast, similar to the Commandery's Order of Malta, and it will take some time to organize it.
- 8. We should continue our membership in the General Grand Council of Cryptic Masons, International. If one of the resolutions passes, we will become permanent members of this International Body.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

I would like to thank my Father for getting involved in Masonry even though it was relatively late in his life. I know that he enjoyed every minute of his 20 years in Freemasonry as a member of his lodge and its Craft Club.

I would also like to thank Companion Richard L. Roblee, PGIM, for appointing me to the Grand Council line in 1999. It has been a pleasurable journey to the East and thank you very much. I hope you find good Masonic Brotherhood in your future endeavors in North Carolina.

I would like to thank you Companion John R. Garner for stepping in to

take care of some of the duties of the Right Illustrious Grand Recorder, especially during these Grand Sessions.

I would like to thank the Grand Officers of the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons for accepting their positions in this body and for their support throughout this last Cryptic Year. We have some work left to do, and with your diligence, it will get done.

There are many companions that are deserving of a thank you, but there are four in particular that require special thanks from me: Companion David C. Triplett, PGIM, for his friendship and counsel on our many trips together through the Lodge and this Grand Council; Companion Ernest I. Masons in Joint Session with the Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons and the
Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Idaho; and

Whereas: It being further recognized it is expedient to conduct a Joint Grand York Rite Opening Session with Joint Reception of Distinguished Guest, followed by a Joint Grand York Rite Business Session for Reception of Reports of Joint Committees and other Joint Business in common. Now Therefore: In order to ensure the general good of Cryptic Masonry; Article XII, Section 15 b, Shall be Amended as follows:

b. To promote peace and harmony, interest and attention, the Grand York Rite Bodies of Idaho shall adhere to the following rotation of meeting schedule, **which will repeat every three years**, until changed by joint action of the Grand Bodies.

In 2008, a joint **business** session of the Grand York Rite Bodies will be held on Friday morning with the Grand Council in charge, the Grand Council will meet on Friday afternoon, the Grand Chapter will meet on Saturday morning, and the Grand Commandery will meet on Saturday afternoon.

In 2009, a joint **business** session of the Grand York Rite Bodies will be held on Friday morning with the Grand Chapter in charge, the Grand Chapter will meet on Friday, the Grand Commandery will meet on Saturday morning, and the Grand Council will meet on Saturday afternoon.
