Report was received.

Stanley N. McIrvin, Grand Warder of the Temple of the Convent General, Knights of the York Cross of Honor, announced the Convent General Sessions in Nashville, TN, on September 5-9, 2007.

Dalvin L. Hollaway, Personal Representative of Grand Master-General, stated his thanks for the courtesies and introduction.

Illustrious Brother Michael A. Sutton, 33°, Personal Representative of Illustrious Joseph E. Alexander, 33°, Deputy of the Supreme Council in Idaho, Ancient & Accepted Scottish Rite, Southern Jurisdiction, stated that we need to work together on this road of bringing forth Masonry into the 21st Century and it is pleasant to see the ladies at this session. Brother Mike announced that beginning of an effort to develop an exhibit at the State Historical Museum on Masonry in Idaho. There will be group to work on the research into the topic. The Grand Lodge will be sending out a letter to introduce the committee which will also be the committee for the Sesquicentennial of the Grand Lodge. The letter will request a representative from each body to provide input to the exhibit. He stated that he was a new member of the York Rite and was still learning.

At 8:55 A.M., the Right Eminent Grand Commander declared that the public portion of the Joint Session be closed.

At 9:40 A.M., the third Joint Session of the Grand York Rite Bodies of Idaho by the Right Eminent Grand Commander, Robert B. Cargill, was declared open. The roll of the Constituent Bodies was called, and 12 of 13 Chapters, all seven Councils, and all eight Commanderies were represented. At 9:45 A.M., Grand Chapter was declared open in emergency session by the Most Excellent Grand High Priest, Grand Council was declared open by the Most Illustrious Grand Master, and Grand Commandery was declared reconvened by the Right Eminent Grand Commander.

The first order of business was approval of the minutes of the preceding Grand York Rite Sessions. Minutes were approved as printed in the Proceedings.

It was moved and seconded that the preprinted reports in the Advanced Proceedings for the Joint Committees be approved as printed. The motion passed.

REPORT OF GRAND YORK RITE COMMITTEE ON YORK RITE OBJECTIVES ACCOUNT & ENDOWMENT FUND

To The Most Excellent Grand High Priest and Companions of the Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons Of Idaho; The Most Illustrious Grand Master and Companions of the Grand Council Cryptic Masons of Idaho; and the Right Eminent Grand Commander and Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Idaho

We your Joint Committee on York Rite Objectives & Endowment Funds beg to report the following:

We have examined the Balance Sheet and find no irregularities. The combined spreadsheet for all three bodies is in agreement.

During calendar year 2006 the York Rite Endowment Funds had **a Balance of \$57398.35**. The York Rite Objectives Balance was \$5,978.43 and the Endowment Fund earned interest of \$2,800. The structure requires that only the interest earned on the Corpus (body) of the Endowment Funds shall be expended. The York Rite Bodies of Idaho have established an accounting process where the Interest available to the three constituent bodies is disaggregated using a formula of 40% of available interest to the Grand Chapter; 27% of available interest to the Grand Council and 33% of available interest to the Grand Commandery. The Committee on Finance has further defined that no more than 90% of each bodies available interest will be used thereby contributing into the Endowment Fund from each body. This year we would recommend the maximum available to each body be set at 83.8% for 2007; thereby, insuring a greater return to the endowment fund.

We your Joint Committee on Financial Review beg to report the following:

We have examined the Grand York Rite Books, Balance Sheets and

Ledger Sheets and find no irregularities. The combined spreadsheet for all three bodies, along with the individual Ledger Sheets are in general agreement. The formulas used for rounding are similar to actual calculated values. The books are being kept; however, a more professional manner exists with accounting software that is readily available. Since our Grand Bodies very much constitute a business, we recommend the books be kept in a more business like manner, using professional grade software like QuickBooks Professional. QuickBooks Pro has the capability of producing the necessary cash flow, expense and income reports generated directly from the entries. This ultimately allows the Bodies the ability to track directly the expenditures and income and make real time changes based upon trends and up to date data.

We commend the Grand Secretary/Recorder/ Treasurer for his diligence on behalf of the Grand York Rite of Idaho. We know from experience the job is made easier because the Companions and Sir Knights in the Constituent bodies have devoted a labor of love in performing their respective jobs and would encourage each and everyone of you to tell them Thank You for a job well done.

We approached the Coeur d'Alene Valley of the Scottish Rite and the Holiday Inn Express in Hayden, Idaho, and secured our Session dates. A group daily rate was effected which was significantly lower than Holiday Inn's, Hayden, regular rates and lower than Templins at Post Falls. The group rate included an incentive of one free room per twenty booked which was provided Most Worshipful Grand Master Michael A. Sutton. Arrangements were made with Queen Esther Chapter, Order of the Eastern Star, in Coeur d'Alene, Idaho, to provide lunches, with two soups and sandwiches, and the Holy Land Pilgrimage Benefit Dinner with two meat courses. Membership in the Commanderies of Idaho continues to decline. In 2006 our Commanderies lost 40 members. 27 of these losses were due to death. We gained only 11 new members in Idaho. Our net loss was 29 members. This represents a decline of about 5.5% in overall membership. Our membership, as of the end of December 2006, was 525.

Only Idaho Commandery #1 knighted new members (6) this year. They are to be commended for their efforts. However, none of our Commanderies increased their membership.

There are effective tools (Brother to Brother Brochures, Masonic or York Rite Information Programs, etc.) that can be used to attract new members. Our Commanderies must become proactive in the use of these tools if we hope to keep York Rite Masonry viable in Idaho. Masonic Blue Lodges are doing more degree work and making more Master Masons. York Rite Masons must capitalize on the work being done in our Blue Lodges. A close working relationship between the Masonic Blue Lodges and the York Rite would benefit all. We must work together to obtain members, remembering that "Every Christian Mason should be a Knight Templar."

Once we have new members, Commanderies must work hard to see that these members are well received and become an active part of the Commandery.

In 2006, no Idaho Commanderies had an increase in membership. Only one Commandery knighted new Sir Knights; therefore, the Membership Trophy is awarded to Idaho Commandery #1 for knighting 6 new Sir Knights, thus having the greatest gain in new members.

STATE OF THE ORDER

I am confident that there is no question in anyone's mind concerning the present health of the Idaho Commandery. I could reiterate the bad news but we have all heard that news time and again. Each Sir Knight that attends Commandery meetings can see for himself. Most who attend are well past retirement age and oft times we cannot raise a quorum to open properly much less adequately perform a degree. Year by year we have been losing our members and our number is dwindling.

So if that is the bad news, what is the good news? We have out there in the "entertainment world" some folks who are not Sir Knights but who believe we the Masons in general and the Knights Templar in particular are an exciting, bankable commodity. We have "secrets" and maybe even treasure or if no treasure a mystique that piques the interest of the reader or movie attendee. The Sir Knights I know enjoy the stories too and we look forward to the next installment of the "National Treasure" and "The Solomon Key" or whatever Dan Brown will call his new book. So what is in it for us? We have been given a multimillion dollar gift called advertising and we need to take advantage of it. If we don't, we won't get another chance in our lifetimes. If we don't pull the members in now, there won't be another chance. So what do we do? We need to be tenacious and hang on as best we can. If we close a Commandery, it's gone and won't come back. There are examples of merged and closed Commanderies all over Idaho. To the best of my knowledge, merging 2 weak Commanderies you get 1 weak Commandery. So don't give up. I believe the troops are on the way. It is up to us to create the opportunity for them to belong to our great Order.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Where are the new York Rite Masons? In Blue Lodge or out on the street, or watching TV, or working or soldiering or playing or whatever, that's where they are. When you attend your local lodge, look around. Do you see many young or middle aged men who are not York Rite in attendance? If not, there is an answer and I see it work over and over again. Take the initiative, call your brothers together and make a list of men you think would make good Masons then contact the other Masonic bodies and talk to them about recommending other men. Include the ladies and the youth groups as they have a different perspective and have great ideas. Make a list and invite them to dinner with their ladies. After dinner make a short presentation on not only the Symbolic Lodge but all the bodies including the ladies and youth groups. Keep it short and to the point. If no one in your lodge can do it, call on Grand Lodge or any of the Grand Bodies as they all have someone in the State who can show up and enthusiastically explain who we are and what we are. Take notice of how they handle the program. They probably have a computer projector and a power point presentation or short program on a DVD. These programs are available for free and there are ways to borrow a projector if need be. After you see it done once, your lodge

can do it on their own. Do this program 2 or 3 or 4 times a year. The new Master Masons you make have friends and the program feeds on itself. If you talk to and mentor those men and talk about York Rite they will petition and our fraternity will rebuild itself. New Masons are excited about our fraternity and are looking for things to do. We cannot just read minutes and pay bills. York Rite must go places and do things. Go to church or attend a public meeting. Get involved and be visible. Work on the ritual, practice it and talk about it. If you don't use it, it will become lost. If we don't take this opportunity when the world is interested in us and what we do, we cannot survive. It takes a bit of effort to begin, however, I am confident it is not as difficult as holding down 5 or 10 different positions in different bodies when there is no one else to fill the chairs.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON THE STATE OF THE RITE

To the Most Illustrious Grand Master, Officers and Companions of the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons of Idaho:

The York Rite Bodies of Idaho face many challenges. It seems that as

each year passes, the challenges get bigger. Our membership continues its significant decline. Many of the members we do have fail to participate in their Chapters, Councils, and Commanderies. These and other problems make it difficult for Chapters, Councils and Commanderies to hold meetings or do ritual work. It is vital for every York Rite Mason to help find solutions to these problems.

Idaho Masonry has been working hard to stem the decline in membership. York Rite Masons must support their Blue Lodges' efforts to increase membership. In addition, we must inform all Masons of the benefits of York Rite Masonry and the importance of our philanthropies in order to increase our membership. We must all get involved in this effort for it is too big a task for just the elected leaders or the membership committee.

We must have trained effective leaders if our Chapters, Councils and Commanderies are to grow and succeed. Until the Idaho York Rite has established its own leadership training program, we recommended that our elected leaders attend Idaho Grand Lodge leadership training. The Grand Lodge leadership training will be very helpful in preparing our leaders for their roles and responsibilities. In addition, our leaders must plan programs to keep current members active and involved in our organization.

We must find out why members demit or do not participate so that we can take action to create positive changes. Each Chapter, Council, and Commandery must have a mentoring program to educate and involve our members. Every new and inactive member should be assigned a mentor to work with them and to help educate, motivate, and encourage them to be active.

Idaho York Rite Masons are members of a premier men's fraternal organization. Our philanthropies are world-class and they change lives for the better. Our fellowship and ceremonies also change the lives of our members. We are obligated to reach out within our communities. We can do this by increasing our membership and by becoming more active in our communities. By becoming more active we also become more visible. Almost everyone recognizes the Shrine of North America (Shriners) because of the visibility gained with the hospitals and burn centers. However, most people don't know they are Shrine Masons. Our Masonic family has the best philanthropies in the world and it is marvelous to think there are programs from cradle to the grave. We too are Masons! Through the philanthropic efforts of the Masonic family enable children to walk, talk, read, hear, see, and learn. Isn't it marvelous? These philanthropies provide life-changing medical care and we need to make sure they are available to beneficiaries in the future. Our Craft Lodges are seeing an upsurge in interest and gaining new members. Now it is up to us to set the stage and provide trained leaders and programs. It is our responsibility to provide these new masons and the seasoned masons that are not members of the Rites, with further light and knowledge, by showing them what we have for them to gain and by providing the incentive for them to join and participate in this great fraternity. By practicing these virtues our Chapters, Councils and Commanderies can and will prosper. By becoming active in community programs, people will see and people will learn we are not a secret society of devil worshipers; and maybe someday we will have the recognition the Shrine enjoys and we too can be robust, thriving organizations that can be proud of what our membership accomplishes. Remember, if it's meant to be it begins with me. Let us do what Jesus would do and provide the nurturing compassion to our members and our communities alike.

REPORT OF THE MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE

To the Most Illustrious Grand Master, Officers, and Companions of the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons of Idaho:

Membership in the Councils of Cryptic Masons of Idaho continues to decline. In 2006 our Councils lost 34 members. 18 of these losses were due to death. We gained only 14 new members in Idaho. Our net loss was 20 members. This represents a decline of about 4.5% in overall membership. Our membership, as of the end of December 2006, was 427.

There were two Councils fortunate enough to exalt new members. They are to be commended for their efforts. However, none of our Councils increased its membership.

There are effective tools (Brother to Brother Brochures, Masonic or York Rite Information Programs, etc.) that can be used to attract new members. Our Councils must become proactive in the use of these tools if we hope to keep York Rite Masonry viable in Idaho. Masonic Blue Lodges are doing more degree work and making more Master Masons. York Rite Masons must capitalize on the work being done in our Blue Lodges. A close working relationship between the Masonic Blue Lodges and the York Rite would benefit all. We must work together to obtain members.

Once we have new members, Councils must work hard to see that these members are well received and become an active part of the Council.

So, our challenge becomes how do we make inactive members of the Council into active members, and how can we attract our Brethren from the Symbolic Lodges to the York Rite?

RECOMMENDATIONS

I recommend we continue our support of the Northwest Regional York Rite Conference. This conference is as excellent resource for us to find ways to improve our Fraternity.

I recommend we make available York Rite information such as the "Brother to Brother" pamphlet and others at the Grand Lodge of Idaho. Many Brothers took "Brother to Brother" pamphlets at the last Grand Lodge and so it should be continued and expanded to include other York Rite information.

I recommend we promote and support York Rite information nights. Whether it be a special stand alone event, like a dinner with a program, or at Blue Lodge meetings. The Blue Lodges have a version of this that they are using more often with some success. We can do the same with a York Rite version.

I recommend that the Grand Council along with the other two Grand York Rite Bodies start to do some short term and long term planning. We need to look at our future and be a proactive force in shaping that future.

ARTICLE XXIX

Prepaid Life Membership and Permanent Memorial Fund

- Section 1. A Companion in good standing in any Constituent Council of this Grand Jurisdiction may become exempt from paying the annual dues as required by the Bylaws of his Council, and a Constituent Council may grant Prepaid Life Membership to a qualified Companion subject to the provisions of this Article.
- Section 2. A Companion may, with his current dues paid, purchase a Prepaid Life Membership by submitting a written request to his Council with a sum equal to twenty-one years annual dues in effect at the time of purchase.

a. *Additions*. Voluntary additions of funds to a Prepaid Life Membership may be added at the time.

b. *Dispatch of Funds*. All funds received by the Council under Section 1 and Section 3 shall be deposited in its own account. A Council check for the full amount and the proper form shall be transmitted to the Grand Recorder who will forward the check to the Secretary of the York Rite Investment Committee for investment only.

c. *Installment Purchase*. Each Council is authorized to establish a policy for purchasing Prepaid Life Memberships on the installment plan which, at the time of purchase, conform to the single payment requirements.

d. *Council Ownership.* Any sums remitted for Prepaid Life Memberships shall remain the property of the last Council in which a Companion's membership was held and that Council shall continue to receive the annual revenue from tat

investment.

e. *Not refundable*. Neither the total purchase amount for a Prepaid Life Membership, nor the revenue derived from its investment, is transferable to any other Grand Jurisdiction under any circumstances, and is not refundable to the purchaser for any reason.

f. Transfers. A Prepaid Life Member may transfer his membership by affiliation with any Constituent Council in this Jurisdiction. If such transfer requires funds in addition to those he has already paid, to equal twenty-one times the current annual dues of the new Council, and if the member wishes to continue his Prepaid Life Membership, he shall submit to the new Council the additional funds. He may also elect to pay the regular dues of the new Council until such time as he may choose to submit the additional funds and continue his Prepaid Life Membership. In any case, his Prepaid Life Membership shall become the property of his new Council and any revenues derived there from shall accrue to and be regularly paid to his new council. If his petition is rejected, any funds tendered with the petition shall be returned to the petitioner.

g. *Involuntary Transfer*. If a transfer of membership is not voluntary and is required because of the surrender, revocation, arrest or annulment of the Charter of the Council, each Prepaid Life Membership of the extinct Council must petition some other Council within six months. If the petitioned Council elects by majority vote, it may remit a part or all of any additional funds required by Section 2f above.

h. *Consolidation*. In the case of the consolidation of Councils, all Prepaid Life Members become Prepaid Life Members of the consolidated Council without added funds being required.

i. *Notify Trustee.* When a Prepaid Life Member transfers to another Council, his new Council Recorder shall notify the Secretary of the Investment Committee and the Grand Recorder of the affiliation. d. *Surety Bonds*. The members of the York Rite Investment Committee shall be under Surety Bond. The Council Committee members shall be bonded by the Grand Council Policy.

e. *Committee Organization.* The York Rite Investment Committee, on the call of last year's Chairman, shall convene within thirty days after each year's appointments to select a Chairman, Treasurer and Secretary from the appointees, review the past written policies of prior Investment Committees and establish new policies as necessary. The minutes of the meeting shall be included in the report of the York Rite Investment Committee.

f. *Committee Duties.* The York Rite Investment Committee shall prescribe the books and records to be kept by its members, maintain permanent records, invest funds, adopt policy and approve the distribution of the earnings of the Council Funds. The Committee shall resolve any inequities or questions not covered by this Article. No policy decisions shall be made except at a meeting called by the Chair.

g. *Chairman Duties.* The Chairman shall call and preside at all meetings of the Committee, authorize an annual audit of the books and records, and present the annual report to the York Rite Bodies. in the absence of the Chairman, a York Rite Grand Treasurer shall assume the Chairman's duties.

h. *Treasurer's Duties.* The Treasurer shall invest and have the custody of all investment funds and shall maintain such books and records as the Committee shall require.

i. *Secretary's Duties.* The Secretary shall record the minutes of the meetings of the Committee and spread them as directed by the Committee.

(1) The Secretary shall record the name of each Companion purchasing a Prepaid Life Membership, the remitting Council, amount of funds and the date received.

(2) The Secretary shall record the name of the remitting Council of funds received for the Permanent Memorial Fund, the source of the funds, amount and date received.

(3) The Secretary shall transmit all funds received to the permanent custody of the Treasurer and take his receipt therefore.

(4) The Secretary shall transmit by letter the names of all active Prepaid Life Members and Council affiliation annually to the Grand Council Recorder.

(5) The Secretary shall promptly notify the Grand Recorder of the name and Council of a new Prepaid Life Member as well as transfer or restoration reported by a Council Recorder. Section 6. The Prepaid Life Membership Fund and the Permanent Memorial Fund shall be Permanent Funds except as modified by this Article, and shall be invested solely for the benefit of the participating York Rite Bodies.

> a. *Investment Control*. All trust funds shall be invested in any form of securities that are insured or guaranteed by the United States Government or any of its agencies. All investments shall be selected by the policies set forth by the Committee.

> b. *Reserve.* A reserve fund is not authorized. A minimum amount necessary to maintain a bank checking account may be retained as undistributed income.

c. *Counsel*. In the selection of investments, the Committee may consult competent investment counsel. (See Section 4e, this Article)

d. *Co-mingled Accounts.* The Council Prepaid Life Membership Fund and Permanent Memorial Fund may only be jointly invested and co-mingled with similar funds of the W other York Rite Bodies.

Section 7. At the close of each calendar year, the Chairman of the Investment Committee shall authorize an audit of the books and records of the funds for which they are the trustee, and a copy of the audit shall be sent to the constituent York Rite Bodies.



REPORT OF THE MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE

To the Most Excellent Grand High Priest, Officers, and Companions of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Idaho:

Membership in the Royal Arch Chapters of Idaho continues to decline at a significant rate. In 2006 our Chapters lost 67 members. 38 of these losses were due to death. We gained only 18 new members in Idaho. Our net loss was 49 members. This represents an overall 7.23 % decline in membership. Our membership, as of the end of December 2006, was 629. There were a few Chapters fortunate enough to exalt new members, but only one Chapter increased its membership. They are to be commended for their efforts.

There are effective tools (Brother to Brother Brochures, Masonic or York Rite Information Programs, etc.) that can be used to attract new members. Our Chapters must become more proactive in their use if we hope to keep Royal Arch Masonry a viable organization in Idaho. Masonic Blue Lodges are doing more degree work and making more Master Masons. Royal Arch Chapters must capitalize on the work being done in our Blue Lodges. A close working relationship between the Masonic Blue Lodges and Royal Arch Chapters would benefit all. We must work together to obtain members.

Once we have new members, Chapters must work hard to see that these members are well received and become an active part of the Chapter.

REPORT OF THE GRAND HISTORIAN

To the Most Excellent Grand High Priest, Officers and Companions of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Idaho:

This is the report of the Excellent Grand Historian. The subject of this report is the origin and significance of the High Priest's Breast Plate.



THE BREASTPLATE OF THE HIGH PRIEST By

H. Meij, H.P.

Tokyo Chapter #1, R.A.M.

"And Aaron shall bear the names of the children of Israel in the breastplate of judgment upon his heart when he goeth in unto the holy place for a memorial before the Lord continually" [Exodus 28.29]

Aaron was the first high priest and was Moses' brother. After Aaron died, subsequent high priests were his descendants, known as the sons of Aaron. The High Priest was the most glorious Jewish position. His representative dress was said to be "for glory and for beauty." It was made according to the design given by God to Moses. Only certain special people were allowed to make the garment as the following verse indicates:

"And thou shalt speak unto all that are wise-hearted, whom I have filled with the spirit of wisdom, that they may make Aaron's garments to consecrate him that he may minister unto me in the priest's office" [v. 3].

The role of the breastplate becomes clear in the following text:

"Aaron shall bear the names of the children of Israel in the breastplate of judgment upon his heart when he goeth in unto the holy place, for a memorial before the Lord continually"



<u>Why is the Breastplate so</u> <u>important?</u>

The breastplate was of great importance because by means of it, God revealed his Divine will to His chosen people. It was designed by God Himself and the directions as to how it was to be made were given to Moses as illustrated in Exodus XXVIII. 15, 20.

The King James Authorized Version of the Bible (1769) translated the Hebrew work "chosen" as breastplate, but this obscures some of its meaning. In the Septuagint it is written by the Greek word 'logeion,' which means a speaking-place. This describes exactly what the breastplate really was---the oracle or means by which God spoke to, i.e., answered the inquires of, the high-priest.

What did the Breastplate look like?:

The breastplate was clearly designed with the idea that the names of the twelve tribes engraved on the stones should be brought before God "as a continual memorial," and that Aaron should "bear them upon his heart, when he went into the most holy place." (Exodus XXVIII. 12, 29). When we look at the breastplate as we use in our ritual, we find it to be made of metal with 12 gems. However, in reality, according to the Bible, the breastplate, or, as it is further named, the breastplate of judgment was, like the inner curtains of the Tabernacle, of "cunning work," which means that it was the work of a skilled weaver. The material with which it was woven consisted of threads of gold and blue, purple and scarlet linen threads. The number of the threads and the order of the colors were, according to the 'Targums" one of gold, six of blue, six of purple, and six of scarlet.

The Urim and Thummim:

The breastplate was actually made of two pieces, which formed a sort of purse, or bag, in which also was kept the two sacred stones, named the Urim (representing light and excellence) and the Thummim (representing perfection and completion). These stones were some divinely appointed instruments by which the High Priest inquired of God about matters concerning the welfare of the Children of Israel. The Bible makes several references to these miraculous stones, but not anything physical, like the shape or size.



They were probably two jewels. When someone had to make an important decision, the request was made known to the high priest. He would stand before the lamp stand near the altar, holding the Urim in one hand and the Thummim in the other.

As the light from the candle reflected from the Urim and the Thummim onto the stones of the Breastplate, this flash of light provided up to 24 combinations (2 x 12). Since there are 22 letters in the Hebrew alphabet, the flashes of light could produce strings of letters. It was said that God breathed through the wind, which in turn causes the veil to move, permitting a breeze to flicker the flames in the Lamp stand to momentarily alter the angle of direction of the light onto the Urim and Thummim, and thence to the Breastplate. Thus God was able to communicate directly, but not audibly, to the high priest and answer the enquiry.

Which stones were on the breastplate?:

Upon the breastplate were set four rows of precious stones, three in each row, and upon them were engraved the names of the twelve tribes, and as the great Jewish historian Josephus adds, "in the order of their birth", but we are not told which stone to which tribe. So which stones were used? This is a 2,000 year old question. Although the Hebrew names of the 12 stones are not in question, their translation is, and despite numerous attempts, the various translators cannot, to date, agree to a single translation. G. W. Kunz in "The Curious Lore of Precious

Stones" says "In the Midrash Bemidbar, the Rabbinical commentary on numbers, the tribes are given in their order, with the stones appropriate to each and the color of the tribal standard pitched in the desert camp, this color corresponding in each case with that of the tribal stone."

In general, however, the following composite is most accepted:

For in the Bible we learn that:

"And thou shalt set in it settings of stones, even four rows of stones: the first row shall be a sardius, a topaz, and a carbuncle: this shall be the first row.

And the second row shall be an emerald, a sapphire, and a diamond. And the third row a ligure, an agate, and an amethyst. And the fourth row a beryl, and an onyx, and a jasper; they shall be set in gold in their enclosings.

And the stones shall be with the names of the children of Israel, twelve, according to their names, like the engravings on a signet; every one with his name shall they be according to the twelve tribes....

And Aaron shall bear the names of the children of Israel in the breastplate of judgment upon his heart, when he goeth in unto the holy place, for a memorial before the Lord continually."

The Dress of the High Priest:

The awesome responsibility of the high Priest required a sanctified person (Exodus 29), dressed in "holy garments". The uppermost holy garment is apron-like and is called the Ephod. On top of the Ephod there is the square breastplate, with the twelve precious stones. On each shoulderpiece of the Ephod was a precious stone. Six names were written on each of the stones, altogether naming the twelve tribes of Israel. Every time the high priest went before God at the Golden Incense Altar, the names of all the people of God were upon His shoulders.

The blue garment is called the robe, under which the high priest wore a white fine linen woven tunic. On his head is the white fine linen turban. Round the base of the turban is the crown of gold, with the inscription "HOLY TO THE LORD". This dress passed to his successor at his death.

REPORT OF THE RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE

To the Most Excellent Grand High Priest, Officers, and Members of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Idaho:

We, your Resolutions Committee, present the following Resolutions for your consideration:

R07-01

RESOLUTION TO AMEND ARTICLE XXXIX Amendments, Section 1 (Requires majority of delegates present to pass)

WHEREAS: the procedures for amending the bylaws of Grand Chapter are vague, and

WHEREAS, there is no specific date for filing of amendments, and

WHEREAS, there are no clear procedures as to whom to file the amendments with, and

WHEREAS, there is no specific date for reporting the amendments to the Constituent Chapters;

THEREFORE, Be it Resolved, Article XXXIX, Section 1, shall be amended as follows:

As it reads: Section 1. The By-laws or Regulations of the Grand Chapter may be amended as follows,

a. The entire section which is proposed to be amended shall be submitted in writing, in the desired form, to the Grand Secretary/Treasurer at least sixty days in advance of the Annual Convocation.

b. The Grand Secretary/Treasurer will forward a copy of the proposed amendment to the chairman of the Jurisprudence Committee, to the Chairman of any Standing Committee having interest in the subject matter, to each Grand Chapter Officer, and to the High Priest and Secretary of each Constituent Chapter.

c. The proposed amendment shall then be read at the next Annual Convocation, together with reports of the proper committees.

d. During Grand Chapter Annual Convocation consideration and debate, proposed legislation may be modified by majority vote if it affects the Regulations and modified by two-thirds majority vote if it affects the By-Laws.

e. If the proposal affects By-Laws it must be approved by at least two-thirds of the members present, and if it affects the Regulations it must be approved by a majority of those present, to become a part of this Code of Laws..

As Amended:

a. The entire section which is proposed to be amended shall be submitted in writing, in the desired form, to the Grand Secretary on or before the fifteenth day of December next preceding the Annual Convocation.

b. **On or before the first day of February, the** Grand Secretary will forward a copy of the proposed amendment to the chairman of the Jurisprudence Committee, to the Chairman of any Standing Committee having interest in the subject matter, to each Grand Chapter Officer, and to the High Priest and Secretary of each Constituent Chapter.

Section 1. The By-laws or Regulations of the Grand Chapter may be amended as follows,

c. The proposed amendment shall then be read at the next Annual Convocation, together with reports of the proper committees.

d. During Grand Chapter Annual Convocation consideration and debate, proposed legislation may be modified by majority vote if it affects the Regulations and modified by two-thirds majority vote if it affects the By-Laws.

e. If the proposal affects By-Laws it must be approved by at least two-thirds of the members present, and if it affects the Regulations it must be approved by a majority of those present, to become a part of this Code of Laws.

After graduation, he entered the United States Air Force where he served 20 years as a flight instructor and fighter pilot. He met and married his wife Jean while in the Air Force. They have four children and four grandchildren. Jean is past president of Boise Assembly #137 Social Order of the Beauceant. She is a member of Iras Temple #40 Daughters of the Nile and a past president of Iras Temple Princess Club #13.

After retiring from the Air Force, Jay earned a teaching certification from Boise State University. He taught science at the junior high school level in the Nampa and Mountain Home, Idaho school districts for fifteen years. He retired from teaching in 2004.


