

Thoen serving as the Master of Ceremonies (MC). MC Thoen offered a few opening remarks and introduced the following Distinguished Guests:

- Sir Knight James C. Herndon, Right Eminent Northwest Department Commander; who in turn introduced Sir Knight William Howard Koon, II, Most Eminent Grand Master of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar of the U.S.A.
- Companion Robert L. Elsloo, Right Puissant Northwest Regional Deputy General Grand Master of the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons, International; who in turn introduced Right Puissant Companion Lawrence O. Weaver, Right Puissant General Grand Principal Conductor of the Work.



PRELIMINARY REPORT OF GRAND YORK RITE COMMITTEE ON FINANCIAL REVIEW

To: The Most Excellent Grand High Priest and Companions of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Idaho; The Most Illustrious Grand Master and companions of the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons of Idaho; The Right Eminent Grand Commander and Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Idaho.

We your Joint Committee on Financial Review beg to report the following:

We have examined the Grand York Rite Books, Balance Sheets and Ledger Sheets and find no apparent irregularities. The combined spreadsheet for all three bodies, along with the individual Ledger Sheets are in agreement. The formulas used for rounding are similar to actual calculated values. As reported the last two years the books are well kept.

We, your joint Committee on Idaho York Rite Investment Funds, beg to report the following:

We have examined the Balance and Ledger Sheets and find no irregularities. The combined spreadsheets, for all three bodies, along with the individual Ledger Sheets, are in agreement.

During the calendar year 2009, the Grand York Rite Bodies of Idaho had \$227,603.11 invested for the full year with a return of \$12,862.17, or 5.571%. The total Investments were \$237,661.35, with a total return of \$12,839.08.

REPORT OF GRAND YORK RITE COMMITTEE ON YORK RITE OBJECTIVES ACCOUNT & ENDOWMENT FUND

To the Most Excellent Grand High Priest and Companions of the Grand Chapter, Royal Arch Masons of Idaho, the Most Illustrious Grand Master and Companions of the Grand Council Cryptic Masons of Idaho, and the Right Eminent Grand Commander and Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery of Idaho:

We, your joint Committee on York Rite Objectives & Endowment Funds, beg to report the following;

The York Rite Endowment Fund was established from a bequest from Most Excellent Companion and Sir Knight Alton T. (Skinny) Kauffman, who had the foresight and wisdom to anticipate a decrease in membership sooner or later in the York Rite of Idaho. The income from the Endowment Fund is placed in the Grand York Rite Objectives Account. After two years, any portion of the income remaining is transferred to the Endowment Fund, for future growth of that fund.

For the year 2009, the Endowment Fund end balance was \$58,105.11, and its yield was \$3,237.05 in income (5.57%) This income was transferred to the Objectives fund, which has a balance of \$7,586.29.

The remaining income from 2007, \$550.00, was transferred to the Endowment Fund, which now has a balance of \$58,655.11.

The structure of the York Rite Investments requires that only the income of the Endowment Fund be expended through the Objectives Fund. The Committee further defined that no more than 90% of the income be distributed to the three bodies.

Based on the proposed budgets of the three bodies, your Committee recommends that the income of \$2913.35, (90% of \$3,237.05) be distributed as follows: Grand Chapter, \$1,068 (36.7%); Grand Council, \$850 (29.2%); Grand Commandery, \$912, (31.3%). The remaining income, \$407.05, (12.6%), is held in reserve for unexpected events.

For the information of the Companions and Sir Knights, the investments of all funds of the Grand York Bodies of Idaho, are placed in Edward Jones accounts. Income is placed in money market accounts of Edward Jones, until needed.

Robert B. "Pete" Cargill

Right Illustrious Companion Robert B. "Pete Cargill passed through the veil on January $2,\,2009$.

Robert B. (Pete) Cargill walked his final journey at the University of

Washington Medical Center in Seattle, after a long and courageous battle with leukemia.

Pete was born on Oct. 24, 1940, to U.L. and Hazel N. Kennedy Cargill, in Los Angeles. He moved with his parents, in 1944, to Fieldbrook, Calif., where he attended elementary school through the eighth grade, in a one-room school. In 1958, he graduated from Arcata (Calif.) High School and attended Humboldt State University in Arcata.

On Jan. 19, 1963, Pete and Alene Greer were married in Arcata, where they were blessed with four children during their 20- year marriage. They later divorced.

Pete joined his father's real estate firm in Arcata in 1963, becoming the broker/owner of the firm upon his father's death in 1967. In 1985, Pete moved to Lewiston, maintaining his Arcata office as a branch office. He became a licensed real estate broker in Idaho and continued his firm in Lewiston until the time of his death. Natalie Cargill Howard joined her father in 1994, functioning as designated broker at the time of his death.

In 1970, Pete became a Master Mason in Arcata Lodge No. 106 F& A. M. he served as Master of this lodge in 1976. In 1990, Pete became a dual member in Nez Perce Lodge No. 10 A.F. & A.M. in Lewiston, and served as master in 1998. Pete served as Most Excellent Grand High Priest and Secretary of Lewiston Chapter No. 4, Royal Arch Masons. He was the Right Illustrious Deputy Grand Master of the Grand Council Cryptic Masons of Idaho, and Recorder of Moscow Council Number 6, Cryptic Masons; he also served as Right Eminent Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Idaho and Recorder of Lewiston Commandery No. 2 Knights Templar. "Pete" served as Most Worshipful Grand Master, Most Excellent Grand High Priest, Right Eminent Grand Commander, Eminent Prior of Idaho Priory No. 13, Knights of the York Cross of Honour, Puissant Sovereign of St. Patrick Conclave, Red Cross of Constantine. Pete was a 33rd Degree Scottish Rite Mason and member of the Calam Shiners'

His greatest satisfaction was serving the Grand Lodge A.F. & A.M. of Masons in Idaho as Most Worshipful Grand Master in 2007-2008. He was also a member of the Order of Eastern Star No. 207, Arcata, and a dual member of Laurel Chapter No. 13, Lewiston, serving both chapters as Worthy Patron. Grand Chapter of Idaho Order of Eastern Star was also a great source of happiness for Pete, and he loved serving in many appointive positions.

All during his life, Pete loved to paint in oils and sketch in pen and ink; his paintings and sketches are a gift to us all. He loved classical music and often listened to his music while painting. Reading was another passion of Pete's; countless friends and associates relied upon Pete to be a fountain of knowledge and information; he was always willing to take the time to answer and explain questions about automobiles, math, science, real estate and a countless variety of topics. He had endless patience to repair toys, appliances,

or anything that needed repair - the only problem was sometimes he had a few pieces left over when he was finished. He had time and patience for everyone, most of all for those, no one else had time for.

Pete is survived by his daughters, Natalie Howard and her husband, Robert, of Lewiston, Kim Sykes and her husband, Rich, of Mountain Home, Idaho, and Elizabeth Cargill and Michael Schneider of Kent, Wash.; a son, Scott Cargill and his wife, Chrissy, of Lewiston; his brothers, Bill Cargill and his wife, Maria, of Lewiston, Calif., and Tom Cargill and his wife, Linda, of Fieldbrook, Calif.; a dear cousin, Carol Millar and her husband, Keith, of Fieldbrook; grandchildren, Christina Winkle, Lindsay Winkle and Kasey Thomason of Lewiston, Courtney Thomason, McKenzie Thomason, Caden Sykes and Carter Sykes of Mountain Home; extended grandchildren and special friends, Chris Tutcher, Kim Spear, Brandy Tutcher and Chad Peters, all of Lewiston; and other special grandchildren, Jessie Russell and Yojana Katawadi of Lewiston. REPORT OF THE YORK RITE MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE

To the Most Excellent Grand High Priest and Companions of the Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons of Idaho; The Most Illustrious Grand Master and Companions of the Grand Council Cryptic Masons of Idaho; and the Right Eminent Grand Commander and Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Idaho:

Membership in Idaho's York Rite Bodies continues to decline. Overall, the rate of decline has remained relatively constant for the three York Rite bodies over the past few years.

There were seven Royal Arch Chapters out of the thirteen in this jurisdiction that exalted a total of 17 members. The Grand Chapter still suffered a net loss of membership of 3.5%. Idaho Falls Chapter #10 had a gain in membership and should be commended for that.

There were four Councils of the seven that greeted a total of 17 members. The Grand Council had a net loss of membership of 3.58%. Jeremiah Council experienced a gain in membership and should be congratulated for that.

There were five Commanderies out of eight that knighted a total of 15 members. The Grand Commandery had a net loss of membership of 3.40%. Idaho Falls Commandery #6 was the bright spot and had a gain in membership and should be applauded for their efforts.

A close working relationship between the Masonic Lodges and the York Rite would be beneficial. Masonic Lodges are doing more degree work and raising more Master Masons than a few years ago and we in the York Rite must take advantage of this. We must make sure that these new Master Masons are mentored and feel welcomed into the fraternity; then give them an

opportunity to join the York Rite. There are effective tools (York Rite informational DVDs, Brother to Brother pamphlets, power point, etc.) that can be used to educate and attract new members. We must become proactive in using these tools if we hope to keep York Rite Masonry viable in Idaho.

We must work hard to retain our members by providing interesting programs and activities to keep members involved and satisfied. - 4. Grand a Special Dispensation to Idaho Commandery #1 to elect a Captain General, due to the expulsion by the Grand Lodge of Idaho of their Commander, and to advance and install the elected Captain General with the advanced Commander and Generalissimo.
- 5. Granted a Special Dispensation to Gate City Commandery #4 to install officers out of time due to a lack of a quorum.
- 6. Granted a Special Dispensation to Lewiston Commandery #2 to install officers out of time due to weather causing a lack of a quorum.

A Special Dispensation to Lewiston Commandery #2 to move their stated meeting was denied on the grounds that the Idaho Code of Laws does not permit stated meetings to be changed by the Grand Commander.

STATE OF THE ORDER

Sir Knights, last year Sir Knight Milton A. "Jock" Slavin stated that we are still seeing a lack of participation in our Constituent Commanderies. At our Joint York Rite visitations this year I observed this same lack of participation first hand. I determined that this would have to change, or we could lose Commanderies and, possibly, our Grand Commandery. In an effort to prevent this happening, and in the spirit of "self-help", I offered to return to each Commandery on an "unofficial visit" with the stipulation that each would attempt to open on out new 10-man opening, which had been recently published. I also offered a veiled threat if they could not or would not attempt the opening at that visit something unpleasant would happen.

I am pleased to state that, as of this date, and with the help of the Boise Fall and Spring Festivals, two of our Commanderies are able to open and stand inspection, with two others rapidly approaching that goal. My congratulations to Idaho #1, and Idaho Falls #6 for standing inspection, and to Lewiston #2 and Coeur d'Alene for their efforts. Keep up the good work!

The biggest help in developing the proficiency of these Commanderies has been the finishing and publishing of our new 10-man

opening ceremony handbook. The inclusion of floor diagrams and manual of the sword has enabled the Sir Knights to learn from one manual how our ritual should be perform, and to be uniform across the state. We owe the Tactics Committees from the last three years a vote of thanks for a job well done.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Continue the "unofficial visits" to those Commanderies
 who need encouragement, on their stated conclave meeting nights. Constituent Commanders should make every
 effort to see that his Commandery has enough members
 present to either open in form or practice that opening for
 the Grand Commander.
- 2. Other Grand Commandery Officers should try to attend these "unofficial visits" with the Grand Commander, for moral support for him and the host Commandery.
- 3. Every Commandery Conclave should have a purpose for meeting other than reading the minutes and paying the bills. Some suggestions could be practice the opening and the conferrals, regalia inventory, history of the Grand Commandery and your Commandery, review of books on the original Knights Templar, etc. Let your imagination roam.
- 4. We should support our youth groups with our time, interest, encouragement, and attendance.
- 5. We should continue to support the Holy Land Pilgrimage program with nominations and contributions.
- 6. The Grand Commandery should support the efforts of the Grand Chapter and Grand Council of Idaho to keep a strong York Rite presence in Idaho.
- 7. Each Sir Knight should support and attend out local Lodges. That is where out future lies.



During this past year I have traveled more than 15,000 miles to represent Idaho at various Masonic Family functions and meetings. I regret that due to scheduling conflicts or health issues I was unable to attend Alaska, Colorado or Wyoming, but I assure you I intend to visit our sister jurisdictions in the future.

STATE OF THE ORDER

Since last year, very little has changed. Declining membership and participation continue to be major problems. There are; however, some positive signs of improvement. Degrees are being conferred in Blue Lodges throughout the state. Companions, it is our responsibility to make use of these opportunities to turn around our York Rite Bodies. Good ritual work is paramount to attracting individuals who want to participate in what we have to offer. The Grand Council of Idaho continues to be financially sound. Most visitations were well attended, especially those that were held concurrently with the Grand Chapter and the Grand Commandery; however; the Constituent Councils are badly in need of a Masonic Education Program. They also need to revitalize the meetings with occasional programs, some of which should include their families. Nothing is staler than holding a meeting, reading minutes, paying bills and closing. Meetings need to be fun, informative and well organized! Many outside speakers are available on a host of subjects. There is nothing wrong with using a meeting to practice ritual or to give a short educational talk or occasionally to have a get together with the Companions and their families and discuss how to improve matters. It's time to start planning, plan your work and work your plan.

RECOMMENDATIONS

I recommend that:

- Joint Visitations of the three Grand York Rite Bodies continue. These
 are beneficial to the heads of the three bodies as well as to the Constituent Bodies involved.
- 2. All Companions utilize the Brother-To-Brother Pamphlet developed by the Membership Committees to inform our Blue Lodge Brethren about the principles and ideals of the York Rite. Also, it is to inform them that we can complete the story.
- 3. The Constituent Councils use sister Councils and the York Rite College to assist in putting on the degrees. It is difficult for many Councils to accomplish the two required degrees on their own. That each Council practice conferring the work even if they do not have candidates, to keep the work acceptable.
- 4. We start planning now for a Super Excellent Master Degree within the next two years.
- 5. All leaders of the Constituent Councils attend any Masonic Leadership Training Conference available. This is valuable training and can provide information that would help invigorate the Councils.
- 6. We should strive to get some educational program included in the stated meetings. This would make the meetings more interesting and enjoyable for all of the Companions. If we don't do this and get our younger/new members involved in the meetings, they will decide it is a waste of time and stop coming and participating.
- 7. We should continue our membership in the General Grand Council of Cryptic Masons, International.
- 8. That each Constituent Council reviews their By-Laws frequently in order to keep them current and accurate.
- 9. That each Constituent Council provides the Grand Recorder a copy of their latest By-Laws for review with and conformity to the Grand Council Code of Laws.
- The Grand Council Officers continue to utilize the Council Improvement Educational Program we compiled. Education is needed at all levels. We need to develop our new Companions and strive to improve our mature membership.



REPORT OF THE EXCELLENT GRAND HISTORIAN

To the Most Excellent Grand High Priest, Officers, and Companions of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Idaho:

This is the report of the Excellent Grand Historian:

The Green Degrees

The Knight Mason degrees have their origins to the earliest records of Freemasonry. In fact, there is some indication that the Knight Mason degrees may have been developed even before the degree of Master Mason. Knight Masonry contains those degrees which are worked within a council of Knight Masons under the jurisdiction of the Grand Council of Knight Masons.

The Grand Council of Knight Masons was formally constituted in Ireland in 1923 to look after the degrees which were previously worked by Royal Arch chapters, Commanderies (known as Preceptories in Europe and Canada) of High Knights Templar and even a Rose Croix chapter. These "Green" degrees are ancient and are, in

essence, Old Testament based. The degrees are three, in addition to the chair degree. They are: Knight of the Sword (formerly the Red Cross of Daniel or Babylonian Pass); Knight of the East (formerly Jordan Pass); Knight of the East and West (formerly Royal Order); and Installed Excellent Chief.

The degrees were controlled by the Great Priory of the Order of Knights Templar in Ireland. The degrees are also worked under the authority of the Supreme Grand Royal Arch Chapter of Scotland. One of the earliest records of the degrees is connected with the Royal Arch and belonged to the "Master's Part" which was then the Master Mason ritual in 1744. There arose an issue between the Masonic ritual involving "Joshua" and Zerubbabel legends and eventually in 1790 the "Green Degrees" separated from "Red Cross Masonry."

It was the gradual dying of the brethren who were sufficiently versed in Knight Masonry to confer the degrees that first caused alarm early in the Twentieth Century. Candidates for the degrees had to travel far to procure them. It was visualized that the degrees would eventually die out unless a means to prevent it was taken. The first move was to contact those Preceptories/Commanderies whose warrants included these degrees. Some of them were resistant to part with their rights. Eventually, the subject was taken up with the Great Priory of Ireland. After some time, that body obtained consent of its Preceptories to hand over the conferring of the degrees to the suggested new body, which we now know as the Grand Council of Knight Masons.

The manner of this relinquishment of rights from one Grand Body to another eventual Grand Body is unique and pertinent to their existence. In 1922, at a joint meeting of the members of the Great Priory and the Knights Templar, who desired to form the new body was held. A motion was passed that all rights and privileges touching the Red Cross Degrees, which are at present vested in the Great Priory be transferred to a Grand Council.

The Green Degrees are not to be confused with the degrees which may have similar names in other Orders. Despite this, you will find much similarity in the settings and plot elements with the Holy Royal Arch, the Order of the Red Cross of the chivalric orders, and the Scottish Rite's 15° (Knight of the East), 16° (Prince of Jerusalem), and 17° (Knight of the East and West). These are all, to some extent, related as they all are based on the legend of Zerubbabel and feature Kings Cyrus a/k/a Cyrus the Great or Cyrus the Elder), Darius I and Josiah, and the return of the Jewish people from Babylonian captivity. Perhaps most familiar to you will be the winewomen-king debate featured in degrees throughout Freemasonry.

Knight of the Sword - The candidate, representing Zerubbabel, seeks admission to come before King Cyrus. The King relates the details of a dream to his courtiers, and then permits Zerubbabel to enter. Zerubbabel requests liberty for the captive Jews and gives a signal demonstration of his fidelity. The King, being impressed, grants Zerubbabel and his company permission to return to Jerusalem and rebuild the Temple. He invests him with a sash, a sword, and a password.

Knight of the East - The time is now 16 years after the action of the previous degree. Zerubbabel now returns to Persia from Jerusalem to request of King Darius continued support in building the Jewish Temple, and his aid in driving away the enemies who are frustrating their efforts. Darius grants the request and appoints Zerubbabel a palace guard. Before retiring, the King proposes the discussion of the relative strengths of wine, women, or the king. Zerubbabel and two other guards contend via argument, with Zerubbabel coming out the victor. He is then escorted safely back to Jerusalem.

Knight of the East and West - In this degree, Zerubbabel returns in triumph to Jerusalem and reports to the Sanhedrin, or Jewish Council. As recognition for his valor and constancy, he is created a Knight of the East and West, and is invested with a sash and apron.

In the Order of the Red Cross, the ritual is usually split into three sections.

In the first section the Jewish Sanhedrin lament the fact that their efforts to rebuild the City and Temple at Jerusalem are constantly thwarted, either by aggressive enemies or by indifferent edicts. They elect to send an ambassador to the Court of Darius to plead their case: Zerubbabel offers to go, as he is known to the King at Babylon.

In the second section Zerubbabel attempts to cross a river by means of a bridge, but is arrested by guards and imprisoned.

In the third section he is brought before the King and his commitment to Truth and to his vows result in his being released and exalted, and, following the famous debate, he is allowed to return to his native land bearing gifts, with the promise of a free pass for him and his fellows.

One of the common threads that connect these rituals is the journey made by Zerubbabel. Many Masonic degrees explicitly talk of a journey: the Second Degree, the Third Degree, the Most Excellent Master Degree, the Mark Degree, the Most Excellent Master Degree, the Holy Royal Arch, the Royal Master Degree, the Select Master Degree and the Super-Excellent Master Degree all contain

journeys, and if one accepts that all circumambulations are a symbolic journey, then all Masonic degrees contain such a journey.

The next similarity is the discussion, in which three arbiters argue the supremacy of wine, the power of the king, women, and truth. At first glance this debate seems almost out of place in the scheme of things. Why would this be a central part of the ritual? If accepted at face value, it has little to teach us, but we have learned by now that the debate itself is a symbol of something else, something higher.

To better understand the debate we must first identify who is talking. Even though Zerubbabel is given the task of arguing the strength of women, he comes to realize that only Truth can set him free. That is to say, that the strength which he seeks to build his personal Temple lies within him.

Two great lessons are taught by the Degrees. The first is that liberty is achieved slowly and by painful steps. It comes no more quickly than a nation or an individual is ready for it. Even then, it is a constant struggle to maintain it. The second is that honor and integrity are absolute, not relative or convenient.

Perhaps the purpose is to warn us that, no matter how carefully and skillfully we build, nor how holy or altruistic our intention, we are still building in the world, and the world has a habit of tearing down what others build. It may be a warning that the task of building our lives is never simple and straightforward. There are setbacks. Each of us can experience frustration and emotional exhaustion. Each of us may have all our plans changed by forces we cannot foresee or control. More than once, we may have to start building again from the ground up. The death of a loved one, changing economic conditions, wars, even our own continuing maturation and growing insight may send us back to the drawing board.

So, by receiving the degrees of Knight Masonry, a man is completing a sequence intimately related to the other teachings of Freemasonry.

STATE OF THE CHAPTER

We still face the same challenges of declining membership and aging members. Younger members with new energy are needed to invigorate the Chapters. We have seen some bright spots this past in an increase in new members. Some of these members have a new energy that has started a revival in at least two areas of the state. We have been relying too heavily on festivals for the past few years because that was the only way we could get the degrees performed adequately to Exalt new members. Now with this increase in Lewiston and Idaho Falls, they may be able to start putting on the degrees of the Chapter with maybe a little bit of outside help and not rely on the festival.

We need to more strongly make our presence known to the Blue Lodges so that new Chapter members may be drawn from their ranks. When new companions are created they need to be put to work going up the chairs and learning parts used in the degrees.

The Grand Chapter of Idaho continues to be financially sound.

Visitations were, for the most part, well attended. So meetings were delayed because of delays in meal service and caused a lack of a quorum to be present.

It is up to these dedicated individuals that have started to rebuild a couple of Chapters to continue their efforts and help to invigorate the

rest the Chapters by their example of how it should be done. Thank you for taking "the Bull by the Horns" and lighting a fire under the Companions of the Chapter.

RECOMMENDATIONS

I recommend that:

- All chapters participate in the Chapter of Excellence Program.
 This program, like the Lodge Excellence Program, will strengthen the chapter and entice members to participate in chapter events. It also promotes chapter activity in the communities.
- 2. Utilizing the Brother to Brother pamphlet and membership DVD will give masons a view of our principles and the work of the York Rite Masons and promote membership.
- 3. Current and future officers of constituent chapters should take the opportunity to attend the Northwest Regional York Rite Conference in Boise in October of each year. This conference is not just for the Grand Officers but also for the Constituent Chapter Officers. Valuable information is passed on to all attendees. The officers and companions should attend any Grand Lodge Leadership Training that might be available. This training can provide information that is helpful in maintaining good structure in chapters.
- 4. Joint visitations by the three York Rite Bodies should continue when possible. This will be beneficial to the heads of the bodies as well as the constituent bodies.
- Chapters should develop regional degree teams or use help from the York Rite College when they are unable to do the degrees themselves.
- 6. Chapters should look at modifying their by-laws to allow them the ability to move their stated meeting to another date in the case of a Masonic Body that has precedence, i.e., Grand Lodge, scheduling a required functions on top of their stated meeting. The reasoning behind this recommendation is that the Grand High Priest does not have the authority to set aside a Chapter's By-Laws so that they can still have the stated meeting.

Billy Dale Winch, the oldest of four children, was born outside Knobnoster, Missouri, on the farm of hi grandfather, Claude Winch, to Russell and Opal Winch on February 16, 1932. There is now an airbase on a section of land that was part of his grandfather's farm. The two-story house was used as a dispensary.

He joined the U.S. Navy in 1951 and went into service in January 1952 and served on AO-54 (Oil Tanker) during the Korean conflict. In November 1955, he was honorably discharged and went to work for Mountain States Telephone Company (AT&T) in Twin Falls, Idaho. It was during this time that he met his future wife, Patricia Darnell, and they were married on September 8, 1956, Pat's birthday.

After working for AT&T two years, he attended Idaho State University in Pocatello, Idaho. During this time, their daughter, Debra Winch Hayes, was born in 1957 in Jerome, Idaho. Dale officially retired in 1997; however, he will never entirely retire.

Dale was initiated an Entered Apprentice Mason on March 5, 1958, passed to the Degree of Fellowcraft on May 14, 1958, and raised a Master Mason on June 11, 1958. This was in Jerome Lodge #61.

Dale and Pat then moved to San Diego, California, in June 1958 and went to work for the Firestone Tire Company. In June 1962, he transferred to Nampa, Idaho, where they have remained. In 1963, he transferred his Lodge membership to Ashlar Lodge #90.

Dale became Associate Guardian of Jobs Daughters Bethel #4 in 1974 and Dad Advisor of DeMolay in 1976. In 1978-1979, he was Associate Grand Guardian of Jobs Daughters of Idaho. This is the year when the Supreme International Jobs Daughters Session was held in Boise, Idaho.
