The annual banquet of the 2013 Grand York Rite Sessions was held on Saturday evening, April 20th, at the Hilton Garden Inn, 700 Lindsay Blvd, Idaho Falls, Idaho with Companion and Sir Knight G. Arthur Shoemaker as the Master of Ceremonies (MC). MC Shoemaker offered a few opening remarks and introduced the following distinguished guests:

Sir Knight Duane L. Vaught, Right Eminent Grand Generalissimo Grand Encampment Knights Templar of the USA and Personal Representative of Sir Knight William Howard Koon II, Most Eminent Grand Master of the Grand Encampment Knights Templar of the USA.

Most Puissant Companion Lawrence O. Weaver, Most Puissant General Grand Master, General Grand Council Cryptic Masons International.

**REPORT OF GRAND YORK RITE COMMITTEE ON
YORK RITE
OBJECTIVES ACCOUNT & ENDOWMENT FUND**

To the Most Excellent Grand High Priest and Companions of the Grand Chapter, Royal Arch Masons of Idaho, the Most Illustrious Grand Master and Companions of the Grand Council Cryptic Masons of Idaho, and the Right Eminent Grand Commander and Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery of Idaho:

We, your joint Committee on York Rite Objectives & Endowment Funds, beg to report the following;

The York Rite Endowment Fund was established from a bequest from Most Excellent Companion and Sir Knight Alton T. (Skinny) Kauffman, who had the foresight and wisdom to anticipate a decrease in membership sooner or later in the York Rite of Idaho. The income from the Endowment Fund is placed in the Grand York Rite Objectives Account. After two years, any portion of the income remaining is transferred to the Corpus of the Endowment Fund, for future growth of that fund.

For the year 2012, the Endowment Fund end balance was \$60,438.70 and its yield was \$2,420.39 in income (3.9629%). This income was transferred to the Objectives fund, which has a balance of **\$6,136.44**. The remaining income from **2010, \$150.64**, was transferred to the Corpus of the Endowment Fund, which now has a balance of **\$60,589.34**, leaving **\$5,985.50** in the Objectives Account

The structure of the York Rite Investments requires that only the interest income of the Endowment Fund be expended through the Objectives Fund.

The Committee further defined that no more than 90% of the income be distributed to the three bodies. The remainder is held for emergency's and if not utilized within the two year timeframe is transferred back to the Corpus of the Endowment Fund to help insure the Fund's growth.

For the information of the Companions and Sir Knights, the investments of all funds of the Grand York Bodies of Idaho, are placed in Edward Jones accounts. Income is placed in money market accounts of Edward Jones, until needed.

CHAIRMAN: Each year at our York Rite Grand Sessions in Idaho, we pause a moment to reflect on those of our Order who have laid down their working tools of the Fraternity. Their comfortable and familiar presence seems an overwhelming loss, reflection however, assures us they have passed through a hidden veil and are traveling upon that level of time, from which no traveler returns, but where we can only imagine and thus we cherish their memory forever.

We are happy our Blessed Savior has left the lines of the Grand Bodies intact; however, and we are saddened by the report of loss of two Past Grand Officers of Idaho.

KENT W. GIST 1922-2012 MEGHP 1992 MIGM 1984 REGC 1994

Kent Watson Gist was born August 12, 1922 and passed through the veil on August 19, 2012.

He was born in Inwood, IA, to Joseph R. and Gladys (Leffler) Gist. At the young age of four Kent moved with his family to a farm near Presho, SD. There Kent's two siblings Rodney, and Ruth were born. This was during the Dustbowl and Great Depression Era. The Gist family managed to produce crops only two years out of ten and moved east in 1937, to Canton, SD. Kent attended Worthing High School graduating in 1939, as Class President.

At the age of 20, Kent enlisted in the Army. He trained as a Radio Operator and Morse Code Specialist; serving in the Army Air Corps, Kent's duty stations were in the Pacific Theater, Guadalcanal, Elmirau, Hawaii, Saipan, and Iwo Jima. Kent witnessed the "Raising of the Flag" on Mount Sarabachi from a destroyer. Kent was honorably discharged December 6, 1945.

In 1946, while attending college in Madison, SD. Kent met the love of his life; Edith Ingalls of Bryant, SD. Kent and Edith were married June 6, 1948 and spent more than 64 years together. Kent and Edith started their married life in Arlington, WA, where daughter Sarah was born in 1949.

They moved to Idaho in 1950 where daughter Melissa was born in 1952, and son John in 1956. March 1, 1958 the Gist family moved to a five acre plot on Denver Road near Fruitland, ID, where Kent and Edith have lived ever since.

Kent was a self-employed businessman, who enjoyed meeting and serving others. With partner Ed Powell, Kent built a successful insurance and tax preparation business. Kent had many loyal customers, and many had him prepare their taxes for 30 years or more.

Kent was a lifelong member of the First Methodist Church, and served in many capacities in all ministries of the Fruitland First United Methodist Church. He was a talented vocalist and was called upon many times to share his talent with others.

Kent was a Past Master of Washoe Lodge No. 28 A F & A M. and was very active in York Rite Masonry. Kent was Secretary of the Payette, Idaho York Rite Bodies for over 20 years. Kent was active in the State level of the York Rite serving in all three Grand lines. Kent Served as Most Illustrious Grand Master of Cryptic Masons in 1984; Most Excellent Grand High Priest of Royal Arch Masons in 1992 and as Right Eminent Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar in 1994.

Kent was active in the whole Masonic family. He served as Grand Chaplain of the Idaho Grand Chapter Order of Eastern Star in 1982-1983.

Kent had an undying and infectious sense of humor, and incredible resolve of self-discipline and an example to others, an unshakable faith in his God and Savior, and eternal gratitude of his loving family and friends who were touched by his life.

Kent was a Past Prior of Idaho Priory No. 13, Knights of the York Cross of Honour, a Past Sovereign and Member of St. Michael Conclave Red Cross of Constantine; a Past Preceptor of Redemption Tabernacle No. XL, HRAKTP; and a Past Governor, in Idaho, of the York Rite Sovereign College of North America. He is missed by all who knew him.

SAMUEL P. SELVIG
1916-2012
MEGHP 1978

Samuel Peter Selvig was born May 11, 1916 and passed through the veil August 16, 2012.

Sam was born to Melvin and Ingrid (Norman) Selvig. The family raised four boys in a small home in Superior, WI, where Sam's father was a railroad man. Sam graduated from East High School in 1935 and went to Superior Teachers College for one semester before enlisting in the Navy in November 1935. He began his naval career in San Diego. During his career he saw the world, crossed the equator, visited Paris, Japan, Panama, saw the Rock of Gibraltar, and was part of the Lighter-than-Air Rescue Squadron ZP-33 stationed at Tillamook, OR. While stationed at Tillamook, Sam made many trips to Portland, OR where he met Beulah Musgrove. They were married in 1945 and lived in Vancouver, WA. Their son Wayne was born there in 1946; the family was then stationed in Alameda, CA, and Honolulu, Hawaii. Aviation Machinists Mate Sam retired from the United States Navy receiving his honorable discharge at Moffett Field, CA, in June 1955. The Family moved to Idaho to be closer to Beulah's family and Sam soon found work at Mountain Home Air Force Base as a Base Housing Maintenance foreman. Sam took an active role in the positive development of many young men by becoming involved with the Boy Scouts of America. Sam was honored with the Silver Beaver Award for his efforts. In 1975, Sam retired from Civil Service, and he and Beulah moved to Boise. Sam managed the Boise townhouse Apartments for many years.

When Beulah's father passed away, Sam and Beulah moved to Notus, ID, to be closer to her mother, and Sam became a vegetable farmer. Beulah's health began to deteriorate in 1998 and Sam cared for her until she passed in 2003. They shared nearly 58 years together and provided us with a wonderful example of true commitment and devotion to one another no matter the circumstance.

Sam was a man of honor and integrity and always followed the rules and expected others to do the same. He enjoyed a meal and appreciated a good clean joke. He loved following politics and took his responsibility as an American seriously. He respected the law and always stood for what was right. Sam was an old fashioned "gentleman's gentleman" and made many friends throughout his life and career who will remember him as such.

Sam moved back to Boise to be closer to his son and grandson and great grandchildren. He continued to be active in Masonry. He was also a member of El Korah Temple, AAONOMS and the American Legion. Sam was a member of Mountain Home Chapter Number 24, Mountain Home, ID and a PHP, Idaho Council No 1 Cryptic Masons and Idaho Commandery No 1 Knights Templar of Idaho. Sam was elected and served the Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons of Idaho as Most Excellent Grand High Priest in 1978.

Right Eminent Grand Commander 2012-2013

Anthony Gregory Michael Such was born March 20, 1942, to Eleanore and Anthony Michael Such, at Saint Mary of the Angels Hospital in Chicago Illinois. At the age of three his father, Anthony Michael, was killed fighting in Germany in World War II. His mother, Eleanore, suffered a breakdown and Anthony and brother Gregory, were raised for a time by their maternal grandparents, Elia and Kathryn. Anthony's mother soon returned with a new husband, two girls; Rachel and Barbara, and step-brother Herbert.

Anthony began schooling at Darwin Elementary in Chicago, and then moved to a small farm in Millet, near Lansing Michigan. The school was comprised of grades K-6. Millett, being a farm community, resulted in Anthony riding a bus to school long before it became fashionable or required for desegregation. Through the 4H program, Anthony received instruction in farming practices, animal husbandry, and learned to swim at the YMCA,

He returned to Chicago for grades seven and eight at Saint Sylvester where he was confirmed a Christian and a soldier of Christ. Anthony then returned to Michigan and attended Saint Patrick High School on an academic program leading to college. During this period Anthony had paper routes delivering as many as eleven hundred newspapers every morning; for about eleven different papers. Also, about this time Anthony's maternal grandfather introduced Anthony's uncle and Anthony to construction, repair, and renovation of buildings and basic auto repair. Dziadzia (pronounced "ja ja", polish for grandfather) worked in a foundry, and, had very large hands. Anthony's best memory of his grandfather was of assisting Anthony in wiring a Corvette model.

Anthony returned to Chicago to attend Lane Tech High School because he wanted to graduate from the same high school as his father. This also was an opportunity, by his family to dissuade Anthony from college aspirations. Lane was a vocational school where various shop courses were treated as major courses. Attendance at Lane, temporarily postponed some of Anthony's academic requirements, which he was able to make up by attending Summer school.

Anthony worked as a delivery boy for a tailor, who ran a dry cleaning shop, and achieved some rank as an usher at a Chicago Theater. During this time, Anthony met and dated his first wife, Caroline. Anthony and Caroline became engaged before graduation and married just after Basic Training. It took about fifteen months for Anthony to achieve sufficient rank (pay) so they could form their first home together - a fifteen foot mobile home with a storage room. The house was located off Post at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri. The situation greatly improved when Caroline took a job at the PX and Anthony managed to qualify for proficiency pay, as a construction draftsman. Anthony and Caroline then acquired a thirty five foot trailer which was their home until service separation.

While in the Army, Anthony qualified expert on the M1 Rifle, M1A Carbine, .45 caliber Pistol, 12 gauge Shotgun, and the Browning Automatic Rifle. He also had the opportunity to attend many courses in operating many forms of mass media communication devices, and worked with a number of

civilians on the Army Supply Status Reporting System which required a Crypto clearance. Anthony headed this program for several months suggesting improvements which were accepted by Fifth Army Headquarters. Anthony attended the University of Wisconsin at Madison thru the US Armed Forces Institute (USAFI).

Anthony had planned to attend and was accepted at the Illinois Institute of Technology; however, in depending upon a trust fund which proved not to exist he was unable to attend as his mother was forced to use the fund to provide for the family, 'Cae Sirra! Anthony took a job as a production analyst and expediter at Garcy Corporation, and continued studies at Wright Junior College and Loyola University. This job evolved into a customer service representative and liaison agent to an outside computer service. After a few years Caroline decided to move on and they separated and then divorced.

Anthony moved from Garcy Corporation, to become more fully immersed in the computer industry as a computer operator. He continued the pursuit of a degree. Anthony completed his college work at Roosevelt University with a double major of computer technology and business administration. Anthony worked several years as a computer programmer and analyst.

During this time Anthony met and married Christine, and they moved to California. Anthony began consulting and training other people. Christine could not adjust to the California lifestyle. She remained homesick, and decided to return to the Midwest; Thus ended the second marriage.

Anthony continued work for a number of firms from San Francisco, Santa Rosa, and San Jose - sort of a "Golden Triangle" surrounding and within the "Silicon Valley" of California. It was here that Anthony was to meet and later become married to Mary. Mary, had three daughters; eight, eighteen and nineteen. The eldest two being already on their own. They were together for fifteen plus years and Anthony thought he had finally found a life partner!

They moved into a new house they constructed just above Los Altos Hills near Los Gatos and Redwood City in the Santa Cruz Mountains. They had a wonderful view West and South all the way to the Ocean which was about six miles away, experiencing morning Sea fog often, and, if fortunate, special Sunsets; when the fog was low and a higher cloud layer was present it caused both layers to appear as fluffy gold with the Sunset at center stage! Mary worked professionally as a computer analyst, designer, and programmer and was very helpful in construction.

Anthony and Mary decided to retire where there was snow, but did not wish to be east of the Rockies. This led them to Coeur d'Alene, which Anthony had visited some years before. They discovered Lake Pend Oreille and Priest Lake, as well as becoming knowledgeable of Lake Coeur d'Alene. They searched Lake Coeur d'Alene southerly as far south as Worley, the West side of Lake Pend Oreille, and even north into the Priest Lake area, but chose to buy property in the Cocolalla Valley. Here They planned to construct a curved wall 'A' frame which was to serve as intermediate housing and a thirty-seven hundred square foot home which they intended to operate as a Bed & Breakfast.

Unfortunately, Mary attended a "mind expanding" course in San Francisco, and went through a significant personality change and Anthony suffered a major heart problem culminating in a double by-pass. Mary, sensing a

negative future, compounded by the death of her mother, feared that she would be required to care for an invalid. She also felt that the twelve hundred mile distance to Idaho was a major impediment to her continuing relationship with her daughters and chose to seek a divorce.

Anthony, over the course of several years, finished the 'A' frame and later constructed a very large garage/shop/storage building with a twenty-eight by twenty-four foot second floor, which later was to serve as his model train room. Anthony also drove school bus for several years and this is where he made initial contact with Freemasonry.

Anthony became a Master Mason and later Secretary at Sandpoint, Senior Deacon, Junior Warden, and Master at Spirit Lake. Thirty-second degree mason, at the Valley of Coeur d'Alene in the Scottish Rite. And Knight Templar in the York Rite eventually becoming Excellent High Priest of Keystone Chapter 29, Illustrious Master of Emerald Council Number 8, and Eminent Commander of Coeur d'Alene Commandery Number 5. Anthony served as Secretary/Treasurer for all three York Rite Bodies of North Idaho. Master for the Idaho Lodge of Research, Master of Bonners Ferry, and a second period as Master at Spirit Lake. In the Scottish Rite Anthony was fortunate to serve in every elected position and participate in degree work becoming Master of the Fourth Degree. Anthony served as District Deputy Grand Master for the Grand Lodge of Idaho; Ish Sodi for the Grand Council of Idaho and District Deputy Grand High Priest for the Grand Chapter of Idaho, Anthony served the Grand Chapter as Right Excellent Grand King and the Grand Commandery as Right Eminent Grand Commander.

Notable among these achievements was the opportunity to establish the Order of the White Star as the paramount Grand Commandery Award of Merit and the institution of the Idaho Chapter Order of Knights Preceptor. Anthony served as the Sovereign Grand Preceptor of the Knights Preceptor of America.

**RESOLUTION TO AMEND THE CONSTITUTION OF
THE GRAND COMMANDERY OF KNIGHTS TEMPLAR
OF IDAHO.**

(Requires a 2/3 majority of delegates present to pass)

PROPOSED AS:

**BY-LAWS, PART 1, ARTICLE XIII, SECTION 137
COMMANDERY RECRUITING RELIEF FUND**

Whereas: The need to assist individual Commanderies in recruiting efforts with funding to that purpose, and in recognition of our mutual responsibility to provide assistance as needed, the following provision shall be added to the Constitution.

Therefore, be it resolved, that Section 137 be added to the By-laws, Part 1, Article XIII, of the Constitution of the Grand Commandery of Idaho as follows:

Section 137: Commandery Recruiting Relief Fund.

A. Purpose:

The purpose of this fund is to provide funds for assistance and relief to those Idaho Commanderies that are unable to fund their own recruiting efforts. Recruiting efforts by Commanderies should be funded by whatever means are available to them including funds from their own cooperating Chapters and Councils. Whether it be from their own accounts, leaving a reasonable reserve, or by donations and volunteer effort as needed. But when these are insufficient they may apply for assistance or relief from this Fund.

B. Members & Quorum:

The Chair of this Fund shall be the Grand Commandery representative to the York Rite Investment Committee with the balance, subject to the discretion of the Grand Commander, formed by the Treasurers of participating Commanderies. Quorum shall consist of five members including the Chair and voting achieved by whatever means are available (email) as long as the vote is recorded. The Chair shall vote only in case of a tie and the prevailing vote shall be by simple majority. The Grand Commander and the Grand Recorder shall be ex-officio members.

Qualification:

Commandery participation is achieved by a one-time contribution of (2%) of their net assets excluding real estate, and paraphernalia, to the fund. This Committee may request additional monies from all Commanderies at will. Those Commanderies that have not previously been participating may do so at any time but at not less than the previously stated 2% plus the requested amount(s) at a later time(s). Commanderies that do not contribute are not eligible to receive monies from this fund. Contributed funds shall be received by the Grand Secretary and held and accounted for by the Grand Treasurer.

Restrictions & Approvals:

The Committee shall review all applications to ascertain qualification and that the project is of a nature to recruit new Sir Knights. Funding will be provided to a Commandery, if qualified, but shall not be dispensed for the costs of a professional caterer or a non-Masonic location. There shall be no monetary compensation for these members. If accepted the Chair shall authorize the Grand Treasurer to dispense the approved funds. The Chair shall report their actions annually at Grand Sessions.

Formation & Dissolution:

If the Fund fails to achieve a quorum in one year, the Fund shall be dissolved and monies returned to the contributor(s). If this Fund shall be dissolved after attaining quorum, the remaining funds shall become part of the York Rite Endowment Fund and may not be recovered at some later date. This Committee may reconstitute itself within the scope of these provisions at will.

Rational: Since the Grand Commandery now has an operational Tactics, Training, and Educational Committee it will be found that an individual Commandery is not able to fund a project from their own resources. These efforts should be supported by the Grand Commandery via its Constituents. We have provided a structure, personnel, tools, administration, and oversight. Now we need to provide the necessary funding. Sir Knights, remember your oath of support and be mindful that your Commandery may not need recruiting relief now but you may in the future!



Whereas there have been additions and changes to uniform laws over the last 112 years, and our laws have not kept up with these changes and

Whereas we the Grand Encampment has renumbered the uniform regulation

Be it therefore resolved that REGULATION U2 be amended as follows;

As it reads, deletions strikethrough:

U2. UNIFORMS. The Order of Knights Templar is declared to be a Uniformed Order.

The purchase of a uniform by a candidate shall be optional. Each and every Officer of Constituent Commanderies shall be required to possess a dress uniform. Each Constituent Commandery shall maintain a unit or units, equipped with uniforms to be worn at full form openings and the conferring of the Order of the Temple.

a. The Templar Dress Uniform shall be that prescribed by Section 250 of the Grand Encampment Statutes, except that the Baldric shall not be worn within this Grand jurisdiction. The official jacket will be full-dress style with either military or lapel style collar. The lapel style collar is to be worn with a white shirt and four-in-hand tie. The regular white plumed chapeau is to be worn.

b. Constituent Commanderies may provide and use ceremonial robes conforming to and consistent with the historical traditions and practices of Templary. These ceremonial robes are to be used only in the Asylum for the conferring of the Order of the Temple and their design and material shall be as prescribed by Section 255 of the Grand Encampment Statutes.

c. ~~The Templar Fatigue Coat shall be a three button double breasted sack coat, to close with two buttons, to be made of black unfinished worsted cloth, square cut, peak lapel collar, form fitting, with two lower patch pockets, square flaps, one quarter lined of black rayon, with one inside pocket, body lining of black rayon; sleeve lining of gray rayon. Shoulder loops of same material as coat, sewed down flap up to the button; on each shoulder will be embroidered a Templar Cross two inches in height and width, bordered with one row of no. 26 gilt bullion embroidery, five thirty seconds of an inch wide. (For Grand Commandery Officers, red velvet center; for Past Grand Commanders, purple velvet center) The lower edge of cross to be placed one half inch from sleeve seam. For Grand Commandery Officers~~

~~there shall be placed on the shoulder loop just below the Templar Cross, gold Bullion embroidered letters representing their office (no lettering to be used for Past Grand Commanders.). On the cuffs of coat, a Templar Cross same as on the shoulder loops. There shall be three black buttons on each cuff. All buttons used on the coat will be special composition Knight Templar buttons with cross and crown in center and the motto of the Order in circle around the outer edge.~~

~~d. The Templar Cap and Mantle, as authorized by Section 41 (i), Page 4, of the Addenda to the 1987 edition of the Constitution and Statutes of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar of the United States of America, is an authorized Uniform to be worn within the Grand Jurisdiction of Idaho. It shall be worn in compliance with Sections A, B, C, D, and E of the Addenda.~~

e. The Grand Commandery Officers and Past Grand Commanders will wear a Black Name Tag with their name and the state, 'IDAHO', engraved on it. The name tag will be worn on the right breast of the jacket and even with the left breast pocket top. These name tags will be obtained through the Grand Recorder. These will be available to all Constituent Commandery members from the Grand Recorder for the cost of the name tag plus postage.

COMMITTEE**

*To the Most Illustrious Grand Master, Officers and Companions of the
Grand Council of Cryptic Masons of Idaho:*

The Charters and Dispensations Committee, the Most Illustrious Grand Master and the Grand Recorder of the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons of Idaho received a signed petition, in proper form, requesting dispensation to organize a Council of Cryptic Masons to be located at Grangeville, Idaho. All other materials required for the formation of a new Council by the Code of Laws of the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons of Idaho accompanied the petition received by this Committee.

In response to the petition, Most Illustrious Grand Master (MIGM) John Zeller issued a dispensation, dated February 20, 2013, for the Companions that signed the petition to proceed with filling offices and any meetings needed to create bylaws for the proposed Council. The MIGM installed Officers

of the Clearwater River Council (UD) in March.

Having reviewed the petition to form a new Council and all documents submitted with the petition, it is the recommendation of the Charters and Dispensations Committee that the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons of Idaho authorize Clearwater River Council in Grangeville to meet, operate, and confer degrees under dispensation (UD) until our next annual assembly in 2014. At the 2014 assembly, this Committee, having again reviewed all documentation including minutes of assemblies and degree work held during the past year, will make a final recommendation concerning the authorization of Clearwater River Council.

REPORT OF THE RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE

To the Most Illustrious Grand Master, Officers and Companions of the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons of Idaho:

The Resolutions Committee received four proposed resolutions for consideration. These resolutions have been reviewed by this Committee and the Jurisprudence Committee. All resolutions were found to be in proper form and not to be in conflict with our existing Constitution and Bylaws. Therefore, this Committee recommends that the four proposed resolutions be brought to the floor for consideration during our next annual assembly. The proposed resolutions are as follows:

2013 Grand Council Resolution CM 13-01

Whereas the Custodians of the Work of the Grand Council of Idaho has reviewed the suggested 6 Man opening and found it to be in good order with the exception of supplanting the opening prayer with the prayer of the stand-and full opening.

Therefore, be it resolved that Article 23, Section 7, be replaced in its entirety with the following:

Article 23, Section 7, Quorum Requirements

- a. A quorum to open a Council for the transaction of business including balloting shall consist of at least four members of that Council, and having 2 other Companions, for a total of 6, using the 6-Man opening. The Council may not confer degrees when opened in this manner.
- b. A quorum to open a Council for all purposes shall consist of at least five members of that Council, having four other Companions, for a total of nine. The full form opening must be used.
- c. Requirements of a proper quorum include the Officer entitled to congre-

gate the Council and members of that Council must be in good standing. Those other Companions may be members of another Council recognized by the Grand Council of Idaho.

Rationale: To provide for the use of the 6 Man Opening as a proper forum for the purpose of the transaction of business and balloting.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON CUSTODIANS OF THE WORK

We your Committee on Custodians of the Work, begs to report the following:

We received a proposal to adopt a “Six-Man Opening” Ritual for use by the Constituent Councils of this Jurisdiction. At your direction we have met, and have reviewed the proposed Ritual and are able to make the following recommendations:

- The Six Man Ritual Contains all the work necessary to open and conduct all regular business in our Constituent Councils.
- We recommend substitution of the “Full Form “ Opening Prayer in place of the condensed version.
- Article XXIII, Section 7 “Quorum”; will require changing to conform with the number of Companions required to Open and Conduct Business;

Therefore we recommend Article XXIII, Section 7 be amended!

Article XXIII, Section 7 as it now reads: A quorum for the transaction of business consists of at least five members of that Council, including an officer entitled to congregate and open the Council, together with up to four members in good standing in other Councils recognized by the Grand Council of Idaho, making a total of at least nine members. For conferring the De-

degrees only, nine Cryptic Masons shall constitute a quorum. Degrees must be conferred in open council.

Proposal to amend Article XXIII, Section 7

A quorum for the transaction of business consists of at least four members of that Council, including an officer entitled to congregate and open the Council, together with up to two members in good standing in other Councils recognized by the Grand Council of Idaho, making a total of at least six members. For conferring the Degrees only, nine Cryptic Masons shall constitute a quorum. Degrees must be conferred in open council.

If Article XXIII, Section 7 is amended; then our recommendation will be in full conformance with our Laws.

STATE OF THE CRAFT

The Grand Chapter of Royal Art Masons of Idaho in not in as good of shape as many Companions think it is. These Chapters have not been able to present the Degrees for many year and do not take advantage of the other Chapters who do Festivals to increase their numbers.

This Grand Chapter is a mixture of a group of assorted Companions who for most of the time concur at other do not. This information needs to be discussed and brought forward to the Officers (MEGHP) for the good the Order. Communication is the one of the answers.

RECOMMENDATIONS

There are a number of items that the Grand Chapter needs to do in order to improve its efficiency of its operations.

1. Acquire a database (like what the Idaho Grand Lodge uses, "Rolls") which would make doing monthly reports more timely and up to data, thus easing the time consuming year end reports and hopefully correct and up to date.
2. Each Chapter should have a Copy of their Chapter By-Laws on file with the Grand Secretary in both Hard Copy and on digital form. As of now this is not happening as I ask the Grand Secretary for Boise Chapter No. 3's By-Laws and he said there none in his files.
3. That a Credit or Debit Card with the amount of what the Grand Chapter provides for travel expenses be given all incoming Grand High Priests.

Receipts would be returned to the Grand Chapter for their records and when the funds are gone there wouldn't be any more.

4. Each Grand Body of the Grand York Rite of Idaho has its own set of By-Laws by which it is governed. These individual By-Laws do not affect the operation of the other bodies except when it comes to the joint Committees. Each Body refers to joint committees with 3 independent sets of by-laws governing the joint committees. One says this, one says that, on the same item. There should be a set of by-laws developed for the purpose of governing the Joint Committees which says the same in all three Bodies. A set of By-Laws for the Joint Committees is required.

REPORT OF THE GRAND HISTORIAN

Idaho Chapter History

Paul A. Gehrman, Jr., Grand Historian

During June of 1867 many interesting things were happening in Idaho Masonry. The Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons of the State of Oregon commenced its Seventeenth Annual Communication at the Masonic Hall in the City of Portland Oregon on Monday June 24, 1867 at 10:00 AM. In the afternoon meeting of the Grand Lodge an address of Most Worshipful Grand Master of Masons in Oregon, Albert W. Ferguson

was read. This report included information that he had issued a dispensation to a competent group of Brethren to form a new Lodge at Silver City, Idaho Territory, under the name of "Owyhee" Lodge. This dispensation was issued on June 25, 1866. The Grand Lodge was then called from labor to refreshment later in the afternoon.

Later that evening, The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Oregon was opened on its Seventh Annual Convocation. During this meeting the Grand Secretary presented a petition from a constitutional number of Companions from Idaho praying for a Charter, which was read and referred to the Committee on Subordinate Chapters. The Grand Chapter was called from labor to refreshment until Wednesday evening June 26, 1867, at 7:00 PM.

On Tuesday June 25, 1867, Grand Lodge resumed and Owyhee Lodge was not granted their Charter, but it was sent back to the Committee on Subordinate Lodges. On Wednesday morning the Committee on Lodges under Dispensation reported that it did not recommend giving Owyhee Lodge their charter, but recommended that Brother Lafayette Cartee, of Boise Lodge # 37 visit Owyhee Lodge and examine their work, correct irregularities, and report the same at next Annual Communication of this Grand Lodge. This recommendation was approved. The Grand Lodge was closed in Ample Form.

On Wednesday evening, June 26, 1867, The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Mason of Oregon was reconvened. The Committee on Subordinate Chapters reported they had examined the application for a Charter to be granted as per annexed petition, and having examined the recommendation of Dallas Chapter, No. 6, and the several demits of the Companions applying, recommended that a Charter be granted them under the name of Idaho Chapter, No. 8.

The motion was adopted.

The Grand Chapter installed the new Grand Chapter Officers and closed in Ample Form.

The Charter issued by the Grand Chapter of Oregon was recorded by General Grand Chapter as a dispensation to form and open a chapter of Royal Arch Masons at Bannock City (now Idaho City), Idaho. The new chapter was regularly constituted August 21, 1867, by Lafayette F. Cartee of Boise, a past high priest of Multnomah Chapter No. 1, Oregon City, Oregon. The first officers of the new Chapter were: George H. Coe, high priest; Jonas W. Brown, king; George A. Dunn, scribe; Henry T. Sayers, treasurer and Powhattan E. Edmondson, secretary.

Companion Cartee was well known in Masonic circles in Oregon. He was active in Grand Lodge and was twice elected Grand Scribe in Grand Chapter in Oregon. He was also involved in the founding of Multnomah Chapter No.1 and was its High Priest at the formation of the Oregon Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Oregon.

There being four regularly chartered Lodges in the Territory besides one under dispensation, the Brethren decided to form a Grand Lodge according to the Masonic custom and usage. Accordingly, a convention of Free and Accepted Masons delegated by the several Lodges in the Territory of Idaho assembled in the Masonic Hall in Idaho City, Territory of Idaho, on December 16, 1867, for the purpose of establishing a Grand Body of the Craft for the Territory of Idaho.

Bro. Lafayette F. Cartee offered the following resolution: "Resolved, That in the judgment of this convention Idaho Lodge, No. 35, Boise Lodge, No. 37, Placer Lodge, No. 38, and Pioneer Lodge, No. 12, are legally constituted and chartered Lodges of Free and Accepted Masons, and that the representatives of said Lodges are authorized and fully empowered to organize a Grand Lodge in Idaho." This resolution was adopted.

The following resolution was presented by Bro. Lafayette F. Cartee and duly adopted: "Resolved, that a Lodge of Master Masons be now opened for the purpose of organizing and opening the Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons of Idaho Territory." A Lodge of Master Masons was then opened in due form, the following named Brethren acting as officers: P. E. Edmondson, Worshipful Master; George S. Inness, Senior Warden; I. B. Curry, Junior Warden; John Kennaly, Senior Deacon; S. B. Connelly, Junior Deacon; George H. Coe, Secretary and J. D. Galbraith, Tyler.

On motion of Bro. Lafayette F. Cartee those present proceeded to elect Grand Officers for the ensuing year.

The following Brethren were declared duly elected officers of the Grand Lodge: George H. Coe, Grand Master; G. W. Paul, Deputy Grand Master; A. Haas, Senior Grand Warden; George T. Young, Junior Grand Warden; S. B. Connelly, Grand Treasurer; P. E. Edmondson, Grand Secretary; I. B. Curry, Senior Grand Deacon and John Merrill, Junior Grand Deacon.

A committee of five on constitution was appointed composed of Jonas W. Brown, Lafayette F. Cartee, T. E. Logan, George T. Young and S. B. Connelly, which committee reported recommending the adoption of the Constitution of the Grand Lodge of Oregon with the following amendments, to wit: Art. 1 — the style and title of this Grand Lodge shall be the Grand Lodge of Ancient Free and Accepted Masons of Idaho Territory; Art. III, Sec. 1 — Strike out the word Portland and insert Idaho City; Art. V, Sec. 1, was amended so that each Past Master was given one vote. Art. IX, Sec. 1, be amended to read "Seventy-five dollars upon issuing a dispensation, and twenty-five dollars when charter shall be granted.

Worshipful P. E. Edmondson, Past Master, then installed Bro. George H. Coe as Most Worshipful Grand Master, and the Grand Master then installed the following named officers: Bro. George W. Paul, Deputy Grand Master; Bro. A. Haas, Senior Grand Warden; Bro. George T. Young, Junior Grand

Warden; Bro. I. B. Curry, Senior Grand Deacon; Bro. John Merrill, Junior Grand Deacon; Bro. S. B. Connelly, Grand Treasurer; Bro. P. E. Edmondson, Grand Secretary; Bro. W. R. Bishop, Grand Chaplain; Bro. L. F. Cartee, Grand Orator; Bro. Jonas W. Brown, Grand Marshal; Bro. M McCormick, Grand Steward; Bro. J. R. Maulding, Grand Steward; Bro. A. G. Brown, Grand Standard Bearer; Bro. L. P. Mikkelsen, Grand Sword Bearer; Bro. H. A. Mattox, Grand Bible Bearer; Bro. J. M. Connelly, Grand Pursuivant and Bro. J. D. Galbraith, Grand Tyler.

The Lodge of Master Masons was then closed in due form and the convention having completed the business for which it had assembled was finally dissolved. In the Grand High Priest's Report to the Grand Chapter of Oregon at their Eighth Annual Convocation on Monday June 22, 1868, MEC B. F. Brown reported that in July 1867, he issued to Companion Lafayette Cartee, his proxy which empowered him to institute said chapter and to install its officers. He informed MEC Brown that he performed that duty and he called MEC Brown's attention that according to the constitution of the General Grand Chapter that we had no right or authority to grant the charter. MEC Brown investigated the matter and became satisfied that our actions had been too hasty and without deliberation which the case demanded. He then contacted MEC John L. Lewis, GGHP and advised him of the situation. He requested that the GGHP issue them a charter. This Charter was issued at the next triennial held in St. Louis, Mo., on September 18, 1868. MEC Brown also advised that he had been contacted on January 10, 1868 he received a request from a group of companion at Boise City, asking for a Dispensation for a Chapter in that city. He returned their petition and recommended that they contact Idaho Chapter No. 8.

The second Chapter in Idaho, Cyrus Chapter No. 2 was organized at Silver City and was convened on March 8, 1870 by authority of a Dispensation issued by MEC James W. Austin, GGHP, dated February 21, 1870. The petition was signed by Companions: George H. Coe, Richard Miller, David H. Fogus, H. R. Carter, Henry Maguire, Robert W. Griffith, John Scales, Francis E. Ensign and James L. Hall. The Chapter was constituted by Companion Francis Ensign on January 29, 1872. The following Companions were installed as officers: George H. Coe, High Priest; R.F. Miller, King; David H. Fogus, Scribe; R. H. Seamon, Treasurer; J. Huelet, Secretary; H. R. Carter, Captain of the Host; J. L. Hall, Principal Sojourner; B.M. Davis, Royal Arch Captain; W. F. Carter, Master of Third Veil; W. S Stevens, Master of Second Veil; John Scales, Master of First Veil and Lars P. Mikkelsen, Sentinel.

The third Chapter in Idaho was found in Boise City. The petition was filed January 9, 1870, but the Dispensation was not issued by the GGHP until March 30, 1870. The Charter was granted by the General Grand Chapter on September 20, 1871, naming the three principal officers as Augustus J. Thibodo, high priest; Augustine Haas, king and Henry C. Riggs, scribe.

The fourth Chapter in Idaho was located in Lewiston. Its charter was

granted by General Grand Chapter on August 27, 1880. It was constituted by companion Andrew McCalley, past high priest of Walla Walla Chapter No. 1 on March 26, 1881. The principal officers were the following companions: Chester P. Coburn, high priest; S. C. Hale, king; B. F. Morris, scribe and H. Squire, secretary.

The fifth Chapter in Idaho was Alturas Chapter No. 5 of Hailey, Idaho. It was issued a Dispensation by MEC Alfred F. Chapman, GGHP on May 22, 1884. The Charter was issued on October 1, 1886 and the Chapter was constituted on April 9, 1887 by Joseph M. Burkett. This Chapter lasted seven years before returning their Charter.

The sixth Chapter in Idaho was Pocatello Chapter # 6. Its petition was filed on April 18, 1889 and Dispensation was issued on May 28, 1889 by MEC Noble D. Larner, GGHP. The Charter was granted by General Grand Chapter on November 22, 1889 and the chapter was constituted on October 11, 1890.

On June 16, 1908, the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons was formed in Pocatello, Idaho.

George H. Coe, the first Grand Master of Idaho, came to Idaho from Siskiyou County, California, about 1863. He died at San Francisco, California, December 17, 1873, where he had gone for medical treatment. His death was lamented by all true men and Masons who knew him. He was loved by his Brethren and highly esteemed as an upright man in business, as well as an ardent and warm-hearted friend and Mason. His departure left a void in the Grand Jurisdiction of Idaho not easily filled. Those who met him in the performance of his duties in the Grand Lodge were favorably impressed by his genial presence, his kind and fraternal demeanor, and his firm integrity of purpose in the performance of all duties devolving upon him. He held and worthily earned a place in the affections and memory of his Brethren. He was the first High Priest of Idaho Chapter No. 1 and Cyrus Chapter No. 2.

Edward A. Stevenson was the seventh Grand Master of Idaho, having been elected in 1876, 1877 and 1878, three years in succession and again in 1887. Brother Stevenson died July 6, 1895. From a biographical history in the Grand Lodge proceedings the following is extracted: "Edward Augustus Stevenson was born June 15, 1825, at Lowville, Lewis County, New York. At an early age the family removed to Michigan, settling in Washtenaw County. He was educated in the common schools of New York and Michigan and Grass Lake Academy, at Grass Lake, Jackson County, Michigan. He came to California on the steamer 'California,' in 1849, around Cape Horn. Served as Alcalde and Deputy Sheriff of El Dorado County, and served in the Legislature of 1853-54-55, as a representative from that county. During the time, he was largely engaged in mining. In 1856, he was appointed Indian Agent of the Nomelacka and Nomekult Indian Reservations, during which service he traversed all of Northern California, Southern and Eastern Oregon, and Western Idaho in search of hostiles, concluding treaties with a number of

tribes, among them being the celebrated Modocs. In November, 1859, he was married at Red Bluff, Tehama County, California, to Annie D. Orr. In 1860, he was elected to the Legislature from Tehama County and was elected unanimously Speaker pro tern of the House. In December, 1863, he came to Idaho, locating at Pioneerville, in Boise Basin, engaging actively in placer mining. He was elected twice to each house of the Idaho Legislature, serving as Speaker of the eighth session. He was appointed Governor of Idaho by President Cleveland in 1885, serving four years, during which time, by his now celebrated telegram, he induced the President to "pocket" veto the bill to divide Idaho, and annex the northern portion to Washington. In 1894, he was the Democratic candidate for Governor of Idaho, but was defeated although running largely ahead of his ticket. His Masonic record compares favorably with that of his civil life. In 1857, he was entered in Vesper Lodge, No. 84, at Red Bluff, California. He was passed and raised February 13, 1869, in Pioneer Lodge, No. 4, Idaho. He served as Secretary, Junior and Senior Wardens and Worshipful Master of that Lodge. In 1872, was elected Senior Grand Warden of the Grand Lodge of Idaho. In 1874 was appointed Deputy Grand Master, and elected Grand Master in 1876-77-78 and 1887. For many years he was chairman of the Board of Trustees of the Grand Lodge Orphan Fund. He was Grand Representative of California and Wyoming and a member of the Masonic Veterans Association of the Pacific Coast. He was a member of Idaho Chapter, No. 1, R. A. M., in which body he served as King and Scribe. At the time of his death he was a member of Boise Lodge, No. 2, in Boise City. He spent the winter of 1891-5 in Washington, D. C., laboring for several matters of importance to Idaho, and while there was attacked with sciatica. On recovering he returned home in March, but was shortly re-attacked. On advice of his physicians he went to Paraiso Springs, in California, for treatment and for a time improvement was noticed, but the disease finally triumphed and on July 6, 1895, he passed away leaving a widow and son to mourn his loss. His funeral was the largest ever seen in Boise City."

Lafayette F. Cartee was the eleventh Grand Master of Idaho. He was a very honorable man, the quintessence of high-mindedness and one in whom every confidence might be reposed. He was dearest to his friends who knew him best. The writer visited him almost daily through a long and fatal illness and at his special request read the Masonic burial service at his grave. The Committee on Necrology of the Grand Lodge of which the writer was chairman, made the following report on his death, the report being unanimously adopted, viz: "It once more becomes the unpleasant duty of a committee to chronicle the demise of a Brother, and, unpleasant as it is, it becomes doubly so when necessity compels us to express in words the grief we undergo at the taking off of one who, by long association, unfeigned piety, and sincere devotion to Masonry has endeared himself to the Craft. Although long expected, yet when on the morning of the 2d of September of this year (1891), the announcement was made that Brother Lafayette Cartee had passed away, the shock benumbed the heartstrings of many a Brother of the Mystic Tie. The distinguished subject of this report was born December 2, 1823, at Syracuse, New York. After graduating from an excellent educational institution, we find him Professor of Mathematics in St. John's College, Cincinnati,

Ohio. Becoming seized of that fever which influenced the Argonauts of old, he came, in 1849, to California, in quest of that yellow metal which, siren like, lured many of the true and brave to the Pacific Slope. On this Coast he has since remained, occupying many important and responsible positions. After serving a term in the Oregon Legislature as Speaker of the House in 1854, he accepted, early in the sixties, the position of superintendent and engineer of construction of the rail-roads along the Columbia River, which were then built by the Oregon Steam Navigation Company. In 1863 he removed to Idaho, and at Rocky Bar erected the first quartz mill in the new Territory. Upon the organization of Idaho as a Territory, he was appointed its first United States Surveyor General, which responsible position he ably filled for fourteen years. Becoming a resident of Boise City in 1866, he devoted much of his attention to horticulture, and bears the proud distinction of being the father of the fruit-growing industry of Idaho. As a citizen General Cartee was one of the most progressive men of the time, devoted to the public welfare and an earnest advocate of every movement calculated to promote the public good. As a man he was one of nature's noblemen, pure in his public and private life, gentle and forgiving with the erring, bold and fearless in defense of right. As a Mason his life record for over thirty years speaks for itself. His Masonic career in Idaho commenced on April 6, 1867, when he affiliated with Boise Lodge, No. 37, then under the jurisdiction of Oregon; and on December 16, 1867, was one of the representatives of that Lodge, of which he was a Past Master, in the convention which organized the Grand Lodge of Idaho. It was he who offered the resolution that put the breath of life into the new Grand Lodge and started it on its noble career. He was the first Grand Orator of this Grand Lodge. In 1871 he was elected Grand Secretary, and served the Grand Lodge in that important position for the years 1872 and 1879. In 1881 he was appointed Deputy Grand Master, and in 1882 was elected to the highest position within the gift of his Brethren, which he filled with marked ability, and with strict adherence to the principles of Masonic jurisprudence, to the study of which he was deeply devoted. During the twenty-four years of the existence of this Grand Lodge the familiar face of Brother Cartee was absent but at one session, and then only under adverse circumstances, which rendered it physically impossible for him to attend. As we glance around this Lodge room today we feel deeply the magnitude of our loss. Our Brother is not with us. He exists only in the recollections of his many virtues, engraved on our hearts and minds, and in those manly tones which still seem ringing through our ears. Noble Brother! We have laid you in the tomb, there to sleep under the fragrant acacia until the trumpet on that eventful morn shall summon us all into the present' of the Grand Architect of the Universe. Until then, dear Brother, until then, farewell!" Brother Cartee was buried by the Grand Lodge September 4, 1891.

Henry E. Prickett was the ninth Grand Master of Idaho. Brother Prickett came to Idaho in 1864 from Wisconsin. In 1864-5 he served as Deputy Clerk of the District Court of Boise County. In 1866 he removed to Boise City, which place was his home during the remaining years of his life. During these years he was almost constantly in public office, as Deputy Collector of Internal Revenue, member of the Legislative Council, Acting United

States District Attorney, and finally for eight and one-half years, Associate justice of the Supreme Court of Idaho. Brother Prickett was made a Mason in Jackson County, Wisconsin, in or about 1854. Nothing further is known of his Masonic record prior to coming to Idaho. He was one of the founders of Shoshone Lodge, No. 7, and served for several years as its Worshipful Master. As early as 1870 he was on the Committee on jurisprudence of this Grand Lodge, and the same year was elected Grand Secretary. In 1872 he was appointed Grand Orator; in 1878 was elected Senior Grand Warden, and in 1880, Grand Master. He died in Hailey, Alturas County, June 14, 1885, and was buried by this Grand Lodge with Masonic honors in Boise City, July 16, 1885. Brother Pickett was no ordinary man. Endowed with intellectual gifts of a high order, he was recognized as a leader among men. For years previous to his death he suffered greatly from physical infirmities, but his indomitable will over-mastered the weakness of the flesh and he was found at his post of duty when others would have sought relief and rest in quietude and retirement. He was zealous, able, and conscientious in every office he held, political, judicial and Masonic and these qualities gave him preferment among his fellows. His fidelity and skill as a Master Workman were rewarded with the highest gift his Brethren in the Masonic Craft could bestow. In his death the Fraternity in Idaho lost a wise and prudent counselor, and the community at large, a beloved citizen and an eminent and peerless jurist.

James W. Griffin was the sixth Grand Master of Idaho. Brother Griffin was born in Sebec, Maine, on August 29, 1820. While yet a child he removed with his parents to Brooklyn, a seaport town in Hancock County, Maine. The sight of the great ocean aroused the venturesome spirit of the boy, and at the age of fourteen years he made his first voyage on the sea. For twenty-nine years the sea was his home, and during that time he sailed to almost all parts of the world. He was Master of a vessel before he had attained to the age of manhood. In 1842 he was married in Brooklyn, N. Y., and for more than twenty years his wife was his companion upon his voyages. In 1849, he, for the first time, visited the Pacific Coast, having sailed around Cape Horn. He retired from the sea in 1863, and in the following year came to Idaho, settling in Boise City. Here he was for many years engaged in conducting a hotel. He retired from the labors and anxieties of the more active pursuits of life a few years prior to his death on account of the frail condition of his health. Brother Griffin was made a Mason in Brooklyn Lodge, No. 285, Brooklyn, N. Y., in 1856, or before. His Masonic record in Idaho as near as it can be ascertained is as follows: He became a member of Boise Lodge, No. 2, April 29, 1865, and in 1868 was elected Senior Warden, and in 1869, Worshipful Master of that Lodge. In 1870 he was elected Grand Treasurer, which office he continued to hold until 1875, at which time he was promoted to the more exalted station of Grand Master. After his retirement from the Grand East until the session of 1885, Brother Griffin was a regular and faithful attendant upon the communications of the Grand Lodge; ever welcome because of his genial courtesy, and his wise counsel. Brother Griffin is fraternally remembered for those splendid qualities of heart and mind which endeared him to his Brethren. His zeal for the institution of Masonry, united with a fearlessness born of a conscientious love of truth, made him a

safe guide for his younger and less experienced Brethren. Personally and socially he was amiable and winning. Gentle and genial in character and disposition, he was yet a man of deep convictions and firm will. A profound religious sentiment pervaded his character and shaped his life. He was ever alert to the call of duty, and every trust was performed with cheerful alacrity and fidelity. He was a noble man, a faithful Brother, a true Mason — one who possessed to an unusual degree, the love and esteem of the Craft. After a protracted sickness, Brother Griffin was called from earthly labor to celestial refreshment on July 27, 1885, and on the twenty-eighth day of the same month his mortal remains were deposited in the grave by his Brethren of the Grand Lodge.

James Collier Herndon was born to John Charles Herndon and Lucile Tway Herndon, July 26, 1941 in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. He grew up in Salmon, Idaho where he attended local schools. He graduated as valedictorian of Salmon High School in 1959, and received his Bachelor of Arts and Juris Doctorate Degrees from the University of Idaho.

James was married to Tommye R. Low. He has five children, Heidi, Lora, Sarah, Lacrechia, and John, and sixteen grandchildren. Daughters Heidi and Lora are Past Honored Queens of Salmon Bethel #34 IOJD of Idaho; Heidi served the Grand Bethel as Grand Inner Guard and Lora as Grand Junior Princess and as Bethel Guardian, Bethel #6 Meridian, Idaho. Daughter Lacrechia is a Past Honored Queen of Blackfoot Bethel # 46 and son John is a Master mason and member of Grove City Lodge #33 A.F. & A.M. of Blackfoot, Idaho. Tommye served as Guardian of Bethel #46 and was a past grand officer, Grand Chapter of Idaho Order of Eastern Star, a Past Matron and Past Secretary of Esther Chapter #14 and a member of Hugh Duncan Chapter 2, Order of Eastern Star.

James took over his father's law practice in Salmon, Idaho after his father Charles Herndon's untimely death in an airplane crash while campaigning for Governor of Idaho. Judge Herndon also served as "pro-tem" judge on the Idaho Supreme Court from time to time.

Herndon mediated cases for other judges while he was sitting judge. The "Settlement Week" he held in the mid 1980's pioneered mediation in Idaho. He has continued to mediate cases since leaving the bench. Herndon is currently a member of the law firm Pike, Herndon, Stosich & Johnston, and continues to actively support and participate in mediation.

Brother Herndon is an ordained Episcopal Deacon and has served on the Episcopal Diocese of Idaho Standing Committee (president), Diocesan Council and as Dean and Archdeacon of the Eastern Deanery and as Chancellor.
