REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON FINANCIAL REVIEW

Grand York Rite Bodies of Idaho Financial Review for the year ending December 31, 2013 April 6, 2014

For year 2013, the Grand York Rite Bodies of Idaho upgraded the accounting system from a simple spread sheet to Quickbooks Pro. The benefits of this upgrade are more accurate financial reporting and financial reports at the Grand Treasurer's fingertips.

I have examined the Quickbooks records and bank statements and have found the records to be accurate.

The beginning balance in the Grand York Rite checking account on January 1, 2013, was \$762.14. The ending balance on December 31, 2013, was \$6,506.48, with no outstanding checks.

Our Grand Secretary/ Recorder/ Treasurer is Bonded. That insurance has been maintained for the last five years.

Recommendations: Two signatures on checks for accountability.

We may be able to get a better return on our investments through a mutual fund than in CD's.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON YORK RITE INVESTMENTS

To the Most Excellent Grand High Priest and Companions of the Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons of Idaho, the Most Illustrious Grand Master and Companions of the Grand Council Cryptic Masons of Idaho, and the Right Eminent Grand Commander and Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Idaho:

GRAND YORK RITE BODIES OF IDAHO

We, your joint Committee on Idaho York Rite Investment Funds, beg to report the following:

We have examined the Balance and Ledger Sheets and the combined spreadsheets for all three bodies, along with the individual Ledger Sheets, are in agreement.

During the calendar year 2013, the Grand York Rite Bodies of Idaho had **\$244,852.84 invested** for the full year with a return of **\$8,052.88**, or 3.2889%. The total Investments were **\$245,852.84** with a total return of **\$8,063.90** or 3.2799%. These numbers are **1.08-1.00% less** than last year.

We expect a more favorable return next year if the proposed Investment Legislation passes. A directed investment program is the only way; this committee can assure a favorable return without robbing funds from future returns. By utilizing a Directed Investment approach the highs even out the lows when the market drops. This is the approach the Grand Lodge of Idaho has taken with very positive results. This style of approach would allow a guaranteed return on memberships which would make returns more respectable.

We thank you for the opportunity to serve the Grand York Rite Bodies of Idaho.

REPORT OF GRAND YORK RITE COMMITTEE ON YORK RITE OBJECTIVES ACCOUNT & ENDOWMENT FUND

To the Most Excellent Grand High Priest and Companions of the Grand Chapter, Royal Arch Masons of Idaho, the Most Illustrious Grand Master and Companions of the Grand Council Cryptic Masons of Idaho, and the Right Eminent Grand Commander and Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery of Idaho:

We, your joint Committee on York Rite Objectives & Endowment Funds, beg to report the following;

The York Rite Endowment Fund was established from a bequest from Most Excellent Companion and Sir Knight Alton T. (Skinny) Kauffman, who had the foresight and wisdom to anticipate a decrease in membership sooner or later in the York Rite of Idaho. The income from the Endowment Fund is placed in the Grand York Rite Objectives Account. After two years, any portion of the income remaining is transferred to the Corpus of the Endowment Fund, for future growth of that fund.

For the year 2013, the Endowment Fund end balance was **\$60,589.34** and its yield was **\$1,992.78** in income (3.2889%) The remaining income from **2011**, **\$96.96**, was transferred to the Corpus of the Endowment Fund, which now has a balance of **\$60,528.44** leaving **\$6,499.36** in the Objectives Account.

(Notes: It is stated that the end balance for 2013 (should be 2012) was **\$60,589.34**. So why is the beginning balance in the reported table **\$60,438.70**? The beginning balance on the Objectives Account should be \$5,985.80. There was Accrued Interest on the Objectives Account of **\$.53** that wasn't reported. The Actual Interest Earned on the Endowment Fund is **\$1,976.67**. The remaining, unused 2011 Endowment Interest is **\$230.78** (vice **\$96.96**) which is transferred to the Endowment Fund giving a balance of **\$60,820.12**.)

The structure of the York Rite Investments requires that only the interest income of the Endowment Fund be expended through the Objectives Fund. The Committee further defined that no more than 90% of the income be distributed to the three bodies. The remainder is held for emergency's and if not utilized within the two year timeframe is transferred back to the Corpus of the Endowment Fund to help insure the Fund's growth.

For the information of the Companions and Sir Knights, the investments of all funds of the Grand York Bodies of Idaho, are placed in Edward Jones accounts. Income is placed in money market accounts of Edward Jones, until needed.

We your Committee strongly recommend serious consideration of the Proposed Legislation to change the Investments and Endowment to a Directed Fund.

IN MEMORIAM Most Puissant George C. Sellars General Grand Master 2011-2014

Born: June 23, 1938 - Died: February 10, 2013

Our Most Puissant General Grand Master Sellars began his Masonic journey in Composite Lodge No. 499, F. & A.M. of Michigan. Over his 44 year Masonic career he has always been a very dedicated and faithful Mason. He had distinguished himself throughout the Craft, but especially in the York Rite of Freemasonry. George has had the opportunity to serve in many leadership positions locally and nationally throughout the craft over that time with the latest being his election in August 2011 to the office of Most Puissant General Grand Master of the General Grand Council, Cryptic Masons, International. He truly was a Mason's Mason.

Brother George was a man of integrity and strength, an individual that radiated a true sense of warmth and brotherly love. He exemplified the following characteristics throughout his work and Masonic careers: play fair, love life enthusiastically, live up to your commitments, pursue high performance at all levels, build value through sound practices, and live out your religious and Masonic tenets to their fullest. These traits I'm sure is what made him a great athlete, soldier, husband, father and mason.

Brother George always realized no matter what Masonic office he held, he was first and foremost a brother mason on the level with all others of the fraternity. He always tried to convey that thought in all his encounters with members of the craft. He radiated a spirit of welcome and joy, and we can say we will truly miss his smile and laughter.

George's dedication to his beloved wife Brenda for fifty-one years and to his family testifies to the truth that love is a valued attribute to have while living out this earthly pilgrimage. effect on everything from Annual Returns to Reports to Proceedings. We have some Chapters, Councils and Commanderies who have not reported in almost two years. This is often a sign of larger problems, such as those which caused Two Chapters and Two Councils to merge this past year. We also saw the approval for a change in By-Laws for two Chapters to meet jointly. This is an approach which will help each Chapter to meet and maybe even thrive as both showed increases in members. We also saw the approval for a change in By-Laws for some Chapters. All three heads of bodies requested a copy of current or latest By-Laws. This office received a limited number of By-Laws from the Constituent Chapters, Councils and Commanderies. This request will not go away, as it was two-fold. First, we are trying to establish a statewide repository for By-Laws and secondly, it was an attempt to get our Constituent Chapters, Councils and Commanderies to review their By-Laws and update them where necessary and to provide the Grand Officers an opportunity to review current By-Laws to identify areas which need changing to comply with our Code of Laws.

Annual Returns were received from 11 Chapters, Seven (7) Councils and Seven (7) Commanderies. Annual returns were e-mailed to all Chapters; Councils and Commanderies. The Annual Returns returned were for the most part found to be without major errors; however, some constituent Secretary's and Recorders need to pay more attention to the annual report. Remember, this office is dependent upon the receipt of accurate information. When the Annual Returns are received, they are checked against the Monthly Reports for accuracy. When information is not received, I can only verify with the information I have.

I have been a Grand York Rite Officer, in one capacity or another, for over 25 years. It has become abundantly apparent it is time to pass the torch to someone new. There are a couple of individuals I would never recommend; one has an "It's my way or the highway " attitude, the other travels constantly because of other obligations, he would not be present to provide the necessary services the Companions and Sir Knights have become accustomed to. He would have to have an assistant to do his work for him, and then, as he previously has done, would take all the credit for the assistant's work.

Companions and Sir Knights, the Grand York Rite of Idaho has a problem. We have too many who have been appointed to lines, elected to positions and served as heads of bodies who have not learned what their job really was. In other words they don't have a clue as to what they are doing or why. They are there for one reason- They are "TITLE-SEEKERS". They didn't pay attention to matters as they progressed; and all of a sudden they find themselves as a head of the body, and don't have a clue as what to do. How to introduce guests or any of the Masonic Rudiments connected with the job. They will not give freely of their time, resources, or efforts required; as was envisioned by our Forefathers. They have failed and we have failed them. Why? Because we, (the Grand York Rite Bodies) have a problem. We have failed to provide the proper training for them to accomplish their jobs.



This year the Heads of the Grand York Rite (GYR) Bodies traveled extensively. Visits to our Sister Jurisdictions of Alaska, Oregon, Montana, Washington, Wyoming, Colorado, Utah, and Nevada were made. These visitations are always informative. They are a great way to gather ideas and to see what is working in other York Rite jurisdictions. They also promote unity and support among York Rite Jurisdictions in the Northwest.

The Heads of the GYR Bodies also traveled extensively within Idaho visiting every Chapter, Council and Commandery. Often other Grand York Rite officers attend the visits with the Heads of the Grand York Rite and often the Heads of the GYR Bodies are together during these visits. This gives the Heads of the GYR Bodies and their officer's ample opportunity to communicate among themselves and Idaho Companions and Sir Knights.

Visitations are a great way to keep the Idaho York Rite Bodies connected as most Companions and Sir Knights belong to all three bodies.

In conclusion, it can be said that the Heads of your GYR Bodies in Idaho have worked well together this year and that unity prevails with the York Rite Masons of Idaho.

I have tried my best to reduce GYR expenses.

With the gracious expert guidance of Companion and Sir Knight James G. Cox, the Grand York Rite Books have been transitioned from a Quicken software program base to a Quick Books Professional Software program base. The QBP Software has capabilities to produce a wide range of reports, which the Quicken base does not have.

Companions and Sir Knights, this office thrives on information. When Constituent Chapters, Councils and Commanderies fail to report it has an

Every time we have a poor leader it takes the body five (5) years to recover. When we have several in a row it takes much longer maybe a generation. That is happening rapidly. Look at the people you have elected to your lines. It is time for you to get off your duffs and get to work not only on recruiting new members but also on retention of existing members. Don't think you can rely on electronic media for everything! The majority of the mature members are not proficient in use of electronic media. Furthermore they have no interest in learning how to use it. Get to work NOW before it's too late, if it isn't already!

During the past year following a suggestion received in 2012, a Travel Account was established for the heads of the three bodies. The MEGHP, MIGM and the REGC were issued a Debit Card for use in their travels. This has eliminated the need, for them, to turn in Receipts for Travel in order to be reimbursed. The account Statement contains the receipts and each head has been assigned a sub-account within the Quick Books Pro Software to track the expenditures. The account was created by transferring the amount of the Grand Body Heads Travel expense into the account, along with an additional amount to insure the account would not be charged fees for use of the cards and low balances. This Travel account has from my perspective worked well. I think the three heads of bodies will concur; it makes it simpler and easier for them. I am able to track the total expenditures through the monthly bank statements, and report to the heads of each body how much he has remaining in the account. I recommend continuing the use of this account.

EIGHTY-FIRST ANNUAL ASSEMBLY

The Grand Council of Idaho and I, as Most Illustrious Grand Master, were represented at the York Rite Grand Sessions of Utah and Nevada by Companion Johnny Willis. The Grand Council was also represented at the Grand Chapter of Eastern Star by Companion Art Shoemaker. We were represented at the Grand Assembly of Rainbow for Girls by Companion Gary LaBruyere.

STATE OF THE ORDER

The challenges that Cryptic Masonry faces in Idaho remain fundamentally unchanged. Declining membership and lack of participation of existing members are major areas of concern. We have a number of Councils that are really struggling and we lost the Council in Pocatello at the beginning of my term in office. Several Councils have difficulty generating a quorum for meetings even with the 6-man opening. Bringing Masons into our beautiful York Rite must be a priority in every Council and Cryptic Masonry must also work to find ways to promote participation in our Councils. We have members that we haven't seen in our Councils in a long time. We must contact them, be creative, and give them a reason to participate. There are tools to help, but they only help when used. This year I gave each Council a DVD promoting the York Rite to use in membership recruitment. It didn't seem to help our Program that is a proven way to help Councils. I have seen programs like this change the entire attitude of a lodge, chapter or council. It changed them from stagnant to active thriving bodies. However, not one Idaho Council completed the program this year.

Throughout this year, I have noted several things that successful Masonic organizations are doing. A successful organization may not be doing all of the things I have noted, but they are doing many of them. I will list them here and I invite you to evaluate your own Council to see if you are doing the things that result in success.

- Successful Councils are active in their communities. Unless Councils are willing to become active in their communities, I don't believe they will be able to sustain themselves.
- Successful Councils have long range plans. Unless a Council understands where it currently stands and what is required to meet its needs in the future, it is planning to fail.
- Successful Councils have enthusiasm for their craft.
- Successful Councils have fun before, during, and after meetings and activities.
- Successful Councils have their finances in order. Councils must budget annually. They must also conduct financial reviews annually.

- Successful Councils perform good, even great ritual. Ritual teaches the lessons of Masonry. The lessons are easier to understand and/or learn when the ritual is well done. We must demand quality of ourselves and be the example for future generations to come.
- Successful Councils visit other Councils. Past Grand Master Skip Owen said this about visitation. "The simple exercise of visiting gave birth to new life in several near death lodges. This gave rise to new energy not only to the craft but also to individual brothers. My brothers as we continue to network and help neighboring lodges the gift is returned many times over."
- Successful Councils have active mentoring and membership programs.
- Successful Councils have developed a system of communication that is used regularly with all members.
- Successful Councils train their officers. Our Councils are most vulnerable to failure if we don't have well trained, proficient officers ready to lead their Councils.

Until we decide to make changes in our Council, we are doomed to no more than the status quo.

It is important to note that there is a small solid group of dedicated Companions at work at each Council. I am encouraged by the work of our Companions in Clearwater River Council (UD) as they work to establish a new Council in Grangeville. I thank all the hard working Companions in each of our Councils. With your help, we will not only survive, but we will thrive in coming years.

The Grand York Rite Bodies of Idaho continue to be financially sound. I feel we have quality officers, but we are not working hard enough to improve our craft. This year I wanted to establish position descriptions for each Grand Council position. I abandoned the project due to an overall lack of participation. My thanks go to the officers who did help with the project. I still think position descriptions would add to our Grand Council and make the job of our officers easier and make them more effective officers.

RECOMMENDATIONS

I recommend that:

- 1. Joint Visitations of the three Grand York Rite Bodies continue. These are beneficial to the heads of the three bodies as well as to the Constituent Bodies involved.
- 2. All Companions utilize the Brother-To-Brother Pamphlet and the Membership DVD to inform Masons of our principles and the philanthropic work of the York Rite and to promote membership in our Councils.
- 3. All Councils participate in the Council of Excellence Program. This program promotes activity in the Council and variety in our meet-

ings. It also promotes Council activity in our communities. This activity will strengthen the Council and give members more reason to participate in Council events.

- 4. Councils develop regional degree teams or use help from the York Rite College when they are not able to do the degrees themselves.
- 5. Attendance at the Northwest Regional York Rite Conference needs to be encouraged within Grand Council and our individual Idaho Councils. Every Cryptic Mason is welcome and would benefit from the Conference.
- That we undertake a comprehensive review of Grand Council Committees to determine their effectiveness and better define their purposes.
- 7. That we undertake a comprehensive review of all constituent Councils to ascertain their effectiveness of operation and how Grand Council can help them.

Further, that the Grand Secretary/Recorder acting in concert with the Committee on Resolutions; Jurisprudence and Investments, work to insert the proper wording into the Constitution, By-Laws and Regulations in the appropriate Sections, etc. and publish the Revised Codes of Laws to reflect these changes. The proposed investment policy is similar to that currently being used by the Grand Lodge AF & AM of Idaho.

Assets shall be in the custody of the Secretary/Treasurer of the Committee, and the cost for the administration shall be paid from the revenue earned by the Prepaid Life Membership Account.

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

James Collier Herndon Most Excellent Grand High Priest 2013-2014

James Collier Herndon was born to John Charles Herndon and Lucile Tway Herndon, July 26, 1941 in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. He grew up in Salmon, Idaho where he attended local schools. He graduated as valedictorian of Salmon High School in 1959, and received his Bachelor of Arts and Juris Doctorate Degrees from the University of Idaho.

James was married to Tommye R. Low. He has five children, Heidi, Lora, Sarah, Lacrecia, and John, and sixteen grandchildren. Daughters Heidi and Lora are Past Honored Queens of Salmon Bethel #34 IOJD of Idaho; Heidi served the Grand Bethel as Grand Inner Guard and Lora as Grand Junior Princess and as Bethel Guardian, Bethel #6 Meridian, Idaho. Daughter Lacrecia is a Past Honored Queen of Blackfoot Bethel # 46 and son John is a Master mason and member of Grove City Lodge #33 A.F. & A.M. of Blackfoot, Idaho. Tommye served as Guardian of Bethel #46 and was a past grand officer, Grand Chapter of Idaho Order of Eastern Star, a Past Matron and Past Secretary of Esther Chapter #14 and a member of Hugh Duncan Chapter 2, Order of Eastern Star.

James took over his father's law practice in Salmon, Idaho after his father Charles Herndon's untimely death in an airplane crash while campaigning for Governor of Idaho. He practiced in Salmon for twenty years where he conducted a general civil and criminal law practice with emphasis on litigation. During his years as a private practitioner, Herndon served as Lemhi County Prosecuting Attorney from 1969 to 1973 and from 1983-1985. Herndon was first elected to the District Court bench in 1987 and served as a trial Judge in Idaho's Seventh Judicial District until December 31, 2006. In 1991, he accepted the position of Administrative District Judge for the Seventh Judicial District of the State of Idaho. He held this position for 14 years until retirement. In his term as Administrative District Judge, Herndon supported the establishment of mental and drug courts include adult misdemeanor, felony, juvenile and child protection drug courts with fourteen different judges presiding. Judge Herndon also served as "pro-tem" judge on the Idaho Supreme Court form time to time.

Herndon mediated cases for other judges while he was sitting judge. The "Settlement Week" he held in the mid 1980's pioneered mediation in Idaho. He has continued to mediate cases since leaving the bench. Herndon is currently a member of the law firm Pike, Herndon, Stosich & Johnston, and continues to actively support and participate in mediation.

Brother Herndon is an ordained Episcopal Deacon and has served on the Episcopal Diocese of Idaho Standing Committee (president), Diocesan Council and as Dean and Archdeacon of the Eastern Deanery and as Chancellor.

Brother Herndon was initiated and Entered Apprentice Mason on December 26, 1962, passed to the Degree of Fellowcraft Mason on May 28, 1963, and raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason on September 24, 1964 all in Lemhi Lodge No. 11 Ancient Free & Accepted Masons of Idaho. He twice served as Master of Lemhi Lodge #11 AF & AM. He later affiliated with Grove City Lodge #33, AF & AM, Blackfoot, Idaho, where he served four times as Master.

He served as District Deputy Grand Master of what is now the First Masonic District, in 1980-81 and 1981-82. In 1996 he was appointed to the Grand Lodge of Idaho Grand Line by then Grand Master David Olehy. Brother Herndon was elected and served as Grand Master of the Grand Lodge Ancient Free and Accepted Masons in Idaho in 2005-2006.

Companion Herndon received the Degree of Royal Arch Mason on February 15, 1967. He is a past High Priest of Salmon Chapter No. 14 Royal Arch Masons (1973, 1974) and Idaho Falls Chapter No. 10 Royal Arch Masons (2002-2003). He served as District Deputy Grand High Priest, 1st District, 2002-2003; became a member of the Order of the High Priesthood, 1973 and was installed as the Most Excellent Grand High Priest Royal Arch masons of Idaho for the 2013-2014 year.

Companion Herndon served as Illustrious Master of Jeremiah Council #9, Idaho Falls, 2002-2003; he was exalted as Thrice Illustrious Master in 2003; and was elected and served as Most Illustrious Grand Master of Cryptic Masons of Idaho 2008-2009.

Sir Knight Herndon was created a Knight Templar in 1967, in Salmon Commandery No. 9, Salmon, Idaho. He is a Past Commander of Salmon Commandery No. 9 (1974, 1992, 1993, and 1994) and a Past Commander of Idaho Falls Commandery No. 6. He was elected Right Eminent Grand Commander of Knights Templar in Idaho in 2001. He was invested with the rank and dignity of Knight Commander of the Temple (KCT) by the Grand Encampment Knights Templar, USA, He was appointed by Sir Knight Richard B. Baldwin, GCT, MEGM, as Department Commander of the Northwest Department for the 2006-2009 Triennium. He was appointed to the Committee on Jurisprudence for the 2009-2012 and the 2012-2015 Trienniums. He is a trustee for the Knights Templar Eye Foundation. He is a member of St Bernard Commandery No. 41, Knights Templar stationed at Denver, Colorado.

A member of Boise Valley of the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite, Southern Jurisdiction, Jim received the 32nd Degree on April 23, 1977 and was nominated to the KCCH and invested on November5, 2005. He was also coroneted with his 33rd Degree.

Knight Companion Herndon is a member of St Charles Conclave Red Cross of Constantine, He was initiated June 10, 1989 and coroneted Puissant Sovereign in December 1994. Jim is an honorary member of St. Michael Conclave, Boise, and St Patrick Conclave, Lewiston. He served as Vice-Intendant General Division of Idaho in 2002, Intendant General, Division of Idaho, 2003-2005, and was appointed as Grand Almoner of the Grand Conclave Red Cross of Constantine, 2005-2006. James was elected and served as the Grand Sovereign of the Ancient Military Order Red Cross of Constantine for the United States, Mexico and the Philippines 2010-2011. He received the Knights Grand Cross of Honor from RCC and The Grand Encampment.

The past Grand Sovereign comes from a Masonic Family. His Father, John Charles Herndon, was Past Master of Lemhi Lodge #11 AF & AM; Grand Master of Masons in Idaho in 1961-1962 and active in the York Rite, Shrine and Order of Eastern Star. Uncle Joe Herndon was Past Master of Lemhi Lodge #11 AF & AM, Past Grand High Priest Royal Arch Masons of Idaho; Past Grand Commander Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Idaho. Both his paternal and maternal grandfathers were active Masons. His mother and his Aunt Marjorie were Past Matrons of Hugh Duncan Chapter #2, Order of the Eastern Star, at Salmon.

Jim is a member and former Ambassador in El Korah Shrine, A.A. O. N. M. S. (Boise, Idaho) His other Masonic activities include: Past Sovereign of Fidelity Council No. 277, Allied Masonic Degree and a member of the Grand Council AMD, a Knight of the Red Brand of Eri College of Societas Rosicruciana in Civitatibus Foederatis (SRICF), IX Degree; Royal Order of Scotland Priory #130 (Clan Davidson, Idaho), Hugh Duncan Chapter No. 2, Order of Eastern Star (received 25 year pin from Hugh Duncan #2, 2013); Past Associate Guardian, IOJD, Idaho. He is currently the Executive Office r for Idaho De Molay and the recipient of the Legion of Honor, Order of De Molay.

He is a Past Eminent Preceptor and Knight Commander of Redemption Tabernacle No. XL, Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests (HRAKTP), and currently Third Pillar, Grand College, HRAKTP. Jim is a member of and Past Eminent Prior (2008-2009) of Idaho Priory No. 13, Knights of the York Cross of Honour and is a four quadrant KYGCH. REPORT OF THE MOST EXCELLENT GRAND HIGH PRIEST

To the Officers and Members of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Idaho: Greetings!

Welcome to the 106th Convocation Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Idaho.

I am pleased to also extend a warm welcome to our so many distinguished visitors--especially Brother Daniel B. Heberling, Most Worshipful Grand Master of Masons in Idaho, and the Most Excellent Grand High Priests representing neighboring jurisdictions.

You honor us by being here. We hope your visit is an enjoyable one and that you will return again to renew and cement friendships formed at this Grand Chapter. Our warmest fraternal greetings go with you when you return to your Grand Jurisdictions. We want you all to know that your friendship means a great deal to Royal Arch Masons in Idaho.

We are here today Companions to work for the best interests of Freemasonry, especially Royal Arch Masonry. We need to give due and careful consideration of all items of business. The welfare and prosperity of Capitular Masonry in Idaho, in some measure, at least, rests upon your actions during our current deliberations.

The time has now come for me to give an account of my year as Most Excellent Grand High Priest as required by our Constitution. There follows, therefore, a report of my official acts and recommendations which are submitted for your approval.

Appointments

Companion Anthony G. Such, Right Excellent Grand King, has demitted from Masonry. John W. Zeller, Sr., Past Grand High Priest has been appointed Grand King for this 106th Convocation. The Rev. Robert K. Perry, Excellent Grand Chaplain, has been excused due to a conflict with Easter religious services. Companion Johnny Willis, Past Grand High Priest, has been appointed Excellent Grand Chaplain for this 106th Convocation.

Dispensations/Mergers

Rupert Chapter#22 merged with King Solomon Chapter #16 on December 21, 2013. The Chapters will continue under King Solomon Chapter #22. The paperwork needs completed.

Pocatello Chapter #6 merged with Idaho Falls Chapter #10 on May, 2013. The Chapters will continue under Idaho Falls Chapter #10. The final paperwork has not been filed.

Cyrus Chapter #2 and Caldwell Chapters 19 did not merge; but they amended their bylaws so the two Chapters could meet together on the same night and rotate between Nampa and Caldwell.

Bylaws

Four Chapters responded to our request that Bylaws be updated and a true and correct copy be sent to the Grand Recorder. The Chapters were: Cyrus #2, Caldwell # 19, Idaho Falls #10, Keystone #29, and Moscow #7. Current Bylaws are still required from the remaining seven Chapters.

RARA

RARA is a nonprofit 501.C(3) tax exempt organization formed by the General Grand Royal Arch to fund research in the areas of Central Auditory Processing Disorder (CAPD) and Autism. The Idaho Chapters contributed \$4,844.16 to the Royal Arch Research Assistance program during the year 2013-2014. All but three of the Chapters participated.

Another \$300.00 was given by outside sources.

The total amount credited to Idaho for RARA contributions for the year 2013-2014 is \$5,144.16.

Recommendations

- 1. We improve our presentation of our ritual. This means that we set time aside time, perhaps one night a month, to memorize the opening and closing ceremonies and learn and practice our degree work so that we perform it well. The Chapters should open full (long) form more than once a quarter; if the York Rite bodies meet jointly we might need to use a separate night for practice.
- 2. We continue our contributions to Royal Arch Research Assistance Programs (RARA).
- We continue our support of the Northwest Regional York Rite Conference. The conference increases our opportunity for fellowship with our Northwestern Companions and provides an excellent resource for our programs.
- 4. The Grand York Rite bodies become involved in short and long-range planning and become proactive force for shaping our future.
- 5. We continue our membership in the General Grand Chapter of the Royal Arch Masons International.
- 6. We take an active role in the education and recruitment of candidates for the Blue Lodge and York Rite Masonry.
- 7. We maintain an active role in the Idaho Masonic Family Alliance (IMFA).
- 8. The Chapters who have not updated their Bylaws should do so.
- 9. A joint York Rite committee on finance should be officially approved by each of the three bodies. The joint committee should consist of three members from each body, and the chairman rotated each year.
- 10. Our Chapters should be community oriented and participate in community activities.
- 11. We actively support our youth organizations DeMolay, Job's Daughters, and Rainbow for Girls with our time and money.

State of the Order

Our budget per capita tax for the year 2014-2015 was reviewed at a preliminary finance committee meeting at Kennewick, WA. The recommendation is that the per capita remain at \$20.00 and the total budget monies not exceed the 2013-2014 budget.

We need to actively recruit them. Masonry is a way of life. We must actively share our Masonic philosophy and principles with those who are approaching our lodges and seeking admission, our tenets of brotherly love, fidelity, charity, temperance - to cite but a few are well worth sharing.

We will not be wasting our time by sharing our Masonic life with those who come after us. In a world where many people, especially our youth, express no moral code. The bridge we Masons are called to build in life is a moral and spiritual one.'

The proposed resolution appears to have been properly submitted. However, the committee has identified the following issues with regards to proper form and recommends referral to the Grand Chapter of Idaho Jurisprudence Committee.

- 1) Within the 2nd WHEREAS it provides that if the resolution is passed that \$600.00 is to be allocated to the Treasurer's position and appears to be in conflict with Article XIII Section 4. ".. and no appropriation of Grand Chapter funds shall be made without a report from this Committee to the Grand Chapter in session. This Committee shall: ..." It appears that the proposed resolution would remove the duty from the Finance Committee and potentially set a precedent for resolutions to assign appropriations of Grand Chapter Funds.
- 2) This resolution appears to require the adoption of Grand Chapter Resolution 02 and 03 concurrently or would place it in conflict with the Code of Laws and Regulations but was not presented as

such and should be referred to the Grand Chapter of Idaho Jurisprudence Committee.

1) This resolution appears to require the adoption of Grand Chapter Resolution 01 and 03 concurrently or would place it in conflict with the Code of Laws and Regulations but was not presented as such and should be referred to the Grand Chapter of Idaho Jurisprudence Committee.

REPORT OF THE JURISPRUDENCE COMMITTEE

To the Most Excellent Grand High Priest, Officers and Companions of the Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons of Idaho:

We your Jurisprudence Committee begs to report the following:

Report of the Jurisprudence Committee to the Most Excellent Grand High Priest of Royal Arch Masons of Idaho

Most Excellent Grand High Priest, Distinguished Guests, Companions.

1. The following resolutions R14-01 and R14-02 were properly submitted and are in proper form.

Whereas: The Code of Laws of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Idaho does not now contain language or direction for Chapters wishing to Merge or Consolidate.

And Whereas: The Grand Lodge AF & AM of Idaho within the Idaho Code and Digest contains language pertaining to Lodges wishing to Merge, or Consolidate; or Dissolve;

And Whereas: It is desirous to provide succinct direction for Chapters to follow when considering the mechanism by which Mergers, Consolidations or Dissolutions occur;

Now Therefore be it Resolved, the language contained within the Idaho Masonic Code and Digest is adopted by reference pertaining to Mergers, Consolidations or Dissolutions; More specifically as Resolutions R14-01; R14-02 of the Grand Chapter Code of Laws.

More specifically to wit:

ARTICLE XIX POWERS & DUTIES OF CHAPTERS

R14-01

(New Section to be added :) Section 8. MERGERS AND CONSOLIDATION

- a. Vote Required. A two-thirds favorable vote of all members present in each Chapter, taken by written ballot, shall be required to adopt a merger or a consolidation.
- b. Chapters May Merge. Providing a Chapter is willing to accept the Name, Number, Charter, By -Laws, and Officers of a nearby and conveniently located Chapter, it may terminate its own operations by merging with such a Chapter.
 - 1. A motion to merge shall be presented at a Stated Communication, written notice thereof shall be issued to all members within five days, and final action thereon shall be taken at the next Stated Communication. When the proposal to merge has been adopted, the Chapter shall issue a complete report of its membership, assets, property, obligations and liabilities, and a request that the proposed merger be adopted, to the Chapter with which it desires to merge.
 - 2. A Chapter receiving a request for merger shall present it at its first Stated Communication thereafter, give written notice to its entire membership, and final action thereon shall be taken at the next Stated Communication.
 - 3. When a merger is adopted by the Chapters involved, they shall each notify the Grand High Priest and Grand Secretary in writing. The Grand High Priest may approve or reject the merger, but when he approves it, the merger is final. All members, assets, property, obligations and liabilities shall be transferred and vested in the merged Chapter. The Charter of the merged Chapter shall be appropriately updated to record the date of merger, and the Charter of the terminated Chapter shall be delivered to the Grand Secretary who shall mark it void and return it to the merged Chapter.
- c. Chapters May Consolidate. Two or more conveniently located Chapters may voluntarily consolidate. A motion to consolidate shall be presented at a Stated Communication in each of the Chapters, written notice thereof shall be given to all members in each Chapter involved, and final action thereon shall be taken at the next Stated Communication in each Chapter.
- d. Consolidating Commission, By-Laws, High Priest, and Written No-

tice. Within five days after consolidation has been adopted in all Chapters involved, the High Priest of the oldest consolidating Chapter shall assemble the High Priest and Officers of the consolidating Chapter who shall function as a Consolidating Commission.

The Consolidating Commission shall select By-Laws from one of the consolidating Chapters which shall govern the consolidated Chapter, direct each of the consolidating Chapters to give written and timely notice to its entire membership announcing the date, time, and place for the first Stated Communication of the consolidated Chapter, and designate a qualified High Priest who shall assume the duties of that office until a successor is in-stalled.

- e. Members and Property, Offices Vacant. When notice of the first Stated Communication of the consolidated Chapter has been issued, all members, assets, property, obligations and liabilities of the consolidating Chapters shall be transferred and vested in the consolidated Chapter, and all offices in all Chapters involved shall be vacant except that of the designated High Priest.
- f. Officers, Business, and Installation. At the first Stated Communication of the consolidated Chapter the designated High Priest shall fill the offices, open the Chapter, and preside therein. In case the designated High Priest is not present, the members of the consolidating commission present shall promptly select another qualified High Priest to proceed.
 - 1. Business shall include the reading and approval of the Minutes from each of the consolidating Chapters which records the adoption of consolidation, such other business as the prescribed By-Laws require, the selection of a name and number for the consolidated Chapter, and election of officers.
 - 2. Officers of the consolidated Chapter shall be installed at any time prior to the next Stated Communication.
- g. Name, Number, and Charter. The name of the consolidated Chapter shall be such as the members present shall choose, and the number shall be selected from those previously assigned to any of the consolidating Chapters.
 - 1. If it is practical, the Grand High Priest may authorize the updating of a previously issued Charter, or he may direct the issuance of a new Charter. No fee shall be required.
 - 2. Each retired Charter shall be delivered to the Grand Secretary who shall mark it "VOID" and return it to the consolidated Chapter. (Revised April 2014)

ARTICLE XXII CHARTERS

R14-02

(New Section to be added)

SECTION 5. DISSOLUTION OF CHAPTERS

- a.. Voluntary Surrender of Charter. A resolution to surrender its charter may be presented at any stated communication of a Chapter. At a subsequent stated communication of which all members have been given due and timely notice, a vote may be taken. If two-thirds of the members present vote for the proposition and not more than nine votes against it, the act of surrender shall be considered final when, and not before approved by the Grand Chapter.
- b. Arrest of Charter. The charter of a Chapter may be arrested by the Grand High Priest until the next Annual Communication, at which time he shall report his reasons therefore.
- c. Restoration or Revocation of Charter. The Grand Chapter may restore, arrest, recall, revoke, annul or declare void the charter of any Chapter when considered for the best interests of the Fraternity. The arrest of a charter may be for a definite or indefinite period.
- d. Surrender of Property. Upon the surrender, revocation, or annulment of the charter of a Chapter, the last High Priest, Treasurer, Secretary or any other person having charge or in possession of any of its property shall deliver to the Grand Secretary, the charter, books, papers, jewels, furniture, monies and other property belonging to said Chapter, which shall vest in the Grand Chapter, subject to all legal and equitable rights of creditors of such demised Chapter in and to such property. (Revised April 2014)

This will provide succinct direction for the Constituent Chapter High Priests, Officers and Members to follow and a method by which future Mergers, Consolidations and Dissolutions may be tracked and occur in a businesslike manner preserving our history for future generations.

We therefore recommend approval of these changes to our By-Laws.

Now therefore be it Resolved; we propose the following amendment to our Grand Chapter Regulations as a "House Keeping" item; To Wit;

Therefore, if you wish to have accurate records it is necessary to have an accurate reporting system and requirement to do so.

- This section applies to all long-term investment funds maintained by the Grand York Rite Bodies of Idaho for any purpose, inclusive of, but not limited to, the Grand York Rite General Fund, Prepaid Life Membership Fund, and the York Rite Objectives and Endowment Fund. This section does not apply to cash maintained for normal day -to-day operating expenses of the Grand York Rite Bodies of Idaho. (Revised April 2014)
- 2) All Funds shall be comprised of the following securities and investments:
 - a) Any Fund that contains less than \$200,000 in fair market value shall be invested in mutual funds managed by one or more nationally recognized brokerage houses and mutual fund companies.
 - b) Any Fund that contains more than \$200,000 in fair market value may be invested in individual securities.
 - c) No less than 40% nor more than 70% of funds shall be invested in equity securities, stocks, or other securities.
 - d) No more than 60% nor less than 30% of invested funds may be held in certificates of deposit, corporate bonds, US government bonds, US Treasury Notes, or any other cash equivalent securities.
 - e) Individual stocks received by these Grand York Rite Bodies from any source should be divested within one year of receipt and the funds derived there from shall be invested as described above.
- The Board of Trustees as described in Section () shall have the discretion to employ professional investment manager(s) if the Trustees deem it appropriate.

- 4) The Board of Trustees as described in Section () shall report to the Grand York Rite Bodies Annual Communication each year on the progress, levels, value, and sources of all investments.
- 5) The Board of Trustees shall meet at least quarterly and review the status and progress of all such funds.
- 6) Transition process. All stocks, bonds, and securities or other funds currently held by these Grand York Rite Bodies shall be transitioned to meet the requirements above no later than one year after the passage of this resolution, or as soon as the applicable period of time or expiration date shall expire for each individual instrument. In no case shall this be longer than five years. No other investments shall be made. (Revised April 2014)

Section () Trustees.

The Board of Trustees shall assume responsibility for the administration and investment of the Grand York Rite General Fund, Prepaid Life Membership Fund, and the York Rite Objectives and Endowment Fund or any other investment fund in a manner as prescribed by Section() of these By-Laws. (Revised April 2014)

4. The following resolution was properly submitted and is in proper form.

ARTICLE XIII Standing Committees

Section 12.C Page 12 Currently Reads:

The funds received by the committee shall be kept intact as a permanent fund solely for the benefit of the participating Chapters of this Grand Jurisdiction and invested in form of securities that is insured or guaranteed by an agency of the United States. Assets shall be in the custody of the Secretary/Treasurer of the Committee, and the cost for administration shall be paid from the revenue earned by the Prepaid Life Membership Account.

Assets shall be in the custody of the Secretary/Treasurer of the Committee, and the cost for administration shall be paid from the revenue earned by the Prepaid Life Membership Account.

Section 2. The Annual Convocation of this Grand Chapter shall be held

If this Friday/Saturday falls on Easter weekend, the Annual Convocation may be moved one week earlier or one week later to avoid conflict If conditions arise making it impossible or impracticable to hold the Annual Convocation at the appointed time and place, the Grand High Priest may declare an emergency to exist. The Grand High Priest may then order the elective Grand Chapter Officers and the committees on Finance and Jurisprudence to convene at a time and place designated by him. Although notice to others shall not be required, all Constituent Chapter members are welcome to attend Emergency Convocations. Providing the Grand High Priest, the Grand Secretary/Treasurer, and one other Grand Chapter Dais officer, and at least two members of each of the aforementioned committees are present, and a quorum is present, they may transact the usual business of the Annual Convocation except for the election of officers.

6. There were two grievances submitted to the Jurisprudence Committee. The first was from the Grand Recorder/Treasurer explaining that a Chapter had made unauthorized changes to the Annual Returns forms. Also, that the Chapter had determined that they had paid Per Capita the previous year on a deceased member. They deducted that amount from the following Annual Return. The Jurisprudence Committee determined that precedent had been set previously that this money was not rebated. The Committee recommends that the Most Illustrious Grand Master issue a letter of instruction to the Recorder/Treasurer and High Priest of that Chapter that Annual Return Forms may only be changed by the Grand Recorder and that rebates are not given based on precedent. Further, that continued instances could result in disciplinary actions to include a Letter of reprimand.

The second grievance concerned Perpetual Life Membership assessments and was dismissed because the assessment was voted on by the Voting Delegates and included as a line item in the budget. The committee does recommend that a Resolution be submitted by the Finance Committee to clean up the applicable section in the Code.

7. It is the recommendation of the Jurisprudence Committee that all

Resolutions should be submitted through the Grand Recorder on a form provided by him and when he receives a Resolution he assigns a tracking number to it before distributing it to the applicable committees.

- 8. The Jurisprudence Committee commends the Most Excellent Grand High Priest for the time and effort he has expended this year to improve Capitular Masonry in Idaho. The Jurisprudence Committee has reviewed the two issued dispensations and finds them to be in compliance with the Code and Digest of Cryptic Masons of Idaho.
- 9. Most Excellent Grand High Priest, the Jurisprudence Committee thanks you for the trust and responsibility you have given us. We thank you and ask that this report be received.

The Grand Chapter of ROYAL ARCH MASONS OF IDAHO THE BEGINNING 1908 - 1925

by Jerry D. Parsons Excellent Grand Historian

The history of Masonry in Idaho began in 1860-1863 with the discovery of gold in the Lewiston area, Boise Basin and in the Owyhee Mountains. Among the many that came to seek their fortunes were Masons who desired to start lodges and work in Masonry.

Idaho was made a Territory of the United States in 1863 and Masonic Lodges were chartered by the Grand Lodges of Oregon and Washington. On December 17, 1867 the Grand Lodge of Idaho Territory was formed.

Among the Masons there were many Royal Arch Masons who desired to open Chapters. The first was at Idaho City who received a dispensation dated June of 1867 and given a charter in August of the same year from the Grand Chapter of Oregon. There was a conflict however, that Oregon had no jurisdictional control over the Idaho Territory. Idaho Chapter No. 1 then petitioned the General Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons for a charter. It was granted and dated September 18, 1868. Idaho Chapter No. 1 consolidated with Boise Chapter No. 3 in November of 1914.

The other early Chapters that opened in Idaho were:

Alturas Chapter No. 5, Hailey, ID, surrendered their charter on August 23, 1894.

Ten of these twelve Chapters assembled on June 16, 1908 at Portneuf Lodge, Pocatello, for the purpose of organizing a Grand Chapter of the State of Idaho. Companion James A. Pinney was elected the Most Excellent Grand High Priest at this convention.

At the first annual convocation of the Grand Royal Arch Chapter of the State of Idaho, held at the Masonic Temple in Wallace on June 22, 1909, it was resolved to issue charters to Grangeville No. 13 and Salmon No. 14.

The following Chapters received their dispensations and charters at succeeding Annual Convocations of the Grand Royal Arch Chapter of the State of Idaho:

Although there is not much recorded history of early Royal Arch Masonry in Idaho, there are undoubtedly many interesting items recorded in the minutes of each Chapter that should be written and sent to the Grand Chapter for the archives.

Here are some interesting facts obtained from Chapters and the Grand Chapter Proceedings.

Idaho Chapter No. 1 was first formed in Idaho City at that historic Masonic Temple by receiving a dispensation from the Grand R.A.M. Chapter of Oregon. They were granted a charter dated September 18, 1868 thus becoming the first Chapter to work in the Idaho Territory. When the mining waned in the later years, the population and Masonic membership declined, the Chapter was unable to continue to work and reported this at the June 15, 1914 Convocation of the Grand Chapter. On November 5, 1914, the Grand High Priest opened Idaho Chapter No. 1 in Idaho City and formally made the consolidation with Boise Chapter No. 3 official. He then closed Idaho Chapter No. 1 for the final time of its existence.

Cyrus Chapter No. 2 has had a very colorful history in Silver City, Idaho. Their first meeting was held on March 8, 1870. They undoubtedly met in the Masonic Hall along with Owyhee Lodge #5, War Eagle Lodge #6 and the I.O.O.F. In the middle of the 1870's, Cyrus Chapter #2 purchased the building that was used to plane lumber. They all met on the ground floor and held social functions on the second floor sharing the \$65 rent and added costs of lamp oil, furniture, carpets, candles and fire wood. In 1881, Owyhee #5 and War Eagle #6 Lodges consolidated to form Silver City Lodge #13. The hall was remodeled in 1892 making the second floor the meeting room and they held social functions on the first level which included a band stage for community dances and entertainment.

In August of 1949, Silver City #13 moved to Homedale and in September of 1949, Cyrus Chapter #2 R.A.M sold the Silver City building to Silver City Lodge #13 for \$1.00 and moved to Nampa where it currently resides.

Silver City Lodge #13 still holds an annual meeting in the historic building at Silver City on the second Saturday in July.

Many of our founding leaders of Idaho Royal Arch Masonry were active in civic matters and even their Mayors, Senators, Governors and the mainstay of Masonry in Idaho. Several of the Grand Masters of Idaho were Royal Arch Masons.

Our first Most Excellent Grand High Priest, James A. Pinney, died on February 4, 1914 at the age of 91. He was a truly remarkable Man and Mason. He was raised a Master Mason in Iowa, came to Idaho in 1862 and settled in Idaho City in 1863 where he opened a store and was appointed Postmaster. He was a charter member of Idaho Lodge #1 and exalted a Royal Arch Mason in 1867. He resigned in 1872 and moved to Boise and affiliated with Boise Lodge #2 and was a charter member of Boise Chapter #3. James A. Pinney served Boise as its Mayor for three separate terms. He was elected Grand Master of Idaho in 1893 and was instrumental in establishing the Grand Chapter R.A.M of Idaho in 1908 and elected our first Most Excellent Grand High Priest. Pinney was a charter member of Idaho Council #1 when it was constituted in 1912. He was dubbed and knighted a Knight Templar in Idaho Commandery #1 in December of 1882. It was due to his efforts that the Grand Commandery of Idaho was formed in 1904 and was elected its first Grand Commander. He was also a member of Boise Consistory #2 A.A.S.R. and the El Korah Shrine A.A.O.N.M.S.

Thus the history of the beginning of the Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons of Idaho is recorded. Every Chapter has its history and they should be combined in the archives of the Grand Chapter for future generations of Royal Arch Masons to study and enjoy.

Too many of the Chapters of Idaho have been suspended, arrested, merged, consolidated and have just plain given up. With the knowledge of the history of Royal Arch Masonry in Idaho we should go forth in our quest to rebuild our membership and enlighten those who seek further light.

Merle Stanley Hill Most Excellent Grand High Priest 2014-2015

Merle was born in Torrington, Wyoming in 1933. He moved to the Twin Falls, Idaho, area in 1935. Merle's father worked for various farmers stretching from Hansen to Currie, Idaho. He started elementary school in Twin Falls, then after three and one-half (3 ½) years, moved to the Canyonside area of Jerome. Merle graduated from Jerome High School, enlisted in the U.S. Navy and spent time overhauling torpedoes in Japan.

Merle went on to earn a degree in education and taught high school in the Los Angeles School District. Merle, became a Mason in 1975, while still teaching, joining Hollywood Lodge No 355 of which he is a life member. He retired with 31 ½ years service in 1985, and began farming and ranching in Richfield, Idaho. He joined Richfield Lodge No 70 (Now Richfield No 21 after merging with Shoshone); serving as Worshipful Master 5 times and Secretary several times. Merle joined York Rite Masonry, King Solomon Chapter No 16, Gooding (Now Twin Falls); Twin Falls Council No. 7 and Twin Falls Commandery No. 10. He served as Right Excellent Grand Lecturer of the Grand Lodge A.F.& A.M. of Idaho from 1994-1997; MIGM of Cryptic Masons of Idaho 2003/2004, and Grand Commandery of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar of Idaho 2004/2005. He was appointed to the Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons of Idaho by MEC James G. Cox, ME-GHP 2005/2006.

Merle, entered 2014 with much soul searching and wonders. On June 15, 2013, he suffered cardiac arrest and died on his couch at home in Richfield. His wife of 56 years, Lady Beverly, called 911 and, being in the country a long way from a hospital, hit him in the center of the chest with the base of her hand. She broke two ribs and fractured his sternum, but it brought him back. Eventually, Merle was transferred to Boise where he underwent open-heart surgery on June 17. REPORT OF THE JURISPRUDENCE COMMITTEE

To: the Right Eminent Grand Commander, Officers and Sir Knights of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Idaho:

We your Jurisprudence Committee begs to report the following:

1) The Committee on Resolutions has submitted Resolutions for review; conformance to Templar Laws and recommendations for consideration.

2) There were several Joint Resolutions presented for consideration; Two of them dealt with splitting the Offices of Grand Recorder and Grand Treasurer, They were not in proper form and deemed to be in nonconformance to Templar Laws, They were defeated in the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons Grand Convocation, and were withdrawn from further consideration in the Grand Council Grand Assembly and have been withdrawn from consideration in the Grand Conclave; another resolution which we will number as K14-02 concerns conflicts posed by holding the Annual Conclave on a Friday or Saturday of Easter Weekend, without the ability to move the Annual Conclave. We find the proposed Resolution is not in conflict with Templar Law and move the adoption to place the Resolution on the floor for consideration.

K14-02

RESOLUTION TO AMEND ARTICLE VIII Conclaves, Section 72

(Requires two-thirds majority of delegates present to pass)

WHEREAS, the current convocation stated meeting may cause conflicts with Easter Celebrations, and

WHEREAS, no language is contained that will allow the shifting of the Annual Conclave;

THEREFORE, Be it Resolved, Article VIII, Section 72, shall be amended, to be effective for 2015, as follows:

As it reads:

Section 72. The Annual Conclave of this Grand Commandery shall be held during the Friday afternoon, Saturday morning, or Saturday afternoon preceding the third Sunday in the month of April and the hour of meeting shall be not later than 9:00 A.M. for morning sessions or 1:30 P.M. for afternoon sessions. If conditions prevail making it impossible or impracticable to hold the Annual Conclave at the appointed time and place, the Right Eminent Grand Commander may reconvene the Grand Commandery, provided a quorum is present as defined by Section 37 of the Constitution and Statutes of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar of the U.S.A. (1987) and Article IV, Section 31, of the Code of Laws of the Grand Commandery of Idaho. He may then order the elective Grand Commandery Officers and the committees of Finance and Jurisprudence to convene at a time and place designated by him. Provided he and one other dais officer, the Grand Recorder/Treasurer, and two members of each of the aforementioned committees are present, they may transact the usual business of the Annual Conclave excepting the election of officers. NOTE: See Article III, Section 21, and Article XIII, Section 133

As Amended:

Section 72. The Annual Conclave of this Grand Commandery shall be held during the Friday afternoon, Saturday morning, or Saturday afternoon preceding the third Sunday in the month of April and the hour of meeting shall be not later than 9:00 A.M. for morning sessions or 1:30 P.M. for afternoon sessions. If this Friday/Saturday falls on Easter weekend, the Annual Conclave may be moved one week earlier or one week later to avoid the conflict. If conditions prevail making it impossible or impracticable to hold the Annual Conclave at the appointed time and place, the Right Eminent Grand Commander may reconvene the Grand Commandery, provided a quorum is present as defined by Section 37 of the Constitution and Statutes of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar of the U.S.A. (1987) and Article IV, Section 31, of the Code of Laws of the Grand Commandery of Idaho. He may then order the elective Grand Commandery Officers and the committees of Finance and Jurisprudence to convene at a time and place designated by him. Provided he and one other dais officer, the Grand Recorder/Treasurer, and two members of each of the aforementioned committees are present, they may transact the usual business of the Annual Conclave excepting the election of officers. NOTE: See Article III, Section 21, and Article XIII, Section 133

Whereas the various Codes of Law contain language limiting the ability of the Investment Committee, and Whereas this Grand York Rite Body in Grand Session approved an Investment Policy which requires the Investment Committee to operate as a "Prudent Man" would operate; and

Whereas the Grand Lodge of Idaho has sound Investment guidance contained within the Idaho Masonic Code and Digest; Therefore, be it Resolved the Grand York Rite Bodies adopt by Reference the Investment Policy of the Grand Lodge of Idaho AF & AM as contained in the Idaho Masonic Code and Digest. Further that the Grand Secretary/Recorder acting in concert with the Committees on Resolutions; Jurisprudence and the Investments, work to insert the proper wording into the Constitution, By-Laws and Regulations in the appropriate Sections, etc. and publish the Revised Codes of Laws to reflect these changes.

Section () Investments.

1) This section applies to all long-term investment funds maintained by the Grand York Rite Bodies of Idaho for any purpose, inclusive of, but not limited to, the Grand York Rite General Fund, Prepaid Life Membership Fund, and the York Rite Objectives and Endowment Fund. This section does not apply to cash maintained for normal day-to- day operating expenses of the Grand York Rite Bodies of Idaho. (Revised April 2014)

2) All Funds shall be comprised of the following securities and investments:

a) Any Fund that contains less than \$200,000 in fair market value shall be invested in mutual funds managed by one or more nationally recognized brokerage houses and mutual fund companies.

b) Any Fund that contains more than \$200,000 in fair market value may be invested in individual securities.

c) No less than 40% nor more than 70% of funds shall be invested in equity securities, stocks, or other securities.

d) No more than 60% nor less than 30% of invested funds may be held in certificates of deposit, corporate bonds, US government bonds, US Treasury Notes, or any other cash equivalent securities.

e) Individual stocks received by these Grand York Rite Bodies from any source should be divested within one year of receipt and the funds derived there from shall be invested as described above.

3) The Board of Trustees as described in Section () shall have the discretion to employ professional investment manager(s) if the Trustees deem it appropriate.

4) The Board of Trustees as described in Section () shall report to the Grand York Rite Bodies Annual Communication each year on the progress, levels, value, and sources of all investments.

5) The Board of Trustees shall meet at least quarterly and review the status and progress of all such funds.

6) Transition process. All stocks, bonds, and securities or other funds currently held by these Grand York Rite Bodies shall be transitioned to meet the requirements above no later than one year after the passage of this resolution, or as soon as the applicable period of time or expiration date shall expire for each individual instrument. In no case shall this be longer than five years. No other investments shall be made. (Revised April 2014)

Section () Trustees.

The Board of Trustees shall assume responsibility for the administration and investment of the Grand York Rite General Fund, Prepaid Life Membership Fund, and the York Rite Objectives and Endowment Fund or any other investment fund in a manner as prescribed by Section() of these By-Laws. (Revised April 2014)

The following resolution K14-04 was properly submitted and is in proper form.

ARTICLE XIII Standing Committees Section 128.C (Page 15) and Regulations-Investments Sections 43-50 Pages 42-43

Currently Reads:

The funds received by the committee shall be kept intact as a permanent fund solely for the benefit of the participating Commanderies of this Grand Jurisdiction and invested in a form of securities that is insured or guaranteed by an agency of the United States. Assets shall be in the custody of the Secretary/Treasurer of the Committee, and the cost for administration shall be paid from the revenue earned by the Prepaid Life Membership Account.

Change to read:

The funds received by this committee shall be kept as a permanent fund for the benefit of the participating Commanderies of this Grand Jurisdiction. The funds shall be invested 30% to 60% in certificates of deposit, corporate bonds, US Government bonds, US Treasury Notes and 40% to 70% in equity securities, stocks, mutual funds or other securities managed by nationally recognized brokerage houses and mutual fund companies. Assets shall be in the custody of the Secretary/Treasurer of the Committee, and the cost for administration shall be paid from the revenue earned by the Prepaid Life Membership Account.

The Committee recommended the adoption of the Resolution to place it in consideration. It was regularly moved and seconded and following discussion and upon the question the Resolution passed by a Majority Vote.

4.) It is the recommendation of the Jurisprudence Committee that all resolutions should be submitted on a form provided by the Grand Recorder and when the Grand Recorder receives a resolution he assigns a tracking number to it.

5.) There were two grievances submitted to the Jurisprudence Committee. The first was from the Grand Treasurer/Recorder explaining that a Commandery had made unauthorized changes to the Annual Returns Form. Also, that the Commandery had determined that they had paid Per Capita the previous year on a deceased Sir Knight. They deducted that amount from the following years Annual Return. The Jurisprudence Committee determined that precedent had been set previously that this money was not rebated. The Jurisprudence Committee recommends that the Right Eminent Grand Commander issue a Letter of Instruction to the Recorder/Treasurer and Eminent Commander of that Commandery that Annual Returns Forms may only be changed by the Grand Recorder and that rebates are not given based on previous precedents. That continued occurrences could result in further disciplinary actions to include a Letter of Reprimand.

6.) The second grievance concerned Perpetual Life Memberships assessments and was dismissed. The assessment was voted on by the Voting Delegates and included as a line item in the budget. The Jurisprudence Committee does recommend the Finance Committee seek strict adherence to AR-TICLE XVIII, Section 191 C. and clarify through a Resolution, that membership is dependent upon the Records in YRIS as of December 31 of each year; Total membership on the Roll less Prepaid Life Members and Patron ships of the Knights Templar Eye Foundation (Only counting one category per member.


